Aloha Senator Aquino,

Below are my responses to your questions regarding my nomination by Gov. Josh Green to the position of State Chief Information Officer (CIO) for use during the confirmation process by the Senate.

(1) Why do you wish to be Chief Information Officer (CIO)?

As someone with generations of family in Hawai'i, my desire to become the State CIO is rooted in my deep commitment to enhancing the lives of the people. My aspiration to become the State CIO is driven by a profound dedication to leveraging information technology for business transformation and connecting our communities through IT. I envision IT as a pivotal tool in transforming government services, optimizing operations, and fostering a more connected society. With over 25 years of experience in leading digital transformation initiatives, I have witnessed how technology can revolutionize public services, making them more accountable, efficient, and responsive to the needs of the people of Hawai'i.

(2) How do you perceive the role and responsibilities of the Chief Information Officer (CIO)?

As the first native Hawaiian woman to take on this role, it is both an honor and a responsibility for me to fulfill the duties of the State CIO in accordance with HRS §27-43.

The State CIO is responsible for organizing, managing, and overseeing statewide information technology governance, developing and implementing IT strategic plans and standards, coordinating IT budget requests, and ensuring compliance with governance processes and enterprise architecture policies.

The following responsibilities support the State CIO's responsibility of developing, implementing and managing the state IT strategic plans and governance:

- 1. Leading the State's IT community in delivering cost-effective technology solutions to support responsive government services for the people of Hawai'i;
- 2. Ensuring that investments in technology have maximum enterprise value and make sense both strategically and operationally;
- 3. Fostering connections across various state departments to promote shared services and economies of scale in IT;
- 4. Promoting resiliency;
- 5. Creating more opportunities in government and across the state for technology professionals;
- 6. Reducing silos and strengthening connections with communities, including the public, the commercial marketplace, other government and nonprofit organizations; and
- 7. Leading with ALOHA and setting an example for future generations to lead.

The State CIO is also the administrator of the Office of Enterprise Technology Services, a division of the Department of Accounting and General Services. The State CIO's role encompasses more than just technology, it is about understanding the IT needs across state government and empowering the state's IT workforce to meet the evolving demands of technology to include IT planning and governance, modernizing IT programs, and operating critical infrastructure, systems, and processes.

(3) Given your understanding of the role and responsibilities as Chief Information Officer (CIO) why do you believe that you are qualified for the position? Please include a brief statement of your skills, expertise, or knowledge that would aid in your decision-making ability as the Chief Information Officer (CIO)?

I have more than 25 years of experience in leading enterprise-level IT initiatives including leading community IT systems development, managing stakeholder relations, and collaborating with IT vendors to implement a range of technology modernization projects.

I have a strong background that aligns with the role of Chief Information Officer (CIO) for the State of Hawai'i.

1. **Extensive Experience in IT Leadership**: I have over 25 years of experience leading enterprise IT transformation initiatives in both healthcare and government sectors.

This experience is crucial for a CIO, where strategic direction and management of IT resources are key responsibilities.

- 2. **Dedication to Hawai'i's Community**: I am dedicated to cultivating IT systems that connect community stakeholders to help Hawai'i thrive. This aligns with the role of a CIO, which involves enhancing government services and fostering innovation and efficiency in public service delivery.
- 3. Leadership in Government IT Transformation: As the executive director of Transform Hawai'i Government (THG), I built momentum inside and outside of state government to transform disparate legacy systems into a modern, integrated delivery-driven system. This experience is directly relevant to the CIO role to oversee the implementation of IT governance and policies that drive digital transformation initiatives.
- 4. **Strong Community and Civic Involvement**: My previous involvement in various committees and boards, such as the State Information Technology Steering Committee, the TRUE Initiative, the Broadband Hui, the Hawai'i Health Information Exchange, and the Hawai'i Health Connector demonstrates my commitment to improving IT governance and secure access to information systems. This experience is valuable for a CIO to collaborate with state departments and agencies to align IT strategies with the overall goals of the state.
- 5. **Proven Track Record in IT Project Management**: My work with the Hawai'i Health Information Exchange (HHIE) and the Hawai'i Primary Care Association (HPCA) showcases my ability to manage large-scale IT projects and initiatives. This experience is essential for a CIO in overseeing the implementation of IT policies and ensuring the security and privacy of state data.
- (4) What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service?

