SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTY OF MAUI, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MAUI EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY, HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY, AND DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, TO CONDUCT REAL-TIME WILDFIRE AND OTHER DISASTER DRILLS INVOLVING THE MAUI COMMUNITY.

WHEREAS, the devastating impact of wildfires and other 1 2 natural disasters in Maui and throughout the State has underscored the critical need for comprehensive and community-3 involved emergency preparedness measures; and 4 5 WHEREAS, recent natural disasters have demonstrated the 6 importance of real-time; practical emergency response training 7 that incorporates both emergency personnel and members of 8 9 affected communities; and 10 WHEREAS, several municipalities in the United States and 11 other jurisdictions implemented community-based disaster drills, 12 successfully engaging residents in the planning, execution, and 13 evaluation of emergency response exercises to increase 14 preparedness and resilience; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Culver City, California's annual community-wide 17 disaster drills, Japan's extensive public disaster preparedness 18 education programs, Vietnam's community-based disaster risk 19 management initiative, and Indonesia's tsunami evacuation drills 20 in coastal villages are examples of successful community-based 21 disaster drills and response programs; and 22 23 WHEREAS, real-time wildfire and disaster drills that 24 include community participation enhance public awareness, 25 familiarize residents with evacuation protocols, and create 26 opportunities for immediate feedback and improvement in 27 emergency response strategies; and 28 29 WHEREAS, involving community members in all phases of 30 disaster drill preparation, execution, and evaluation fosters a 31 32 sense of ownership, responsibility, and empowerment that leads to more effective and coordinated emergency response; and 33



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1 WHEREAS, lessons learned from disaster preparedness drills 2 will provide invaluable insight for the Maui Emergency 3 Management Agency, Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, and 4 Department of Defense in refining disaster response strategies, 5 improving communication channels, and identifying gaps in 6 existing emergency protocols; and 7 8 WHEREAS, a proactive approach to disaster preparedness, 9 10 emphasizing hands-on community engagement, will create a resilient and well-informed population that is better equipped 11 to respond effectively when natural disasters occur; now, 12 therefore, 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third 15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, 16 that the County of Maui, in conjunction with the Maui Emergency 17 Management Agency, Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, and 18 Department of Defense, are urged to conduct real-time wildfire 19 and other disaster drills involving the Maui community; and 20 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the drills are urged to be designed to include local residents in planning, participation, 23 and post-drill evaluations to ensure continuous improvements in 24 disaster preparedness; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Maui Emergency Management Agency is urged to collaborate with community leaders, local 28 businesses, schools, and other stakeholders to maximize 29 participation and effectiveness of disaster preparedness drills; 30 31 and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Adjutant General, 34 35 Administrator of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, Mayor of the County of Maui, and Administrator of the Maui Emergency 36 37 Management Agency. 38 39 **4**0 OFFERED BY:
