### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statewide 2 parking program for persons with disabilities, was established 3 under part III of chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, pursuant 4 to the federal Uniform System for Parking for Persons with 5 Disabilities, as adopted in title 23 Code of Federal Regulations 6 section 1235. The disability and communication access board 7 administers the program, which together with the counties, 8 issues disability parking permits to applicants who are 9 certified by a physician or advance practice registered nurse. 10 A vehicle displaying a disability parking permit is authorized 11 to park in spaces designed and reserved for persons with 12 mobility disabilities. However, improper use and insufficient 13 enforcement impact access for legitimate program participants. 14 The legislature further finds that adoption of electric 15 vehicles is a vital step in the State's efforts to combat 16 climate change, reach the 2045 mandated carbon neutrality, and 17 create a more sustainable future. The legislature has made

1 efforts to encourage and facilitate the adoption of electric vehicles, with tax credits, and with designated charging parking 2 3 spaces. These parking spaces not only encourage the adoption of 4 electric vehicles but are a vital component to personal and 5 statewide use. The ability to park in an electric vehicle space 6 allows individuals to make sure they can continue to use their 7 vehicle with ease and have the security to make it to their next 8 destination with adequate fuel. The use of these spaces by 9 non-electric vehicles not only takes away an incentive granted 10 to electric vehicle drivers but can imperil their transportation 11 use by not allowing them the opportunity to recharge. 12 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to: 13 (1)Establish a state reserved parking space enforcement 14 fine for parking in parking spaces reserved for 15 persons with disabilities or electric vehicles; 16 (2) Increase fines for any person who parks a non-electric 17 vehicle in a space designated and marked as reserved 18 for electric vehicles; and 19 (3) Require the fines be deposited into the safe routes to 20 school special fund.

SECTION 2. Section 291-57, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 "(b) Any person who uses a parking space reserved for persons with disabilities and refuses or fails to present an 4 identification card issued under this chapter or the rules 5 adopted thereunder to an enforcement officer upon request shall 6 7 be guilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D [and shall, be fined [no] not less than \$250 nor more than \$500[-], 8 and pay any costs incurred by the court related to assessing the 9 10 fine. In addition to any other applicable penalties and fines, 11 any person who violates this subsection shall be assessed a 12 state reserved parking space enforcement fine of \$100. The fine shall be enforced and collected by the district courts and be 13 deposited into the safe routes to school program special fund." 14 15 SECTION 3. Section 291-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 17 "(a) Any person who parks a non-electric vehicle in a 18 space designated and marked as reserved for electric vehicles or 19 parks any vehicle in a parking space equipped with an electric vehicle charging system while not actively charging shall be 20 21 guilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D [and shall],

18		accordance with sections 291-16 and 291C-5[ $\pm$ ]; and
19	(3)	Moneys collected from state reserved parking space
20		enforcement fines pursuant to sections 291-57 and
21		<u>291-72.</u> "

State Reserved Parking Space Enforcement Fine; Parking; Persons with Disabilities; Electric Vehicles
