RELATING TO EDUCATION

The Department of Budget and Finance offers comments on creation of the Education Research and Development Revolving Fund (ERDRF).

Senate Bill (S.B.) No. 2484, S.D. 1, establishes the ERDRF in the Department of Education to support the research and development of innovative curriculum, instructional materials, and related technologies.

As a matter of general policy, the department does not support the creation of any revolving fund that does not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.4, HRS. Revolving funds should: 1) serve a need as demonstrated by the purpose, scope of work, and an explanation why the program cannot be implemented successfully under the general fund appropriation process; 2) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and charges made upon the users or beneficiaries or a clear link between the program and the sources of revenue; 3) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 4) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. In regards to S.B. No. 2484, S.D. 1, it is difficult to determine whether the proposed ERDRF would be self-sustaining or why the program cannot be implemented under the general fund appropriation process.

The Department of Education (Department) strongly supports SB 2484, SD1 provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact the priorities as indicated in our Board of Education-approved budget. This education research and development revolving fund is needed to provide a funding mechanism to incentivize and support the research and development of innovative curriculum, instructional materials, and related technologies.
