A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DEPARTMENTAL DATA SHARING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statewide 2 longitudinal data system stores and analyzes career and technical education data it receives from all state educational 3 4 systems and workforce training agencies to support research and 5 evaluation that will improve outcomes throughout the early 6 education to workforce pipeline. While other state agencies are 7 included in the system to provide data as appropriate, the determination of whether or not data from another department is 8 9 appropriate is left to the department of education, the 10 executive office on early learning, the university of Hawaii, 11 the department of labor and industrial relations, and the 12 department of human services.

13 The legislature further finds that data currently collected 14 by state educational systems and workforce training agencies 15 does not include information from certain segments of Hawaii's 16 workforce, such as those who are self-employed. This leaves the 17 current workforce data incomplete. Gathering data from the tax

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1	filings of those who are self-employed will provide a more		
2	accurate analysis of the State's workforce.		
3	The purpose of this Act is to include the department of		
4	taxation and department of business, economic development, and		
5	tourism in the departmental data sharing through the statewide		
6	longitudinal data system to allow for a more accurate analysis		
7	of the State's workforce.		
8	SECTION 2. Section 27-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended to read as follows:		
10	"§27-7 Departmental data sharing. (a) The department of		
11	education $[\tau]$; the executive office on early learning $[\tau]$; the		
12	$[University]$ university of Hawaii $[\tau]$; the department of labor		
13	and industrial relations $[\tau]$; the department of human		
14	services $[\tau]$; the department of taxation; the department of		
15	business, economic development, and tourism; and other state		
16	agencies, as appropriate, shall share data through the statewide		
17	longitudinal data system to support research and evaluation that		
18	will improve outcomes throughout the early education to		
19	workforce pipeline. The data to be shared shall be determined		
20	jointly by the department of education[$_{ au}$]; the executive office		
21	on early learning $[\tau]$; the [University] university of Hawaii $[\tau]$;		

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
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1	the department of labor and industrial relations $[\tau]$; the
2	department of human services $[\tau]$; the department of taxation; the
3	department of business, economic development, and tourism; and
4	other state agencies, as appropriate, and shall be shared no
5	less than annually [-]; provided that any data provided by the
6	department of business, economic development, and tourism or
7	department of taxation shall also be aggregated or anonymized.
8	(b) The department of education $[\tau]$; the executive office
9	on early learning $[\tau]$; the [University] university of Hawaii $[\tau]$;
10	the department of labor and industrial relations $[\tau]_{i}$ the
11	department of human services $[\tau]$; the department of taxation; the
12	department of business, economic development, and tourism; and
13	other state agencies, as appropriate, shall share data in a
14	manner that safeguards the confidentiality of student education
15	records, as defined by the federal Family Educational Rights and
16	Privacy Act, and workforce data, as provided by applicable
17	federal and state laws, rules, and regulations.
18	(c) The statewide longitudinal data system shall store and
19	analyze career and technical education data it receives from all
20	state educational systems and workforce training agencies
21	pursuant to section 304A-304 to analyze the cross-agency

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longitudinal education and workforce outcomes of students who
 attempted an educational course, training program, career
 program, postsecondary program, or other state-supported
 workforce training program. Data to be shared shall be
 determined jointly by the relevant agencies and shall be shared
 no less than annually.

7 (d) All data shared by or with the department of human 8 services [7]; department of taxation; department of business, 9 economic development, and tourism; department of education $[\tau]$; 10 public charter school authorizers [7]; public charter schools [7]; 11 executive office on early learning $[\tau]$; and other entities as 12 required by statute shall be subject to any state or federal 13 laws and any administrative rule regarding privacy adopted by 14 the department or agency that collected the data.

(e) The department of education [7]; the executive office
on early learning [7]; the [University] university of Hawaii [7];
the department of labor and industrial relations [7]; the
department of human services [7]; the department of taxation; the
department of business, economic development, and tourism; and
other state agencies, as appropriate, shall partner to

14	(f)	All state agency directors shall consider sharing data
15	for the st	tatewide longitudinal data system."

18	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
