A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 103D-302, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending subsection (h) to read as follows: 2 The contract shall be awarded with reasonable 3 "(h) promptness by written notice to the lowest responsible and 4 responsive bidder whose bid meets the requirements and criteria 5 set forth in the invitation for bids[-]; provided that, if the 6 purchasing agency determines that an award made to the lowest 7 responsible and responsive bidder is not in the best interests 8 of the State, the head of the purchasing agency, with the 9 approval of the chief procurement officer, may award the 10 contract to the responsible and responsive bidder whose bid is 11 most beneficial to taxpayers or otherwise in the best interests 12 of the State. In the event all bids exceed available funds as 13 certified by the appropriate fiscal officer, the head of the 14 purchasing agency responsible for the procurement in question is 15 authorized in situations where time or economic considerations 16 preclude resolicitation of work of a reduced scope to negotiate 17

- 4 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun before its effective date.

- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Authorizes the head of a procurement agency to award a contract to a bidder who is not the lowest responsible and responsive bidder, for procurements conducted by competitive sealed bidding, if the head of the procuring agency determines that the award is most beneficial to taxpayers or otherwise in the best interests of the State. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
