SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL TO ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO CONDUCT A COMPREHENSIVE STUDY OF THE STATE'S CURRENT EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS.

1 WHEREAS, unlike other states, such as New York and California, Hawaii lacks adequate advocacy from the executive 2 branch for workforce development; and 3 4 WHEREAS, tourism and retail, the State's most dominant 5 economic sectors, provide relatively low wages for workers, most 6 of whom are of Pacific Islander, Native Hawaiian, and Filipino 7 8 heritage; and 9 10 WHEREAS, work-based learning and development programs allow youth and adults to explore new opportunities, build skills, and 11 transition into new career pathways; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, providing workforce development and work-based learning programs to train low wage workers for higher wage 15 sectors will improve their economic status and reduce the racial 16 17 wealth gap; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, that the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations and the 21 Workforce Development Council is requested to establish a task 22 force to conduct a comprehensive study of the State's current 23 education and workforce development programs; and 24 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Workforce Development Council is requested to select the members of the task force; 27 28 and 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to: 30 31
