REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO APPLY FOR AND IMPLEMENT THE ELDERLY SIMPLIFIED APPLICATION PROJECT IN THE STATE.

| 1 | WHEREAS, many low-income households struggle to purchase |
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| 2 | food due to Hawaii's high cost of living and food prices; and |

| 4 5 | WHEREAS, the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as the Food Stamp Program, is crucial to |
| 5 6 | providing necessary food assistance to some of Hawaii's most |
| 7 | economically disadvantaged residents; and |

| 9 | WHEREAS, in Hawaii, SNAP supports over one hundred thirty |
| 10 | thousand individuals, bringing more than \$630,000,000 into the |
| 11 | State's economy each year; and |

| 13 | WHEREAS, these benefits help economically vulnerable |
| 14 | households meet their basic nutritional needs without |
| 15 | sacrificing their financial security; and |

| 17 | WHEREAS, the Elderly Simplified Application Project (ESAP) |
| 18 | is a demonstration project designed to boost SNAP enrollment |
| 19 | among low-income older adults ages sixty years or older by |
| 20 | tackling barriers to participation in SNAP; and |
| 21 | WHEREAS, ESAP enhances program efficiency, simplifies |
| 22 23 | benefit delivery by streamlining the application and |
| 23 24 | certification processes, waives the recertification interview |
| 2 . 25 | requirement, allows for greater flexibility in verification, and |
| 26 | extends the certification period to thirty-six months; and |

| 28 | WHEREAS, ESAP largely applies to households made up |
| 29 | entirely of older adults with no earned income, although certain |
| 30 | projects also include adults with disabilities who have no |
| 31 | earned income or allow children to be present in the household, |
| 32 | under certain conditions; and |



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1 2 WHEREAS, Hawaii does not participate in ESAP; and 3 4 WHEREAS, if Hawaii were to participate in ESAP, older adults in the State would face fewer barriers to accessing SNAP 5 benefits, which could lead to increased enrollment among low-6 income seniors and an improvement to overall food security and 7 health outcomes; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 10 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 11 of 2025, that the Department of Human Services is requested to 12 apply for and implement the Elderly Simplified Application 13 Project in the State; and 14 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human Services is requested to seek any necessary federal approvals or 17 18 waivers to implement the Elderly Simplified Application Project in the State, including amending its rules, policies, and 19 procedures; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services. 23
