1. Why do you wish to be a member of the State Council on Developmental Disabilities.

Through my personal and professional experiences, I feel a deep sense of kuleana to individuals with developmental disabilities and to advocate for their rights to make choices about their own lives, to participate fully in their communities, and to access the support and services they need to thrive. This firm commitment to inclusivity and self-determination is what drives me to serve on the State Council on Developmental Disabilities.

2. What do you perceive are the roles and responsibilities of a member of the State Council on Developmental Disabilities.

It is my understanding that members of the State Council on Developmental Disabilities act as a voice for people with developmental disabilities by advising state policymakers, agencies, and service providers on topics related to their needs and rights. Additionally, members collaborate and innovate together to improve current systems and policies across the state of Hawaii in order to ensure equitable and high-quality services and opportunities are afforded to individuals with developmental disabilities throughout their lifetime.
