SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ENSURE THAT EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL AND PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL IN THE STATE, FROM KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE TWELVE HAS A CERTAIN NUMBER OF MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS.

1 WHEREAS, the State is experiencing an acute mental health crisis among children and youth; and 2 3 WHEREAS, school psychologists provide direct and indirect 4 support to evaluate and address students' intellectual 5 development, academic success, social-emotional learning, and 6 mental and behavioral health; and 7 8 WHEREAS, school counselors counsel students and parents, 9 evaluate students' abilities, address learning problems, and 10 assist students in career and personal development; and 11 12 WHEREAS, school psychologists and school counselors are 13 crucial to supporting the mental health and well-being of 14 students in school; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the National Association of School Psychologists 17 recommends a ratio of one psychologist to five hundred students; 18 and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, the American School Counselor Association 22 recommends a ratio of one school counselor to two hundred fifty students; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the public schools and public charter schools in 25 26 the State presently do not meet the recommendations by the National Association of School Psychologists; and 27 28 WHEREAS, ensuring adequate staffing levels of mental health 29 professionals consistent with recommended ratios will provide 30

1 Hawaii's keiki with critical support needed to address the 2 ongoing mental health crisis; now, therefore, 3 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 4 5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 6 7 Education is urged to ensure that each public school and public charter school in the State, from kindergarten through grade 8 9 twelve, employs, or retains under contract, at least one mental 10 health professional for every two hundred fifty students enrolled; provided that if a public school has fewer than two 11 hundred fifty students enrolled the school is urged to employ or 12 retain under a contract, at least one mental health 13 professional; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that "mental health professional" 16 under this concurrent resolution means: 17 18 A licensed mental health counselor, as defined in 19 (1) section 453D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes; 20 21 (2) A psychologist licensed to practice psychology under 22 23 chapter 465, Hawaii Revised Statutes; 24 A person employed as a school psychologist pursuant to 25 (3) section 465-3(a)(3), Hawaii Revised Statutes; 26 27 28 (4)A social worker, as defined in section 467E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes; or 29 30 31 (5) A social worker exempt from licensure pursuant to 32 section 467E-6(2), Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 35 requested to cooperate with other state agencies, as appropriate, to ensure adequate staffing levels of mental health 36 37 professionals in public schools and public charter schools; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 40 requested to submit a progress report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular 41 42 Session of 2025, detailing the progress made toward meeting the

1 benchmark requiring each public school and public charter school in the State, from kindergarten through grade twelve, to employ, 2 3 or retain under contract, the number of mental health professionals set forth in this concurrent resolution; and 4 5

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 7 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education and Executive Director of the State Public Charter 8 School Commission. 9
