SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY GOVERNMENTS TO COLLABORATE WITH COMMUNITY LEADERS AND STAKEHOLDERS TO SUPPORT NEIGHBORHOOD SECURITY WATCH PROGRAMS IN HAWATT.

1 WHEREAS, crime is an escalating problem in Hawaii that affects the State's neighborhoods and schools, and domestic 2 violence, substance abuse disorders, disorderly conduct, and the 3 destruction of property continue to plague our communities; and 4 5 WHEREAS, county police departments are short-staffed and 6 serve as first responders for most emergencies, reports of 7 domestic abuse, gang activity, drug activity, and issues related 8 9 to homelessness; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Neighborhood Security Watch program is a grassroots initiative of the Honolulu Police Department where 12 volunteers are trained to lead security patrols in their 13 14 communities; and 15 WHEREAS, Neighborhood Security Watch programs also work 16 collaboratively with law enforcement officers, state and county 17 officials, community leaders, churches, businesses, and 18 nonprofit organizations to hold safety training events and to 19 20 establish emergency response procedures; and 21 22 WHEREAS, Neighborhood Security Watch programs are part of a proactive policing strategy and help free up law enforcement 23 officers to focus on other priorities; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, in the last year, Neighborhood Security Watch programs have coordinated with stakeholders to hold events in 27 Moanalua Gardens, Kahuku, Kapalama, Chinatown, Makiki, Waikiki, 28 Mililani, Ewa Beach, Waianae, Nanakuli, and on Hawaiian Home 29 Lands homesteads; now, therefore, 30 31 32 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, that the federal, state, and county governments are urged to
