A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's current
- 2 restrictions on the installation and use of sun screening
- 3 devices, including window tinting, on motor vehicles have
- 4 unintended, adverse consequences on public health, safety, and
- 5 privacy.
- 6 In particular, the State's location within the tropics
- 7 means Hawaii drivers experience more intense sunlight, hotter
- 8 temperatures, and higher amounts of glare and sun exposure.
- 9 Tinted windows can help to increase comfort and reduce glare,
- 10 allowing commuters to drive more safely. Tinted windows also
- 11 help to block ultraviolet light, reducing health risks for
- 12 drivers and their passengers while also protecting the vehicle's
- 13 interior from sun damage.
- 14 Window tinting is especially important for individuals who
- 15 have certain medical conditions that result in an increased
- sensitivity to sunlight. These persons may require darker 16
- 17 window tints than state law currently allows. However, the lack



of flexibility afforded under the current law makes it difficult 1 2 for these individuals to safely and comfortably travel on 3 Hawaii's roads. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to repeal state 4 restrictions on the installation and use of sun screening 5 devices, including window tinting, on motor vehicles. 6 7 SECTION 2. Section 291-21.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 repealed. 9 ["\$291-21.5 Regulation of motor vehicle-sun screening 10 devices; penalty. (a) No person shall operate, permit the 11 operation of, cause to be operated, or park any motor vehicle on 12 a public highway if the glazing material of the motor vehicle: 13 (1) Does not meet the requirements of the Federal Motor 14 Vehicle Safety Standards 205 in effect at the time of 15 its manufacture; or 16 (2) Is used in conjunction with sun screening devices not 17 exempted from this section by subsection (d) hereof. 18 (b) No person shall install, mount, adhere, affix, or use 19 any sun screening device or combination of devices in conjunction with the glazing material of a motor vehicle which 20 does not meet the requirements of the Federal Motor Vehicle 21

5	(c)	-A safety inspection required under section 286-25
6	shall inc	lude a test to ensure that the glazing material and any
7	sun scree	ning devices meet the requirements specified in this
8	section.	
9	(d)	This section shall not apply to:
10	(1)	Rearview mirrors;
11	(2)	Adjustable nontransparent sun visors which are mounted
12		forward of the side windows and are not attached to
13		the glazing material;
14	(3)	Signs, stickers, or other materials which are
15		displayed in a seven-inch square in the lower corner
16		of the windshield-farthest removed from the driver or
17		signs, stickers, or other materials which are
18		displayed in a five-inch square in the lower corner of
19		the windshield nearest the driver;
20	(4)	Rear trunk lid handle or hinges;
21	(5)	Window wipers and window wiper motors;



1	(6)	Transparent sun screening film materials which are
2		installed, affixed, or applied along the top edge of
3		the windshield so long as such materials do not
4		encroach upon the AS-1 portion of the windshield as
5		provided by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 205
6		or no lower than four inches below the top of the
7		windshield, when measured from the middle point of the
8		bottom-edge of the top windshield moulding if no AS-1
9		markings can be found in the left or right upper
10		margin of the windshield;
11	(7)	Sun-screening devices for front side wing vents and
12		windows which, when used in conjunction with the
13		glazing material have a light transmittance of no less
14		than thirty-five per cent-plus-or minus six per cent;
15	-(8)	Sun screening devices for side windows necessary for
16		driving visibility which are to the rear of the driver
17		and for rear windows necessary for driving visibility
18		which, when used in conjunction with the glazing
19		material, have a light transmittance of no less than
20		thirty-five per cent plus or minus six per cent;



1	(9)	Side windows which are to the rear of the driver and
2		rear windows on vans, minivans, trucks, or buses;
3		provided that the vehicles are equipped with rearview
4		mirrors on both sides;
5	(10)	Privacy drapes, curtains, or blinds, or any
6		combination, installed on the interior of motor homes;
7		Of
8	(11)	Transparent sun screening materials, when applied to
9		the AS-1 portion of the windshield, which meets the
10		requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard
11		205.
12	(e)	Any person who violates this section shall be fined:
13	(1)	Not less than \$250 or more than \$500 for each separate
14		offense if the person is the owner of the motor
15		vehicle which is in violation; and
16	(2)	Not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 for each
17		separate offense if the person or business entity is
18		the installer of any sun screening device which does
19		not meet the requirements of this section. The
20		installer shall also reinstall sun protective devices
21		which comply with this section, free of charge, or



1	reimburse the motor vehicle owner for the cost of
2	installing sun protective devices by another installer
3	which comply with this section.
4	The receipt from the installer in the possession of the person
5	in the motor vehicle at the time of the issuance of the citation
6	shall be prima facie evidence of the identity of the installer.
7	The installer shall issue a certificate to the vehicle owner at
8	the time the sunscreen device is installed certifying that the
9	device complies with law. The certificate shall be stored in
10	the motor vehicle at all times."]
11	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stricken.
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
