SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REQUIRE THAT EACH STUDENT COMPLETE TWO YEARS OF HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION AS A GRADUATION REQUIREMENT.

WHEREAS, olelo Hawaii, the Hawaiian language, is the native 1 2 language of the Native Hawaiian people; and 3 WHEREAS, once spoken throughout Hawaii by Native Hawaiians 4 5 and others, olelo Hawaii was considered to be nearly extinct by the 1980s, when fewer than fifty fluent speakers under the age 6 7 of eighteen were left; and 8 WHEREAS, a major reason for the deterioration of the 9 10 Hawaiian language was an 1896 law that required English instruction in Hawaii schools; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, in practice, this law functioned to "ban" students from speaking olelo Hawaii at their schools; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, to save the Hawaiian language, a number of historic initiatives were launched, including Aha Punana Leo's 17 Hawaiian language immersion preschools, the Department of 18 Education's Hawaiian language immersion program, and the 19 Hawaiian language programs of the University of Hawaii system; 20 21 and 22 WHEREAS, in 1978, the Hawaii State Constitution was amended 23 24 to recognize the Hawaiian language as one of the two official languages of the State; and 25 26 WHEREAS, several important gubernatorial proclamations on 27 olelo Hawaii were issued in the 1990s, including in 1994 and 28 29 1995, gubernatorial proclamations, written in both Hawaiian and 30 English, recognizing February 1994 and February 1995 as 31 "Hawaiian Language Month in Hawaii"; and 32 WHEREAS, while the Hawaiian language revitalization 33 movement has made major strides in the last thirty years, for 34

olelo Hawaii to not just survive, but to also thrive, more 1 people need to speak Hawaiian; now, therefore, 2 3 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 4 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 5 that the Department of Education is requested to require that 6 each student complete two years of Hawaiian language instruction 7 as a graduation requirement; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education and 11 Chairperson of the Board of Education. 12 13 OFFERED BY: Hut Jule 14 15
