The First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States provides for freedom of religion, speech, and press; and the right to peaceably assemble and to petition the government. Yet, as fundamental and sacrosanct as those values are to America, few if any would argue that those freedoms are not subject to reasonable restrictions (take the cliché of "yelling 'Fire' in a crowded theater").

Similarly, the Second Amendment guarantees the right to keep and bear arms. This right, too, must be subject to reasonable restrictions, or else we would each be able to have our own machine gun mounted on our mantelpiece or strapped over our shoulders.

So the question comes down to what is reasonable. That should be determined by a free people acting through their elected representatives, in this case our State Legislature. And given the times in which we live, and the carnage that we have witnessed both in our own state and across the country, I thank you for taking on the divisive but crucial task of deciding what reasonable restrictions might be.

You have seven bills on today's agenda that would impinge on the right to keep and bear arms: SB 2002 would prohibit possession of a loaded firearm while intoxicated. One would hope that this is not a difficult issue on which to find common ground, though I expect some will disagree.

SB 2518 implies that its adoption would make Hawaii's license-to-carry-firearms law stronger against attack in court. If this Committee finds that to be true, I support it. I have not been able to independently verify that assertion, and hope you will hear from the administration and other law enforcement.

SB 2519 would prohibit large capacity magazines for all firearms. Such magazines are already restricted for pistols, and SB2519 might be the most important bill before you today, given the data on mass shootings that is set forth in the preamble of this bill.

SB 2635 would regulate ammunition the same way firearms are regulated, and require the licensing of sellers of ammunition. It would seem that this proposal would be particularly valuable in the case of a firearm that is lost or stolen, but also in tracing ammunition that is used in a crime.

SB 2943 would prohibit the assembly of a gun that would not have a serial number (a "ghost gun") and would mandate a serial number for firearms brought into Hawaii that do not already have one.

SB 3053 would prohibit 50-caliber guns. I have seen these guns on YouTube and they are awesomelooking weapons. I cannot imagine a legitimate civilian use for them.

SB 3054 would require notification when a firearm is moved out-of-state. This would be of some value, though perhaps limited. On the other hand, the burden on a gun owner seems minimal.

Can any of the restrictions contained in the seven bills be considered unreasonable? I have no doubt that some will say yes, but except for my questions about SB 2518, I would argue that all of these bills would make Hawaii a safer place without unduly restricting the right to keep and bear arms.

There also is an eighth bill on the agenda, SB 2437, relating to electric guns. I confess total ignorance on that subject, and therefore do not offer testimony on it.

Again, thank you for taking on these issues.

Dear Chairman Nishihara:

On behalf our members in Hawaii, I would like to communicate our strong opposition to Senate Bill 2943 (SB 2943).

The hand-making of firearms is a tradition that goes back before the founding of the country. Law abiding firearm enthusiasts should be free to engage in their craft free of government overreach, as all other types of craftsmen are.

Furthermore, the language of SB 2943 is vague and overly broad as to what exactly could constitute a part or parts that could subject a person to felony penalties. Under this legislation it is far too easy for a well-intentioned, and otherwise law-abiding gun owner to accidentally run afoul of the law.

Proponents of the bill will argue that homemade guns constitute a loophole in current law that allows criminals to own firearms. However, that argument fails to recognize that prohibited persons already cannot lawfully possess any firearm, whether home built or produced by a licensed manufacturer. Therefore, SB 2943 does not prevent prohibited persons from obtaining firearms.

Given the glaring absence of public benefit, we can only conclude that SB 2943 is intended to punish law-abiding gun owners and enthusiasts for their interests.

For these reasons we urge the committee to stand with us in opposition to Senate Bill 2943.

Aloha Members of the Senate Committee,

The Hawaii Firearms Coalition OPPOSES SB2943.

The Hawaii Firearms Coalition opposes this bill due to the following reasons:

- 1. The wording of this bill is so vague that any aftermarket part could be considered as being part of a "ghost gun". The definition of what is a firearm is narrowly defined for good reason. Firearm receivers are only deemed to be a firearm when it is over the 80% limit. This legislation would include any item that may be used to make a firearm receiver, such as a block of aluminum, a block of plastic, or even a shovel. Clearly the authors of this bill have no clue how firearms are made and thus should not be trying to conceive of laws that would make good people into felons. Even worse, the near incomprehensible wording of this bill would include most unregistered aftermarket parts used by most firearms owners.
- 2. The right to keep and bear arms very clearly applies to the ability of citizens to manufacture their own arms. If only licensed companies could make firearms, all a tyrannical government would have to do to stop guns from being sold is to suspend the licenses of the manufacturers or make them liable for the actions committed by the end user.

