

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LEGISLATURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that members of the		
2	legislature need to maintain a residence in reasonable proximity		
3	to the state capitol year-round. All lawmakers are also		
4	required by law to maintain a home in their district. To		
5	realize equity in representation for all neighbor island		
6	legislators, the legislature finds a need for a basic housing		
7	allowance for those that deem it necessary to have a residence		
8	in proximity to the state capitol in addition to their in-		
9	district residence, as is typical with many federal government		
10	assignments outside of district.		
11	For all legislators that maintain a primary residence		
12	outside of the capitol district on other islands, a basic		
13	allowance for housing should be available where:		
14	(1) If a basic housing allowance is granted, rates are to		
15	be in conformance with and never exceed federal		
16	standards;		

1	(2)	Members who have been granted a full basic housing
2		allowance will have per diem out of session reduced by
3		the housing amount and paid only the meals and
4		incidental expenses component of per diem; and
5	(3)	Members seeking to obtain the basic housing allowance
6		must be approved for the basic housing allowance by
7		the president of the senate or speaker of the house of
8		representatives, as applicable.
9	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
10	by adding	a new section to be appropriately designated and to
11	read as f	ollows:
12	" <u>§24</u>	- Basic housing allowance for a non-Oahu legislator
13	during se	ssion. In addition to the allowance allowed under
14	section 2	4-2, a member of the legislature whose legal residence
15	is on an	island other than the island of Oahu may, upon approval
16	by the pr	esident of the senate or speaker of the house of
17	represent	atives, as applicable, receive a basic housing
18	allowance	during session, which shall be set at a rate equal to,
19	but not t	o exceed, the O-9 per diem rate for lodging established
20	by the De	fense Travel Management Office."

1	SECT	ION 3. Section 24-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended t	o read as follows:
3	"§2 <i>4</i>	-2 Allowance for non-Oahu legislator during session.
4	<u>(a)</u> A me	mber of the legislature whose legal residence is on an
5	island ot	her than the island of Oahu shall receive an additional
6	allowance	to cover all personal expenses [such as board,
7	lodging,]	and incidental expenses but not travel expenses. The
8	allowance	under this section shall be set at a single rate that
9	will:	
10	(1)	Not exceed the greater of the maximum allowance for
11		such expenses payable to any public officer or
12		employee of the federal government or the State;
13	(2)	Be reasonably calculated to cover the expenses
14		specified in this section; and
15	(3)	Be determined jointly by the president of the senate
16		and the speaker of the house of representatives for
17		the legislature as a whole.
18	<u>(b)</u>	The allowance shall be paid to each member at the rate
19	prescribe	d for each day, from the first to the last day of each
20	session,	including Saturdays, Sundays, holidays, and days of

recess pursuant to the mandatory recess required by article III,

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- 1 section 10, of the Constitution or a concurrent resolution,
- 2 except for days of recess when a session of the legislature is
- 3 recessed for more than three days pursuant to a concurrent
- 4 resolution and for days of unexcused absence of the member from
- 5 a meeting of the respective house."
- 6 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
- 9 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 10 year 2026-2027 for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the senate for
- 12 the purposes of this Act.
- SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
- 16 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 17 year 2026-2027 for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the house of
- 19 representatives for the purposes of this Act.
- 20 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
