HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION AND STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ENCOURAGE AND FACILITATE THE EXPANSION OF ALTERNATIVE AIRLINE SERVICES THAT UTILIZE SHORT TAKEOFF AND LANDING-CAPABLE AIRCRAFTS AND REQUESTING THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE FEASIBILITY AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A RURAL AIR SERVICE PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, Hawai'i's rural communities, including those in 1 Molokai, Lāna'i, and Hāna, rely heavily on air travel for 2 essential services such as health care, education, and economic 3 opportunities; and 4 5 WHEREAS, recent airline service reductions and increased 6 ticket costs have severely impacted the accessibility and 7 8 affordability of air transportation for residents in these 9 areas; and 10 WHEREAS, many rural airports in Hawai'i have shorter 11 runways, limiting the types of aircraft that can safely operate 12 in these locations; and 13 14 WHEREAS, several aircraft models, including the De 15 Havilland Canada DHC-6 Twin Otter, Pilatus PC-12, Cessna 208 16 Caravan, Dornier 228, and Let L-410 Turbolet, possess short 17 takeoff and landing capabilities that make them suitable for 18 operations on short and unpaved runways; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, many countries and states have successfully implemented programs to support rural and remote communities 22 with small airplane services, ensuring transportation access for 23 medical, economic, and general connectivity purposes, such as 24 the Essential Air Service in the United States, Norway's Public 25

Service Obligation routes, and Australia's Royal Flying Doctor 1 Service; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the United States Essential Air Service program 4 provides federal subsidies to airlines operating in regions that 5 would otherwise lack scheduled air transport, benefiting rural 6 communities in multiple states including Alaska, Hawai'i, and 7 Montana; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Norway's Public Service Obligation-supported air 10 network ensures essential air connectivity for remote and rural 11 areas, subsidizing routes that would not be commercially viable 12 due to low passenger volumes and challenging geography; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, Alaska's Rural Aviation System has developed a unique network of state-supported small air carriers that 16 provide critical passenger and freight services to isolated 17 communities, supported by state funding for rural airports and 18 19 maintenance; and 20 21 WHEREAS, public-private partnerships with private operators such as Hawaii Life Flight and Guardian Flight currently provide 22 emergency medical air transport to outer islands; and 23 24 WHEREAS, alternative airline service providers utilizing 25 short takeoff and landing aircrafts can improve air connectivity 26 by offering more frequent and reliable routes between rural 27 28 airports and major transportation hubs, enhancing economic 29 opportunities, medical access, and overall quality of life for 30 residents; now, therefore, 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 32 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 33 of 2025, the Senate concurring, that the Federal Aviation 34 35 Administration and State Department of Transportation are urged to encourage and facilitate the expansion of alternative airline 36 37 services that utilize short takeoff and landing-capable aircrafts to better serve rural and remote communities in the 38 39 State; and 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Department of 41 42 Transportation is urged to investigate potential incentives,

partnerships, and regulatory changes to encourage and facilitate 1 the operation of short takeoff and landing aircrafts to serve 2 rural communities; and 3 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Department of Transportation is requested to conduct a study on the 6 feasibility and implementation of a rural air service program in 7 the State, identifying the best options for such programs, 8 including funding mechanisms, regulatory considerations, and 9 potential airline partnerships, including public-private 10 partnerships; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Department of 13 Transportation is requested to submit a report of its finding 14 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 15 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 16 the Regular Session of 2026; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 20 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration, Governor, Director of 21

22 Transportation, and mayors of each county.
