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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

5 REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII SYSTEM TO ESTABLISH A
6 VETERINARY MEDICINE EXPANSION WORKING GROUP TO EXPLORE THE
7 FEASIBILITY OF DEVELOPING A DOCTOR OF VETERINARY MEDICINE
8 PROGRAM AT WINDWARD COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

WHEREAS, the State faces a critical shortage of
veterinarians, especially in rural areas and for large animal
and agricultural veterinary services; and

16 WHEREAS, the State's lack of a Doctor of Veterinary 17 Medicine program forces aspiring veterinarians to seek education 18 on the United States mainland or internationally, which can 19 increase financial burdens and reduce the likelihood that a 20 newly licensed veterinarian will return to Hawaii to practice; 21 and

23 WHEREAS, Windward Community College's Veterinary Technology 24 program has a strong foundation in veterinary education, 25 providing students with hands-on experience and producing 26 skilled veterinary technicians; and 27

28 WHEREAS, expanding Windward Community College's existing 29 Veterinary Technology program to include a Doctor of Veterinary 30 Medicine pathway would help address the State's veterinary 31 workforce shortages and support local agriculture, animal 32 welfare, and biosecurity; and 33

34 WHEREAS, the establishment of a Doctor of Veterinary 35 Medicine program in Hawaii could include collaborations between 36 the University of Hawaii System, private veterinary practices, 37 and national accredited bodies to ensure academic excellence and 38 program sustainability; and 39

1 WHEREAS, community colleges are not authorized to offer doctoral programs, obtaining accreditation for colleges can be a 2 lengthy process. Colleges that would like to administer doctoral 3 programs must go through an accreditation process through the 4 Western Association of Schools and Colleges Senior College and 5 University Commission, or another regional accreditor. 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the expansion of Windward Community College's 9 degree programs would require a feasibility study and strategic planning to assess accreditation standards and the faculty, 10 funding, and partnerships needed to support the proposed 11 doctoral program; now, therefore, 12 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 15 of 2025, the Senate concurring, that the University of Hawaii 16 17 System is requested to establish a Veterinary Medicine Expansion Working Group to explore the feasibility of developing a Doctor 18 of Veterinary Medicine program at Windward Community College; 19 and 20 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Working Group is requested to include: 23 24 25 (1)A representative of Windward Community College's Veterinary Technology program; 26 27 (2) A representative of the University of Hawaii at Hilo's 28 Veterinarian Education Program; 29 30 (3) The Dean of the University of Hawaii College of 31 32 Tropical Agriculture and Human Resilience, or the 33 Dean's designee; 34 The Chair of the Board of Agriculture, or the Chair's 35 (4) 36 designee; 37 (5) Representatives from private veterinary practice, 38 including large animal and small animal practitioners, 39 40 invited by the President of the University of Hawaii; 41

23 24 25 26	(3)	The infrastructure and facilities needed to support a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program;
20 27 28 29	(4)	The State's ability to meet accreditation requirements of the American Veterinary Medical Association;
29 30 31 32 33	(5)	The faculty and curriculum needed to support the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program and to meet accreditation requirements; and
34 35 36	(,6)	The availability of funding, including public-private partnerships and federal grants; and
37 38 39	(7)	Assess the demand for the DVM program and their potential integration within the University of Hawaii System at the most optimal campus.

 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chair of the 6 University of Hawaii Board of Regents, President of the 7 University of Hawaii, Chair of the Board of Agriculture, Dean of 8 the University of Hawaii College of Tropical Agriculture and 9 Human Resilience, Chancellor of Windward Community College, 10 11 Chancellor of the University of Hawaii at Hilo, and members of Windward Community College Veterinary Studies Advisory 12 13 Committee.

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
