## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NUISANCES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 health's responsibility to protect both public and environmental 3 health is essential, especially as climate change increases 4 pressures on resources and communities. The recognition that 5 the health of a community is closely tied to environmental 6 conditions underscores the importance of preventing threats to 7 the environment. Therefore, it is critical that the department 8 of health has the clear legal authority and mandate to act not 9 only in response to direct threats of disease but also when 10 nuisances pose a risk to public or environmental health of a 11 community. 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to clarify the
- legal authority of the department of health to prevent and
  address nuisances that threaten public or environmental health,
  both of which affect the overall health and well-being of the
  people of Hawaii as a whole.

- 1 SECTION 2. Chapter 322, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending the title of part I to read as follows: "PART I. PREVENTION AND ABATEMENT OF NUISANCES" 3 SECTION 3. Section 322-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 amended to read as follows: 6 "\$322-1 [Removal, prevention.] Prevention; abatement; 7 destruction; removal. The department of health and its agents 8 shall examine into all nuisances, such as [foul or] noxious 9 odors, gases or vapors, water in which mosquito larvae exist, 10 sources of filth, and all causes of sickness or disease, on 11 shore, and in any vessel, which may be known to them or brought 12 to their attention, [which] that in their opinion are dangerous 13 or injurious to public health or environmental health, or both, and into any and all conditions created or existing [which] that 14 15 cause or tend [to cause sickness or disease or] to be dangerous 16 or injurious to public health or environmental health, or both, 17 and shall [cause the same to be abated, destroyed, removed, or prevented.] prevent, abate, destroy, or remove the nuisance or 18 19 condition that causes a nuisance. **20** For the purposes of this part, a nuisance shall include:

2		manufacture or conversion of methamphetamine, and

5	(2)	Odors and filth resulting from a person feeding feral

9	SECT	TON 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
