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<u>Response</u>: These three qualities—intellectually curious, community-focused, and empathic—are defining attributes of who I am, and I believe that they align with the mission and responsibilities of the Hawai'i Advisory Commission on Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances.

1. Intellectually Curious: I am driven by a deep passion for learning and understanding complex issues, especially those that impact individuals and communities. This intellectual curiosity enables me to analyze data, research evidence-based solutions, and approach challenges with innovative thinking. On the Commission, this quality would allow me to stay informed about emerging trends in substance use, advancements in treatment, and evolving community needs, ensuring well-informed and proactive decision-making.

This project was a study focusing on the development, implementation, and evaluation of the effectiveness of a 12-session, culturally-competent, communitybased family intervention for African-American adolescent males with a substance abuse disorder.
