SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON
WHETHER TEACHERS AND SCHOOL PERSONNEL SHOULD BE TRAINED IN
THE USE OF, AND BE EQUIPPED WITH, PEPPER SPRAY.

1 WHEREAS, ensuring the safety and security of students,
2 teachers, and school personnel is of paramount importance; and
3

4 WHEREAS, incidents of violence and threats in schools
5 across the United States have underscored the need for proactive
6 security measures to deter potential intruders and protect
7 educators and students from harm; and
8

9 WHEREAS, providing school personnel with non-lethal
10 defensive tools, such as pepper spray, may serve as a form of
11 security and empower teachers to respond effectively to
12 potential threats; and
13

14 WHEREAS, other states have considered policies to allow
15 trained school personnel to carry non-lethal self-defense tools
16 as a means of protection in an emergency situation; and
17

18 WHEREAS, proper training and guidelines are critical to
19 ensure the responsible use of pepper spray in school settings,
20 including clear protocols for deployment, storage, and
21 accountability; and
22

23 WHEREAS, equipping teachers and school personnel with non-
24 lethal self-defense tools may deter potential intruders, empower
25 teachers to respond effectively in an emergency situation, and
26 provide a safe and secure learning environment for educational
27 communities; and

29 WHEREAS, before any policy implementation, an assessment of
30 the potential benefits, risks, and legal implications of
31 equipping school personnel in the State with pepper spray should
32 be conducted; now, therefore,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third
2 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the
3 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
4 Education is requested to conduct a study on whether teachers
5 and school personnel should be trained in the use of, and
6 equipped with, pepper spray; and

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is requested to
9 include but not be limited to:

- 10
11 (1) An examination of school safety data and incidents
12 involving violence of threats against Hawaii public
13 schools;

15 (2) A review of policies in other states regarding the use
16 of pepper spray by school personnel;

18 (3) An assessment of the potential benefits and risks
19 associated with equipping school personnel with pepper
20 spray, including health considerations and legal
21 implications;

23 (4) Input from school administrators, teachers, parents,
24 students, law enforcement, and security experts; and
25
26 (5) Recommendations on best practices for training,
27 storage, and appropriate use of pepper spray in
28 schools; and
29

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
31 requested to submit a report of its findings and
32 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
33 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
34 the Regular Session of 2026; and

36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
38 Board of Education and Superintendent of Education.