Please vote no or amend this proposed legislation.

For these reasons the Hawaii Firearms Coalition Opposes SB943. Thank you for your consideration.

Dear Chair Nishihara, Vice Chair Wakai, and Members of the Committee:

Gaps in the law that allow people to build their own guns using parts and kits that are widely available online, without a background check, make it easy for prohibited purchasers to evade gun laws and access firearms that cannot be traced by law enforcement. A strong ghost gun bill would create new state laws to regulate untraceable firearms in Hawaii, which is why **I am urging you to support SB 2943** and make it illegal to, sell or purchase ghost guns and the unfinished receivers used to build them without serialization.

A comprehensive ghost gun bill will ensure Hawaii law regulates untraceable, undetectable, and dangerous firearms. Untraceable guns are increasingly used by illegal gun trafficking rings across the country. A 2015 bust of a ghost-gun trafficking ring in Long Island revealed ghost guns as the "new frontier of illegal firearms trafficking."¹ In July 2018, the Los Angeles Police Department broke up a brazen trafficking enterprise in Los Angeles.² Individuals have been caught manufacturing and selling untraceable guns in locations across the country and passing this law in Hawaii will contribute to the state remaining at the forefront of the gun safety movement.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify today and the work you do to keep the people of Hawaii safe from gun violence. **I urge you to support SB 2943** and extend Hawaii's law to include the regulation of ghost guns.

The Church of the Crossroads was founded in 1922 as Hawaii's first intentionally multiethnic church. We are a Just Peace Church of almost 200 members, and have voted unanimously to support this bill.

The State should prohibit the purchase, manufacture, and acquisition of firearm parts for the purpose of assembling firearms having no serial number, as this evades important permit procedures and related background checks that are intended to protect the public prior to anyone acquiring a firearm.

Firearms registration and permit requirements provide essential protections for public safety by requiring criminal background checks, mental health background checks, certain standards for safety training for firearms, and other legal requirements.

"Ghost guns" are assembled from firearm components to create a new firearm that has no registration, serial number, or permit. Printing 3D plastic guns and creating guns from component parts should be prohibited because, having no serial number, those firearms evade the permit and registration process, thus providing no protection for the public as to who can acquire such guns. Moreover, plastic guns are particularly dangerous because they cannot be detected by many existing security screening devices, thereby endangering us all when plastic firearms are brought onto airplanes and other places where firearms are prohibited.

The State has a strong interest in assuring that all firearms are subject to the same stringent requirements for registration, permit and background checks, based on a unique serial number that accurately identifies each firearm in the State. Any efforts to evade those requirements by private manufacture of firearms without serial numbers and without legal permit procedures, should be prohibited.

Thank you for your consideration of this important issue.

The first part of the wording is FALSE. It says a person can assemble a firearm and bypass registration and other legal requirements. Once a firearm is started to be made, the owner has 3 days to bring it to HPD to register it. Also there are federal laws about when to add on a serial number. The bill also states with minmal expertise to assemble to gun is needed. That is false. I would say if someone knows how to replace their own alternator in a car, then they would be able to assemble a "ghost gun". How many people do you know that knows how to install their own alternator for their car, or would they take it to a mechanic? Most of us take our cars to the mechanic. So this law would do nothing because criminals/felons do not follow the law.

Lets go through why this law is bad. Section 2 (1)-It is already law that all firearm receivers must have a serial number. If there is no serial number, then it is not a "receiver" yet. It's just a chunk of plastic or metal. Is having a block of aluminum going to be needing a serial number? The answer is no. Section 2 (3) Any cobo o fparts of which a firearm can be functional. This refers to any spare parts. Barrels, springs, triggers, slides, pins, butt stocks, etc...All parts which do break on firearms. So this section says that replacement parts for legal firearms are not allowed. So an owner would have to buy an entire new gun instead of just replacing the broken aprt.

To make a firearm, it would cost about \$500-\$600 just in the parts alone. To buy a stolen firearm cost about \$150. Now that \$500 is if the felon makes it. But we also have to add in the cost of all tools needed, so add another \$150 to that \$500 base price. Now if somone else makes it illegally for them, they won't be making it for free. THey're going to mark it up to say \$1,000. So why would a felon who might have to toss the gun spend \$1,000; when they could spend \$150 instead. And also guns not made at a factory are also not as reliable. WHich means the gun won't work. So to spend \$1,000 on a not reliable firearm makes no sense.

