HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STRONGLY SUPPORTING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A FLOATING DRYDOCK AT PEARL HARBOR. WHEREAS, Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard serves as a critical 1 component of the United States Navy's Pacific Fleet maintenance 2 and readiness efforts, providing essential ship repair, 3 overhaul, and modernization services; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, construction of a floating drydock at Pearl Harbor would expand the shipyard's capacity to service submarines and 7 .8 surface vessels, thereby strengthening national defense; and 9 WHEREAS, establishing a new floating drydock would also 10 generate significant economic benefits for Hawaii, create 11 high-paying jobs, attract investment, and foster workforce 12 development opportunities within the State's maritime and 13 defense industries; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Act 45, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, authorized 16 the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for the purpose of 17 assisting Pearl Harbor Floating Drydock, LLC, a Hawaii 18 19 corporation, for the construction of a purpose-built floating drydock at Pearl Harbor to service submarines and surface ships; 20 and 21 22 WHEREAS, although later cost estimates for the floating 23 drydock were considerably higher than the authorized amount for 24 the special purpose revenue bonds and they ultimately were never 25 issued, the need for a floating drydock remains; and 26 27 WHEREAS, continued investment in modern ship maintenance 28 infrastructure aligns with the United States Navy's strategic 29 objectives and reinforces Hawaii's role as a key hub for the 30 Navy's operations in the Pacific; now, therefore, 31 32
