A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 242, Session 2 Laws of Hawaii 2023, amended the name, composition, and duties 3 of the state highway safety and modernization council to make 4 the council an independently led group of expert stakeholders to 5 review the department of transportation's efforts to ensure 6 transparency and provide guidance to the department and 7 legislature to help achieve state transportation goals and 8 outcomes.

9 However, removing the director of transportation as chair 10 and from the council has inadvertently severed the council's 11 administrative attachment to the department of transportation, 12 leading to a loss of essential administrative support. 13 Additionally, the council has historically faced challenges in 14 achieving quorum due to the absence of explicit authorization for certain members to appoint designees, thereby limiting 15 16 flexibility in attendance and impeding the council's ability to 17 conduct official business.

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1	Accor	dingly, the purpose of this Act is to:	
2	(1)	Administratively attach the state highway safety and

5	(2)	Clarify the law to allow members to appoint their	
6		designees to serve on the council; and	
7	(3)	Update membership to facilitate meeting of quorum and	
8		legislative intent.	
9	SECTION 2. Section 286-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
11	"(a)	There is established the Hawaii highway safety and	
12	modernizat	ion council[+] that shall be administratively attached	
13	to the dep	artment of transportation. The council shall be	
14	chaired on	an annually rotating basis by a member appointed by	
15	the president of the senate and a member appointed by the

13	automobile [manufacturing] industry; and
