#### SENATE RESOLUTION

DECLARING THAT BULLYING IS A MATTER OF STATEWIDE CONCERN; REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO UPDATE ITS RULES AND POLICIES TO ADDRESS BULLYING; AND REQUESTING THE HAWAII STATE COUNCIL ON DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO ADDRESS THE BULLYING OF DISABLED CHILDREN.

1		EAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has	
2	declared bullying to be a form of youth violence and an adverse		
3	childhood	experience that causes harm to its victims; and

5		EAS, the United States Department of Health and Human

1 local government services, programs, and activities, including public schools, regardless of whether the 2 services, programs, and activities receive federal 3 financial assistance; and 4 5 WHEREAS, when disabled children are bullied at public 6 schools, these laws require the school to take certain actions; 7 and 8 9 WHEREAS, the state Department of Education is committed to 10 providing a safe learning environment for students, families, 11 and educators; and 12 13 WHEREAS, as part of this commitment, the Department of 14 Education addresses bullying, including cyberbullying, by 15 emphasizing a culture of respect, responsibility, and resiliency 16 17 using a framework of prevention, response, and reporting; and 18 WHEREAS, the Department of Education and Board of Education 19 work with communities to promote understanding and investigate 20 incidents to ensure the safety of students; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu has also enacted 23 ordinances to prevent bullying and create a safe, protected 24 environment for youth participating in county programming; and 25 26 WHEREAS, community-wide strategies can help identify and 27 support children who are bullied; redirect the behavior of 28 children who bully; and modify the attitudes of adults and youth 29 who tolerate bullying behaviors; and 30 31 WHEREAS, additional support must be given to victims and 32 33 bullies to address conditions that have contributed to bullying 34 and prevent bullying from happening; and 35 36 WHEREAS, counseling, mental health resources, and social-emotional learning are effective strategies to support 37 children, parents, staff, teachers, and principals; and 38 39 WHEREAS, bullying can also be prevented by addressing 40 health, stress, abuse, domestic violence, gang activity, issues 41



at home, and social-emotional and behavioral health issues; now, 1 2 therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 5 6 that bullying in Hawaii is declared to be a matter of statewide 7 concern; and 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 9 10 requested to update Chapter 19 of Title 8, Hawaii Administrative Rules, and any related policies, to better support youth, 11 especially disabled youth, who are subjected to bullying; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 14 requested to ensure that the updated administrative rules and 15 policies be synchronized across all schools, to the fullest 16 extent possible; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii State Council on Developmental Disabilities is requested to convene a task force 20 to examine and make recommendations to address: 21 22 (1) A no-tolerance policy for all forms of bullying, 23 including physical, psychological, mental, emotional, 24 25 social, and cyber bullying; 26 Mandatory training for staff regarding the bullying of 27 (2) disabled children, including how to identify bullying 28 or other aggressive behavior against disabled children 29 and how to appropriately respond to that behavior; 30 31 32 (3) Updated reporting procedures; 33 (4) Updated staff intervention policies; 34 35 (5) Protections for victims, families, and staff against 36 retaliation; 37 38 Programs to improve bullying education and awareness; 39 (6) 40 41 (7) Programs to improve mental health resources; 42