HB1598 on the surface seems like a good idea, it would take the decision to issue carry permits away from the county police departments and move it to the Attorney General office.

The reason we oppose this bill is it would still provide that permits are MAY issue, this keeps the status quo, where a person is not guaranteed to be issued a permit should they apply.

The fee for the permit is cost-prohibitive, the claim is being made that the \$100 price tag in this bill is to cover the actual cost of issuing the permit. A person applying for a permit would have already undergone a strict vetting process when obtaining their firearm, a NICS check takes less than 30 minutes to conduct and is free when ran by an approved agency. Honolulu issues driver licenses that are valid for two years and cost only \$10.

The training requirements in this bill would require a person to have take the basic pistol course within the last 6 months. This would mean a person applying for a permit every year would, in fact, have to take the basic pistol course each and every year. On average the cost of the pistol course is \$150. This in combination with the license fee would equate to \$250 each and every year just to be able to defend themselves.

Depending on the study you look (*A*) at between 3.5 and 7.7 percent of the adult population have a concealed carry permit. If Hawaii was to start issuing permits and we applied the same percentages Hawaii would have to issue somewhere between 35,000 and 77,000 permits each year. At \$100 per permit, the AG's office would incur an

income of 3.5-7.7 million dollars a year, this is between 5-10% of the AG's total budget (B).

With Hawaii issuing permits only for 1 year even on the low end of the estimate the AG's office would need to process 134 permits a day 5 days a week to be able to hand them all. Whereas issuing a 5-year permit as is done in most states (*C*) that number becomes much more manageable at 26 a day. The fee also becomes much more manageable at \$20 per year (based on \$100 per license)

Please oppose SB2943. HRS 134-3 already requires self-made firearms to be registered with HPD. This Bill does nothing to address the crime occurring in our streets. Most firearms are obtained illegally via theft or straw purchase. And in crimes where the firearm has no serial number, it was removed previously, which of itself is a criminal offense. Criminals would rather steal a firearm than go through the detailed and laborious process of manufacturing a firearm. It takes skills and tools to be able to manufacture a safe and reliable firearm. Law abiding citizens want to ensure that they are using something that will not hurt them or the ones around them. Federal law allows individuals to manufacture firearms for their own personal use. And in Hawaii, firearms are already required to be registered. This same requirement would hold true on self made firearms in the same manner as firearms brought in from out of state as stated in HRS 134-3.

The Bill as written would also ban every part for firearms repair or upgrade. Many firearms owners in Hawaii are competitive shooters and purchase parts for their firearms for competition use. Hunters would not be able to acquire replacement parts for their rifles. By banning these parts, they will be unable to repair or upgrade their legally possessed firearms. Parts affected by this ban would be, but are not inclusive of; bolts, upper receivers, slides, barrels, extractors, ejectors, trigger shoes, firing pins, sights, springs and so forth.

Also, by making it illegal to purchase these parts, local firearms shops would lose the largest part of their business, which is accessory sales, not to mention follow-on sales of ammo. This would result in lost tax revenue from lost sales and higher unemployment as shops lay off employees or cut their hours to account for the shortages in income.

I wish to add my voice in strong OPPOSITION to this proposal as it is already against the law in Hawaii to be in possession of an unregistered firearm. In addition, this law would make the possession of "gun parts" a class C felony.

Firearms enthusiasts, much like car enthusiasts, enjoy changing out the many different after market parts that are widely available. Whether it be a heavier barrel for a more precise shot group, or a different hand guard for a more comfortable grip, or to accommodate a disability, a wide range of after market parts are available and are sought out by firearm owners to customize their property. The vagueness of this law, as with so many others, leaves such a broad interpretation that any non-serialized parts would be outlawed. A vast majority of the law abiding firearms community enjoys this aspect of customization. This law will hurt them!

"Manufacturing" firearms has been a central issue to the right to bare arms since it's inception. Courts have long held that as long as the firearm is made for the personal use of the maker and he is qualified to own the firearm (ie, not a felon) that manufacture could not be outlawed.

The ability to manufacture a firearm for ones own personal use must be at the heart of the Second Amendment. Aloha,

SB2943 is flawed from top to bottom. It is a literal mess of gibberish. There are so many mistakes and contradictions that it makes this bill unmanageable. As a manufacturer, I can see many areas of the bill where law abiding citizens would be turned into instant criminals with the enacting of this measure. I will attempt to explain some.

Line (3) states " Any combination of parts from which a firearm having no serial number may be readily assembled." This statement would deem any and all spare parts illegal. Reasoning is that even a block of wood can be made into a receiver. If you have a 2x4 and a box of spare parts, that would be a violation under this section.

