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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

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RELATING TO SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1       SECTION 1. The legislature finds that properly licensed  
2 school psychologists provide effective services to help children  
3 and youth succeed academically, socially, behaviorally, and  
4 emotionally by providing direct educational and mental health  
5 services, as well as working with parents, educators, and other  
6 professionals to create supportive learning and social  
7 environments for all children.

8       The legislature further finds that Hawaii is the only state  
9 without certification or licensure for school psychologists. A  
10 dialogue on how to create a pathway for the licensure of school  
11 psychologists is needed to ensure that functioning school  
12 psychologists are properly qualified and delivering appropriate  
13 services.

14       Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to create a school  
15 psychologists working group within the department of education  
16 to recommend actionable steps or propose legislation to the



1 legislature on an immediate pathway to licensure for school  
2 psychologists in 2026.

3 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department  
4 of education a school psychologists working group to recommend  
5 actionable steps for, or propose legislation on, an immediate  
6 pathway to licensure for school psychologists that can be acted  
7 upon in 2026.

8 (b) The working group shall consist of:

- 9 (1) The superintendent of education, or the  
10 superintendent's designee;  
11 (2) The director of commerce and consumer affairs, or the  
12 director's designee; and  
13 (3) The attorney general, or the attorney general's  
14 designee.

15 (c) The working group shall select a chairperson from  
16 among the members listed in subsection (b).

17 (d) The chairperson shall invite the following individuals  
18 to become members of the working group:

- 19 (1) A representative from the Hawaii Association of School  
20 Psychologists;



(2) A representative from the National Association of  
School Psychologists;

(3) A representative from the Board of Psychology;

(4) A representative from the Hawaii Psychological  
Association; and

(5) Any other individuals, including representatives from  
state agencies, stakeholders, or advocates, as  
recommended by a majority of the working group.

(e) Members of the working group shall serve without  
compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including  
travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.

(f) The working group shall submit a report of its  
findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation to the  
legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of  
the regular session of 2026.

(g) The working group shall cease to exist on July 31,  
2026.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
