## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE STATE PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION, TO SUBMIT A REPORT ON INCREASING ACCESS TO STABLE, SUITABLE, AND AFFORDABLE FACILITIES FOR PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, Hawaii's public charter schools serve a critical 1 role as laboratories of innovation in the State's education 2 3 system; and 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii's public charter schools enroll more than 5 twelve thousand students; and 6 7 WHEREAS, lack of funding for, and availability of, proper 8 facilities has been a long-standing issue for charter schools 9 nationally and locally, forcing some charter schools in the 10 State to hold classes outdoors, on covered lanais, or in 11 unstable temporary structures; and 12 13 WHEREAS, public charter schools receive inadequate funding 14 15 to support student learning; and 16 WHEREAS, while the State Public Charter School Commission 17 may request funding for facilities as part of its annual budget 18 19 request, the amounts received in recent fiscal years have not kept pace with the cost of providing and maintaining 20 high-quality facilities; and 21 22 WHEREAS, despite the Department of Accounting and General 23 24 Services and Department of Education being mandated to conduct biennial surveys and submit biennial reports relating to any 25 unused state facility that may be used for public charter 26 schools, the Departments have not identified any such facility; 27 28 and 29

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WHEREAS, unused or underutilized state facilities would 1 2 help alleviate the lack of proper facilities for public charter schools; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, in addition to the existence of unused and underutilized facilities in the State, there are various 6 financing options, such as federal support, that can be used to 7 8 help support public charter schools; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Hawaii has the opportunity and responsibility to maximize existing assets that are currently available to assist 11 public charter schools to ensure all students have proper 12 facilities for their education; now, therefore, 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 15 16 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, that the Board of Education, in partnership with the State 17 Public Charter School Commission, is requested to submit a 18 19 report on increasing access to stable, suitable, and affordable facilities for public charter schools, including any proposed 20 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 21 22 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2025; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in preparing the report, the 25 Board of Education is requested to: 26 27 (1) Assess why no unused facilities have been identified 28 by the appropriate state departments; 29 30 (2) Propose changes in policy or practice in establishing an affirmative duty to connect charter schools with 31 unused or underutilized facilities, along with 32 33 increased accountability and oversight over unused facilities; 34 35 36 (3) Obtain and publish an updated list from the Department of Education of unused or underutilized facilities; 37 38 39 (4) Coordinate with the School Facilities Authority to 40 include public charter school facilities as a priority for the Authority; 41 42

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(5) Assess the amount of federal funds that are available 1 2 to benefit eligible public charter school facilities 3 in the State but are not being accessed; and 4 (6) Assess the feasibility of expanding the range of 5 financing options for public charter schools, such as 6 tax-exempt bonds, credit enhancement programs, and 7 revolving loan funds; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Comptroller, 11 Chairperson of the Board of Education, Superintendent of 12 Education, and Executive Director of the State Public Charter 13 School Commission. 14 15 16 OFFERED BY: Training 17
