SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES TO WORK WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF CUSTOMER SERVICES OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO APPROPRIATELY MANAGE FERAL CAT CONCERNS.

WHEREAS, the feral cat population has become overwhelming 1 2 to the general public and costs valuable county and state resources to address; and 3 4 WHEREAS, due to mating habits and frequent breeding 5 seasons, the feral cat crisis has become a statewide crisis; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, trap and neuter programs are the only effective and efficient management strategy to mitigate and manage the cat 9 population during breeding season and year round; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the cat community has organized efforts to assist 12 with mitigation methods including coordinating trap and neuter 13 clinics, providing medical care, and working with doctors and 14 clinics to manage negative effects caused by the feral cat 15 population; and 16 17 WHEREAS, when trained as emotional support animals, cats 18 can have significant medical value by providing support, 19 companionship, and comfort to persons with a disability; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the State and City and County of Honolulu to provide resources to its residents to 23 manage cats and cooperate with the cat community, businesses, 24 doctors, and clinics; now, therefore, 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 27 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 28 29 that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is urged to work with the Department of Customer Services of the City and 30 County of Honolulu to appropriately manage the feral cat concern 31 while raising awareness about trap and neuter programs; and 32 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested to disseminate educational 35

information about feral cats, medical care, and resources to the 1 community; and 2
