### A BILL FOR AN ACT

### PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION TO PROTECT THE RIGHT TO CONTRACEPTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii 2 Constitution must support an individual's ability to make 3 personal decisions about one's own body and medical care through 4 the explicit protection of the right to access contraceptives 5 and engage in contraception. This right includes the right of 6 each person's health care provider to provide contraceptives, contraception, and information, referrals, and services related 7 8 to contraception.

9 The term "contraception" generally means an action taken to 10 prevent pregnancy, including the use of contraceptives or 11 fertility-awareness-based methods and sterilization procedures. 12 The term "contraceptive" generally means any drug, device, or 13 biological product intended for use in the prevention of 14 pregnancy, whether specifically intended to prevent pregnancy or 15 for other health needs, that is approved, cleared, authorized, 16 or licensed under federal law. Contraceptives include

intrauterine devices (IUDs) and emergency contraceptives, such
 as Plan B, Ella, and the emergency application of IUDs, that
 work by preventing pregnancy and not, as some mistakenly
 believe, by terminating a pregnancy, stopping the implantation
 of a fertilized egg, or affecting the developing embryo.

6 The legislature further finds that fifteen states 7 California, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Massachusetts,
8 Michigan, Minnesota, New Jersey, New Mexico, Ohio, Oregon, Rhode
9 Island, Vermont, and Washington - plus the District of Columbia
10 have statutory or constitutional protections for the right to
11 contraception.

12 The purpose of this Act is to propose an amendment to 13 article I of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii to protect 14 a person's ability to seek and obtain contraceptives and to 15 engage in contraception. The proposed amendment is intended to 16 further the right to privacy guaranteed by section 6 of article 17 I of the Hawaii Constitution and is not intended to narrow or 18 limit the constitutional right to privacy.

19 SECTION 2. Article I of the Constitution of the State of 20 Hawaii is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately 21 designated and to read as follows:

2	Section . No law shall be enacted, nor any state action
3	taken, that denies or interferes with a person's right to obtain
4	contraceptives or voluntarily engage in contraception."
5	SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
6	be as follows:
7	"Shall the Constitution of the State of Hawaii be
8	amended to provide that no law shall be enacted, or any
9	state action taken, that denies or interferes with a
10	person's right to obtain contraceptives or voluntarily
11	engage in contraception?"
12	SECTION 4. New constitutional material is underscored.
13	SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon
14	compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
15	the State of Hawaii.
