

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, COUNTY OF MAUI, COUNTY OF HAWAII, AND COUNTY OF KAUAI TO CREATE AND MAINTAIN A COMPREHENSIVE LIST OF HURRICANE REFUGES AND SHELTERS ELECTRONICALLY ACCESSIBLE TO THE PUBLIC.

WHEREAS, the intensity and severity of extreme weather 1 2 events is increasing globally, with the Hawaiian island chain 3 facing growing threats of major storm system impacts; and 4 5 WHEREAS, despite Hawaii's rising risk of experiencing extreme weather events, electronically accessible information is 6 severely lacking as it relates to locations where the public can 7 seek refuge at a moment's notice and continued shelter in the 8 time following a disruptive weather event; and 9 10 WHEREAS, as few public buildings meet minimum requirements 11 to qualify as hurricane refuges and shelters, there are limited 12 13 options in each county for the public to evacuate, while demand is likely to exceed available inventory; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, at present no county offers a comprehensive electronically accessible list on a government-run website that 17 provides crucial information such as the category of hurricane 18 the facility is able to sustain, capacity limits, accommodations 19 20 for access and functional needs individuals, or the ability to 21 shelter pets; and 22 WHEREAS, to ensure information is both up-to-date for 23 government entities maintaining refuges and shelters and for 24 25 members of the public who may need to access this information, 26 it is critical to take a more focused approach towards 27 aggregating and making data available; now, therefore, 28

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 1 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 2 of 2025, the Senate concurring, the City and County of Honolulu, 3 4 County of Maui, County of Hawaii, and County of Kauai are urged to inventory all designated emergency refuges and shelters and 5 document their ability to withstand a category one hurricane or 6 higher; and 7 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of 10 Honolulu, County of Maui, County of Hawaii, and County of Kauai are urged to publish an electronic list accessible to the public 11 12 on a government-run website to include the following criteria, 13 at minimum: 14 15 (1)Location of a possible shelter or refuge area 16 including the name of the facility, address, and 17 relevant site-specific instructions; 18 (2) Category of hurricane the shelter or refuge area is 19 20 able to sustain; 21 22 (3) Capacity limit; 23 24 (4) Pet-friendliness designation; and 25 26 (5) Access and functional needs accommodation designation; 27 and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these electronic lists published by the City and County of Honolulu, County of Maui, 30 County of Hawaii, and County of Kauai, include disclaimers that 31 32 these refuges and shelters may not necessarily be open during a 33 particular emergency as the designating of emergency refuges and shelters will be determined and announced at the time such an 34 35 emergency is declared; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED each county is urged to collaborate with the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency to publish a 38 statewide list of shelters and refuge areas and their respective 39 40 hurricane ratings; and 41 42
