The Grassroot Institute of Hawaii **supports** [SR132/SCR163](#), which would request the counties to adopt flexible zoning setback standards for state buildings to maximize efficiency and improve public service delivery.

This is a commonsense resolution. Land costs in Hawaii can easily top \$2 million for relatively small commercial or industrial lots.<sup>1</sup> Because of this, it should be a priority for the state to get the most value out of taxpayer dollars when building or renovating its buildings.
