1 Fiscal Implications: The Department of Health ("Department") requests that this measure be

2 considered as a vehicle to provide this needed funding so long as it does not supplant the

3 priorities and requests outlined in the Governors executive budget request.

4 Department Position: The Department appreciates this measure and respectfully offers the
5 following comments.

6 **Department Testimony:** The Emergency Medical Service & Injury Prevention System Branch

7 (EMSIPSB) submits the following testimony on behalf of the Department of Health. We

8 recognize the intent of the bill to improve patient access to primary healthcare for residents in

9 central Maui. As emergency call volumes rise, expanding resources may be necessary to meet

10 the growing demand for care. While increasing ambulance availability can address the

11 immediate need for emergency services in central Maui, exploring cost-effective solutions that

12 also address a broader range of healthcare needs could offer a more sustainable approach.

In certain regions, alternative solutions such as Mobile Integrated Health (MIH) or Community
 Paramedicine programs provide a more sustainable and less costly option. These programs focus

15 on community-based care, addressing both emergency and non-emergency needs, and preventing

16 unnecessary transports for non-urgent cases.

17 MIH programs allow for follow-up visits, preventative services, and chronic disease

18 management, reducing reliance on emergency services while improving health outcomes. By

- 1 incorporating these programs, we can provide a more tailored and efficient response to the
- 2 unique needs of the community, ensuring that resources are used in the most effective way
- 3 possible.
- 4 In conclusion, while we fully support the goals of H.B. No. 905, we recommend further
- 5 consideration of alternative service models like MIH that could complement the bill's objectives.
- 6 These models can help ensure the long-term sustainability and efficiency of emergency medical
- 7 services while meeting the increasing demand for care in underserved areas.

The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) submits this testimony **SUPPORT** of HB 905 which appropriates funds to the Department of Health to purchase one advanced life support ambulance and related equipment to be based in central Maui, fund pay-related personnel costs for state-certified emergency medical services personnel and increase the predictability and stability of available air ambulance services for all islands in the State.

The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) is the constitutionally established body responsible for protecting and promoting the rights of Native Hawaiians.¹ Among its statutory duties, OHA is required to (1) serve as principal public agency in the State of Hawai'i responsible for the performance, development and coordination of programs and activities relating to native Hawaiians and Hawaiians; (2) assess the policies and practices of other agencies impacting native Hawaiians and Hawaiians; and (3) conduct advocacy efforts for native Hawaiians and Hawaiians.²

In fulfillment of its mandates, OHA seeks to advance policies, programs and practices that increase access to quality, culturally informed healthcare for Native Hawaiians. HB 905 will expand critical emergency medical services infrastructure and mitigate transportation barriers, which is crucial for Native Hawaiians who live on the island of Maui. Given Maui's significant growth and aging population³, an additional ambulance is necessary to help reduce death and disability among residents and visitors.
