SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TO CONSULT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF TAXATION REGARDING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WIND RESISTANCE RETROFIT TAX CREDIT PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the State is susceptible to property loss due to 1 2 hurricanes, tropical storms, strong winds, and other natural disasters; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the best long-term solution for reducing potential damage is the statewide use of wind resistive devices; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, residents of the State must inspect, repair, and reinforce their residences every year to prepare for the 9 10 possibility of a hurricane making landfall; and 11 WHEREAS, inspections, repairs, and reinforcement of 12 residences consume needed resources from homeowners' budgets but 13 14 result in homeowners having more hurricane resistant residences; 15 and 16 WHEREAS, these resistance measures reduce hurricane damage 17 repair costs and may qualify homeowners for much-needed 18 hurricane insurance premium credits; and 19 20 WHEREAS, an income tax credit for certain property owners 21 22 for the installation of wind resistive devices approved by the Insurance Commissioner that may lessen the severity of property 23 loss from strong winds will serve a public purpose by protecting 24 the health, safety, property, and welfare of residents in the 25 State; and 26 27 WHEREAS, a Wind Resistance Retrofit Tax Credit Program will 28 also stimulate economic growth and activity in the State through 29 the creation of business and employment opportunities for the 30 sale and installation of wind resistive devices; now, therefore, 31 32 33 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 34 35 that the Insurance Commissioner is requested to consult with the

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Department of Taxation regarding the establishment of a Wind 1 2 Resistance Retrofit Tax Credit Program; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Insurance Commissioner is requested to submit a report of its findings and 5 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 6 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 7 8 the Regular Session of 2025; and 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Resolution be transmitted to the Insurance Commissioner and 11 Director of Taxation. 12 13 OFFERED BY: Make Habbard 14 15
