# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statewide 2 parking program for persons with disabilities was established to 3 issue disability parking permits to applicants who are certified by a physician or advance practice registered nurse. A vehicle 4 5 displaying a disability parking permit is authorized to park in 6 spaces designed and reserved for persons with mobility 7 disabilities. However, improper use and insufficient 8 enforcement impact access for legitimate program participants. 9 The legislature further finds that adoption of electric 10 vehicles is a vital step in the State's efforts to combat 11 climate change, reach the 2045 mandated carbon neutrality, and 12 create a more sustainable future. The legislature has made 13 efforts to encourage and facilitate the adoption of electric vehicles with tax credits and designated charging parking 14 15 spaces. These parking spaces not only encourage the adoption of 16 electric vehicles but are a vital component to personal and 17 statewide use. The ability to park in an electric vehicle space

4	non-elect	non-electric vehicles not only takes away an incentive granted		
5	to electric vehicle drivers, but can imperil their

8	Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to:			
9	(1)	Establish a state reserved parking space enforcement		
10		fine for the unauthorized use of parking spaces		
11		reserved for persons with disabilities or electric

13	(2)	Specify that a fine shall not be imposed on a person		
14		who parks in a parking space reserved for electric		
15		vehicles if the charging system is inoperable or		
16		broken; and		
17	(3)	Require the fines be deposited into the safe routes to		
18		school program special fund.

### Report Title:

State Reserved Parking Space Enforcement Fine; Parking; Persons with Disabilities; Electric Vehicles

#### Description:

Establishes a state reserved parking space enforcement fine for the unauthorized use of parking spaces reserved for persons with disabilities or electric vehicles to be deposited into the Safe Routes to School Program Special Fund. Specifies that a fine shall not be imposed on a person who parks in a space designated and marked as reserved for electric vehicles if the electric vehicle charging system is visibly inoperable or broken. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)
