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SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO CONVENE A TOURISM AND GAMING WORKING GROUP.

WHEREAS, under existing law, gaming, also known as gambling, is largely prohibited within the State; and

WHEREAS, legislation to legalize gaming has been introduced in past legislative sessions; and

WHEREAS, gaming activities operated within a comprehensive policy framework may lead to economic growth and provide a significant source of tax revenue; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature requires information on the costs and benefits of legalized gambling, including different gambling operations, to evaluate and properly consider gambling for Hawaii; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to convene a Tourism and Gaming Working Group; and

 $\ensuremath{\mathtt{BE}}$ IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to:

(1) Research gaming experiences and programs of legalized gambling in other states, including but not limited to revenues generated, costs of administration, preventive education, gambling counseling and treatment, regulation, and enforcement;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to dissolve the Tourism and Gaming Working Group on June 30, 2028; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; Attorney General; Director of Law Enforcement; Director of Taxation; Director of Health; Director of Human Services; and Executive Director of the University of Hawaii Economic Research Organization.