Given my deep connection to Hawai'i, I am aware of the state's unique challenges and opportunities. It is with a commitment to the spirit of ALOHA that I aim to enhance government operational excellence through trusted partnerships, shared resources, and technology leadership by:

- Ensuring critical IT infrastructure and services are reliable and secure, and
- Promoting innovative use of technology and data across the executive branch.

Specific goals informed by the State IT Strategic Plan include:

1. Optimize Process Efficiency - by enhancing digital services for constituents,

- integrating IT planning and budgeting, and improving business processes;
- 2. **Modernize Systems** by enhancing IT service management, setting architecture standards, and improving vendor delivery;
- 3. **Maximize the Value of Shared Services** by establishing a strategy for shared services, cost-sharing, managing a statewide IT service catalog, and optimizing the ERP system to enhance business capabilities;
- Provide Business Continuity and Resilience by identifying and mitigating risks related to legacy applications, non-digital processes, Internet connectivity, and recovery efforts;
- 5. **Build a Modern IT Workforce** by improving HR processes, creating career opportunities, updating IT job classifications and pay scales, and planning long-term workforce needs:
- 6. **Enhance Cybersecurity Protection** by protecting critical infrastructure and data, fostering inter-departmental collaboration, providing training, and implementing security standards; and
- 7. **Optimize the Responsible Use of Data and AI** by protecting privacy, ensuring security and compliance, improving quality and reliability, and promoting accessibility, transparency, equity, and ethical practices.
- (5) Name three qualities that best describe you and that would make you stand out. How would these qualities benefit as the Chief Information Officer (CIO)?
- Strategic Leadership: I have experience leading organizations and initiatives, including my role as the executive director of Transform Hawai'i Government and the Hawai`i Health Information Exchange. My work includes driving digital transformation and advocating for a digital state government that is accessible, accountable, and responsive to the people of Hawai'i;
- Accountable Partnerships: Developing partnerships across various departments
 and stakeholders is critical for success. A constant theme throughout my career is
 the ability to partner with key stakeholders to implement a unified vision. I've lead
 by encouraging collaboration on initiatives where standardization, data-sharing,
 and economics benefit from doing things together; and
- **Value-Driven Innovation**: My commitment to prioritizing innovations that deliver the most value to the business and its customers highlights my innovative mindset.

(6) Name one previous experience that would make you stand out. How would this benefit as the Chief Information Officer (CIO)?

As the executive director of the Hawai'i Health Information Exchange (HHIE) I successfully established the HHIE as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and managed two multi-year statewide federally funded contracts worth \$12M. I also implemented a statewide clinical health information exchange network that supported over 1,200 users and delivered Health IT consulting services to more than 800 healthcare providers.

My ability to transition the organization from a federally-funded dependency model to a fee-for-service model demonstrates my strategic planning and financial management skills. Additionally, my work on the state Health Care Privacy Harmonization Act, which aligns state health information privacy laws with federal laws, showcases my legislative advocacy and policy development expertise.

These experiences highlight my capability to lead complex projects, manage large budgets, and navigate regulatory environments, all of which are crucial for driving IT transformation and improving public services in the state.

(7) Can you foresee any possible conflicts of interests that could arise during your service as the Chief Information Officer (CIO)? How would you overcome any possible conflicts of interest?

I do not foresee any possible conflicts of interests. If a conflict of interest were to arise, I would cooperate with leadership and relevant stakeholders to ensure transparency and honesty in all my actions. I would take responsibility for any potential conflicts and communicate openly with my leadership and team.
