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# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

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REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO CONVENE A TEMPORARY WORKING GROUP TO  
INVESTIGATE THE EXISTENCE AND ENVIRONMENTAL DANGERS OF PER-  
AND POLYFLUOROALKYL SUBSTANCES AND OTHER RELATED CHEMICALS.

1 WHEREAS, per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are a  
2 group of man-made chemicals widely used in consumer products,  
3 industrial processes, and firefighting foams, and are known to  
4 persist in the environment and accumulate in the human body over  
5 time; and

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7 WHEREAS, exposure to PFAS has been linked to significant  
8 health risks, including but not limited to cancer, liver damage,  
9 developmental issues, weakened immune systems, and endocrine  
10 disruption; and

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12 WHEREAS, PFAS contamination has been detected in water  
13 supplies, soil, and air across the United States, raising  
14 concerns about the presence of these toxic substances in Hawaii  
15 and their impact on the health of its residents and natural  
16 resources; and

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18 WHEREAS, Hawaii's ecosystems, including its waterways,  
19 bodies of water, fish, and other animals consumed by humans, are  
20 integral to the State's food security and cultural practices;  
21 and

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23 WHEREAS, the geographic isolation of the State and its  
24 reliance on a delicate and limited supply of fresh water  
25 heighten the need for a thorough understanding of PFAS  
26 contamination and its potential impacts on human health and the  
27 environment; and

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29 WHEREAS, testing in bodies of water and waterways, as well  
30 as testing fish and other animals for human consumption, is  
31 necessary to identify contamination, assess potential health



1 risks, and ensure the safety of food and water sources in  
2 Hawaii; and  
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4 WHEREAS, the creation of a temporary working group can  
5 provide a centralized and coordinated approach to assess  
6 PFAS-related issues, engage with stakeholders, and propose  
7 actionable recommendations; now, therefore,  
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9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third  
10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the  
11 House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor is  
12 requested to convene a temporary working group to investigate  
13 the existence and environmental dangers of per- and  
14 polyfluoroalkyl substances and other related chemicals; and  
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16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following individuals are  
17 requested to serve as members of the working group:  
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- 19 (1) A representative from the Department of Health;  
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- 21 (2) A representative from the Department of Land and  
22 Natural Resources;  
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- 24 (3) A representative from the Department of Agriculture;  
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- 26 (4) A representative from the University of Hawaii System;  
27 and  
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- 29 (5) Any other relevant stakeholders, including  
30 environmental organizations, industry representatives,  
31 and community groups, as determined by the members of  
32 the working group; and  
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34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested  
35 to:  
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- 37 (1) Identify locations in the State where PFAS  
38 contamination is present or suspected, including  
39 potential sources such as military installations,  
40 industrial sites, and landfills;  
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- (2) Conduct testing in waterways and bodies of water to assess contamination levels;
- (3) Test fish and other animals consumed by humans to determine the extent of bioaccumulation and potential health risks;
- (4) Assess the environmental and public health risks associated with PFAS exposure, particularly in sensitive ecosystems and vulnerable communities;
- (5) Review existing regulations and practices to identify gaps in PFAS management and mitigation;
- (6) Propose strategies for testing, monitoring, remediation, and prevention of PFAS contamination; and
- (7) Recommend changes to state policies, programs, and resources to address PFAS-related challenges effectively; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to submit interim reports to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2026 and 2027, and submit a final report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the Regular Session of 2028, and that these reports are requested to include findings, recommendations, proposed legislation, and potential funding sources; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, and President of the University of Hawaii.
