A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 agriculture's existing agricultural statistics program plays a 3 crucial role in providing producers and policymakers with 4 essential data to guide short-term decision making and long-term 5 strategic planning. In fact, the department of agricultural has 6 a statutory duty and also a contractual obligation with the 7 United States Department of Agriculture to ensure robust data 8 collection and reporting across the State. However, the 9 department has experienced several shortcomings in the 10 agricultural statistics program, including limited access to 11 accurate and timely agricultural data and outdated collection, 12 analysis, and dissemination of agricultural statistics, which 13 results in limited insights to data that is critical to the movement of agricultural goods into and within the State. 14 15 The legislature further finds that in 2024, the department 16 of agriculture launched a statewide process to address key economic challenges facing the agricultural sector and developed 17

1	short-term actions and a rong-term strategy armed at addressing	
2	the short	comings of its statistics program and other goals, such
3	as boosti	ng local product availability and expanding market
4	capacity.	The objectives of the long-term strategy are to:
5	(1)	Collect, analyze, and report data and trends on the
6		intra- and inter-island production, distribution, and
7		sale of select agricultural products;
8	(2)	Provide producers with the information needed to make
9		informed decisions about planting, scaling operations,
10		and exploring new growth or market opportunities;
11	(3)	Provide other decisionmakers with key analyses of
12		production and production opportunities, trends, and
13		growth to better allocate public resources to support
14		agriculture and the public; and
15	(4)	Support the strategic growth and development of
16		Hawaii's agricultural sector by enhancing the
17		statistics program's data collection, analysis, and
18		reporting capabilities.
19	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to revitalize and
20	enhance th	ne department of agriculture's agricultural statistics

1 program by statutorily establishing an agricultural statistics 2 program and appropriating funds for the program. SECTION 2. Chapter 148, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 5 to read as follows: 6 . AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS "PART 7 Agricultural statistics program. The department 8 of agriculture shall: 9 Collect data, provide analysis, and report on the (1)10 intra- and inter-island transportation of fresh fruit 11 and vegetable products; 12 (2) Develop and maintain electronic systems for capturing 13 and analyzing data on the intra- and inter-island 14 transportation of fresh fruit and vegetable products; 15 and 16 (3) Establish a structured rotation schedule for expanded, 17 consistent, sector-specific surveys to collect 18 comprehensive data on key agricultural activities, 19 including: 20 (A) Agricultural theft; 21 (B) Agricultural tourism;

                  Exemption. Data and information collected by the
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    department of agriculture for the purposes of this part or
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    collected, compiled, and stored in the agricultural statistics
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    program, shall be confidential and shall not be subject to
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    discovery or to disclosure under chapter 92F; provided that
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    nothing in this section shall preclude the disclosure of the
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    information in a statistical or aggregate form that does not
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    allow the identification of an individual or entity.
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    Unauthorized review, use, disclosure, or distribution of data
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    shall be strictly prohibited. The State shall not be liable for
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1 any dissemination of information collected, compiled, or stored for use in the agricultural statistics program. 2 3 Collaboration; partnerships. The department of §148-4 agriculture may: (1) Collaborate with national and local entities, 5 including the following, to enhance data collection, 7 analyses, and reporting efforts: (A) United States Department of Agriculture; 9 (B) United States National Agricultural Statistics 10 Service; 11 (C) United States Agricultural Marketing Service; 12 United States Bureau of Labor Statistics: (D) 13 (E) University of Hawaii college of tropical 14 agriculture and human resilience; 15 (F) University of Hawaii economic research 16 organization; and 17 (G) Other state agencies as needed; and Establish partnerships with local producers, 18 (2) 19 transportation companies, aggregators, and 20 distributors to facilitate the electronic capture of 21 and access to other data sets."
