

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statewide
- 2 parking program for persons with disabilities provides
- 3 individuals with mobility disabilities the ability to travel and
- 4 park in accessible parking spaces. However, individuals with a
- 5 removeable windshield placard that travel to another island or
- 6 outside the State are often in situations where they need to
- 7 park in an accessible parking space at a Hawaii airport or port
- 8 but also take their windshield placard to be used during their
- 9 travels.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to allow a person
- 11 with a removable windshield placard to be issued a disability
- 12 travel placard that is valid for a limited period to allow use
- 13 of the removable windshield placard when traveling.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately
- 16 designated and to read as follows:

1	"§291- Issuance of a disability travel placard. (a)
2	The issuing agency shall issue one disability travel placard to
3	an applicant who has a valid removeable windshield placard and
4	presents a completed form, as provided by the issuing agency,
5	along with a copy of the applicant's proof of travel.
6	(b) The disability travel placard shall expire on the last
7	day of the month following the return date indicated on the
8	<pre>proof of travel."</pre>
9	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2027.

Disability Travel Placard; Disabled Persons Parking

Description:

Requires the Disability and Communication Access Board to issue a disability travel placard to an applicant who has a valid removeable windshield placard and provides proof of travel. Effective 7/1/2027.
