

## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO IDENTIFY AND DEVELOP MINIMUM PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER TRAINING PROGRAMS.

WHEREAS, social determinants of health are non-medical factors affecting health, such as socioeconomic status and geographic location; and

WHEREAS, social determinants of health include the conditions in which individuals are born and raised, learn, work, live, and age; and

WHEREAS, social determinants encompass economic policies, development agendas, social norms, social policies, race and ethnicity, climate change, and political structures; and

WHEREAS, community health workers are trusted members of local communities who share lived experiences with their neighbors and peers and are experts in navigating complex systems of care and serving as a link between clinical and community-based services and the individuals who need them most; and

WHEREAS, the efforts of community health workers have been shown to reduce the burden of illness among individuals with chronic diseases and to improve these individuals' ability to manage their own conditions; and

WHEREAS, the participation of community health workers can improve personal health literacy, which is the degree to which individuals can find, understand, and use information and services to inform health-related decisions and actions for themselves and others; and
