
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that greater transparency
2 is needed regarding graduate outcomes in higher education.
3 Publicly reporting data on educational institutions'
4 post-graduation employment rates, median incomes, and other
5 metrics will allow students and their families to make informed
6 decisions about the student's career path and which educational
7 institution the student will attend. Tracking and reporting
8 this data will also help ensure institutional accountability and
9 align higher education programs with the State's workforce
10 development needs.

11 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

- 12 (1) Require the university of Hawaii system to collect,
13 analyze, and publicly report certain data on graduate
14 outcomes;
- 15 (2) Require and appropriate funds for the development and
16 maintenance of a graduate outcomes dashboard; and



(3) Appropriate funds for the establishment of positions with the university of Hawaii system's office of the vice president for academic strategy to support this work.

The legislature declares that the purpose of this Act is a matter of statewide concern pursuant to article X, section 6, of the Hawaii State Constitution.

SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding three new sections to subpart A of part I to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

"§304A-A Graduate outcomes; data collection and reporting requirements. (a) The university shall collect and publish data on the outcomes of its graduates within one year, three years, and five years of the student's graduation.

(b) Data sources for graduate outcomes may include:

(1) State workforce agency employment records;

(2) Graduate surveys;

(3) Federal databases, including the United States Census Bureau's post-secondary employment outcomes program;
and

(4) Employer-reported data, where applicable.



1 (c) The following metrics on graduate outcomes shall be
2 tracked and publicly reported:

3 (1) Employment rates;

4 (2) Median earnings;

5 (3) The percentage of graduates enrolled in a continuing
6 education program; and

7 (4) Any other metrics the university deems relevant.

8 (d) When possible, the data tracked and reported pursuant
9 to subsection (c) shall be disaggregated by:

10 (1) Degree level;

11 (2) Field of study; and

12 (3) Racial demographic.

13 (e) All publicly reported data shall be anonymized to
14 prevent the identification of individual graduates and shall
15 comply with all applicable state and federal privacy laws,
16 including the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act.

17 **§304A-B Graduate outcomes dashboard.** The university shall
18 develop and maintain a centralized graduate outcomes dashboard,
19 made publicly available on a website, that presents in a user-
20 friendly format the university's graduate outcome data collected
21 pursuant to section 304-A. The dashboard shall include:



- 1 (1) Interactive tools for filtering data by institution,
2 degree level, field of study, and racial demographic;
3 (2) Visualization tools, including charts and graphs, to
4 compare outcomes across educational institutions and
5 programs; and
6 (3) Resources for prospective students, including
7 information on in-demand careers and average student
8 debt levels.

9 **§304A-C Reporting requirements.** (a) The office of the
10 vice president for academic strategy of the university shall
11 submit a report to the legislature no later than twenty days
12 prior to the convening of each regular session, beginning with
13 the regular session of 2027. The report shall include:

- 14 (1) An annual summary evaluating institutional performance
15 and workforce alignment;
16 (2) Any other metrics the university deems relevant; and
17 (3) Any proposed legislation."

18 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
21 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal



1 year 2026-2027 for the development and maintenance of a graduate
2 outcomes dashboard, including the establishment of the following
3 positions within the office of the vice president for academic
4 strategy of the university of Hawaii:

- 5 (1) full-time equivalent (FTE) position
6 focused on post-graduation workforce outcomes; and
7 (2) full-time equivalent (FTE) position
8 focused on data visualization.

9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the university
10 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

11 SECTION 4. The university of Hawaii shall begin collecting
12 data as required by this Act no later than one year after the
13 effective date of this Act; provided that the graduate outcomes
14 dashboard as required by this Act shall be made publicly
15 available no later than two years after the effective date of
16 this Act.

17 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section
18 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
19 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
20 the new sections in this Act.

21 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 31, 2050;
2 provided that section 3 of this Act shall take effect on July 1,
3 2025.
