## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO DESIGNATE KUNIA, LEILEHUA PLATEAU, AND POAMOHO AS THE CENTRAL OAHU AGRICULTURAL CORRIDOR AND TO ESTABLISH A LIST PRIORITIZING POTENTIAL AGRICULTURAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS THAT WOULD PROVIDE THE MOST VALUE TO THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the farmlands of Kunia and Wahiawa were once major 1 areas of pineapple production in the State; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, since the downsizing of Hawaii's pineapple industry, both the State and private landowners have diversified 5 6 farming on former pineapple plantation lands; and 7 8 WHEREAS, Hawaii imports nearly eighty-five percent of the food it consumes, and a natural disaster or global event has the 9 potential to significantly disrupt Hawaii's food supply; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the State has established a goal to double local 12 food production by 2030; and 13 14 WHEREAS, significantly increasing diversified farming in 15 Hawaii will require new infrastructure, including roads and 16 water systems integrated to match the needs of farmers; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the development of new infrastructure should 19 consider and prioritize efficiency and safety; and 20 21 WHEREAS, installing traffic markings and signage, including 22 paint lines and speed limits, on roadways may promote safety and 23 awareness for motorists; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, the State and counties should consider agriculture in long-term state and county planning; now, therefore, 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 29 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 30 that the Department of Agriculture is requested to designate 31 Kunia, Leilehua Plateau, and Poamoho as the Central Oahu 32 Agricultural Corridor; and 33

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1 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is requested to plan, design, and implement 3 traffic signage designating a: 4 5 6 (1)Speed limit of thirty-five miles per hour; and 7 8 (2)"No Passing" zone; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture is requested to establish a list prioritizing potential 11 agricultural infrastructure improvement projects that would 12 provide the most value to the State when considering: 13 14 The estimated increase in agricultural production if 15 (1)16 the recommended infrastructure improvement project is 17 implemented; 18 19 (2)The estimated cost of the recommended infrastructure 20 improvement project; 21 22 (3) County plans; 23 County zoning and land use; 24 (4) 25 26 (5) State land use; and 27 28 (6) Any other factors that the Department of Agriculture finds relevant; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture 31 is requested to submit a report containing its list and related 32 findings and recommendations, including proposed legislation, if 33 any, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 34 35 Regular Session of 2026; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 38 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture and Director of Transportation. 39 40 41 42

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
