SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON WHETHER TEACHERS AND SCHOOL PERSONNEL SHOULD BE TRAINED IN THE USE OF, AND BE EQUIPPED WITH, PEPPER SPRAY.

1 WHEREAS, ensuring the safety and security of students, teachers, and school personnel is of paramount importance; and 2 3 WHEREAS, incidents of violence and threats in schools 4 across the United States have underscored the need for proactive 5 security measures to deter potential intruders and protect 6 educators and students from harm; and 7 8 WHEREAS, providing school personnel with non-lethal 9 defensive tools, such as pepper spray, may serve as a form of 10 security and empower teachers to respond effectively to 11 potential threats; and 12 13 WHEREAS, other states have considered policies to allow 14 trained school personnel to carry non-lethal self-defense tools 15 as a means of protection in an emergency situation; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, proper training and guidelines are critical to ensure the responsible use of pepper spray in school settings, 19 including clear protocols for deployment, storage, and 20 accountability; and 21 22 WHEREAS, equipping teachers and school personnel with non-23 lethal self-defense tools may deter potential intruders, empower 24 teachers to respond effectively in an emergency situation, and 25 provide a safe and secure learning environment for educational 26 communities; and 27 28 WHEREAS, before any policy implementation, an assessment of 29 the potential benefits, risks, and legal implications of 30 equipping school personnel in the State with pepper spray should 31 be conducted; now, therefore, 32 33



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1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the 2 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 3 4 Education is requested to conduct a study on whether teachers and school personnel should be trained in the use of, and 5 equipped with, pepper spray; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is requested to 9 include but not be limited to: 10 An examination of school safety data and incidents 11 (1) involving violence of threats against Hawaii public 12 schools; 13 14 15 (2) A review of policies in other states regarding the use of pepper spray by school personnel; 16 17 18 (3) An assessment of the potential benefits and risks associated with equipping school personnel with pepper 19 20 spray, including health considerations and legal 21 implications; 22 (4) Input from school administrators, teachers, parents, 23 students, law enforcement, and security experts; and 24 25 (5) Recommendations on best practices for training, 26 storage, and appropriate use of pepper spray in 27 schools; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 30 requested to submit a report of its findings and 31 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 32 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 33 the Regular Session of 2026; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 36 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 37 Board of Education and Superintendent of Education. 38 39 40 41 OFFERED BY:



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