The measure also attempts to redefine the definition of a firearm by amending HRS134-1 to include a definition for "Firearm Receiver". In one part of the proposed definition it states "part of a firearm that provides housing for the firearm's internal components, such as a hammer, bolt, breechblock, action, or firing mechanism." On a firearm, these items (and many more) are housed in 2 SEPARATE portions of the firearm. By law, on the receiver in long guns and frame in handguns is considered the serialized "firearm". By changing this definition, you make BOTH portions of the completed gun 2 firearms in one.

The 2nd part of the "Firearm Receiver" definition states "The term includes any object or part that is not a firearm frame or receiver in finished form but that is designed or intended to be used for that purpose and may readily be made into a firearm frame or receiver through milling or other means." This also poses an issue in that, as previously mentioned, a block of wood and be made into a firearm. So can a block of aluminum, sheet metal, or even a shovel from Home Depot. The word "intended" is very subjective when it comes to defining what a gun truly is. As such, I recommend that you remove the definition of "Firearms Receiver" and stick to the legal and industry standard definition as set by the BATFE.

Lastly, in section (b) of the proposed statute, any person who completes or acquires a 80% frame or receiver with the intent of manufacturing a firearm must have the frame or receiver engraved with the registration number. This poses a major contradiction. Since the measure is basically setting the acquisition process of 80% frames and receivers to be the same as a complete long gun or handgun, a person wouldn't get a registration number to be engraved until AFTER they brought it in the HPD for registration. Since you need a serial number on a firearm to even BEGIN the permit process, this creates a serious problem.

I hope you all can see where items in this bill can and will create a lot of issues. And these are only the some of the issues I can see in this measure. I am always available for assistance if needed.

Without a SERIOUS AMOUNT of amendments, I urge the committee to defer this measure. Thank you.

SB2943/HB1733 - RELATING TO FIREARMS. Makes it a Class C felony to purchase, manufacture, or otherwise obtain firearm parts for the purpose of assembling a firearm with no serial number. Amends certain requirements relating to firearms registration.

This Bill does nothing to address the crime occurring in our streets. Most firearms are obtained illegally via theft or straw purchase. And in crimes where the firearm has no serial number, it was removed previously, which of itself is a criminal offense. Criminals would rather steal a firearm than go through the detailed and laborious process of manufacturing a firearm. It takes skills and tools to be able to manufacture a safe and reliable firearm. Law abiding citizens want to ensure that they are using something that will not hurt them or the ones around them. Federal law allows individuals to manufacture firearms for their own personal use. And in Hawaii, firearms are already required to be registered. This same requirement would hold true on self made firearms in the same manner as firearms brought in from out of state as stated in HRS 134-3.

The Bill as written would also ban every part for firearms repair or upgrade. Many firearms owners in Hawaii are competitive shooters and purchase parts for their firearms for competition use. Hunters would not be able to acquire replacement parts for their rifles. By banning these parts, they will be unable to repair or upgrade their legally possessed firearms. Parts affected by this ban would be, but are not inclusive of; bolts, upper receivers, slides, barrels, extractors, ejectors, trigger shoes, firing pins, sights, springs and so forth.

By making it illegal to purchase these parts, local firearms shops would lose the largest part of their business, which is accessory sales. This would result in lost tax revenue from lost sales and higher unemployment as shops lay off employees or cut their hours to account for the shortages in income.

To pass this Bill does nothing but place more burdensome restrictions on law abiding citizens who wish nothing more than to exercise their Constitutional right to keep and bear arms as set forth in both the United States and the Hawaii Constitutions.

Criminals would rather steal a firearm than go through the detailed and laborious process of manufacturing a firearm. It takes skills and tools to be able to manufacture a safe and reliable firearm. Law abiding citizens want to ensure that they are using something that will not hurt them or the ones around them. Federal law allows individuals to manufacture firearms for their own personal use. And in Hawaii, firearms are already required to be registered. This same requirement would hold true on self made firearms in the same manner as firearms brought in from out of state as stated in HRS 134-3.

The Bill as written would also ban every part for firearms repair or upgrade. Many firearms owners in Hawaii are competitive shooters and purchase parts for their firearms for competition use. Hunters would not be able to acquire replacement parts for their rifles. By banning these parts, they will be unable to repair or upgrade their legally possessed firearms. Parts affected by this ban would be, but are not inclusive of; bolts, upper receivers, slides, barrels, extractors, ejectors, trigger shoes, firing pins, sights, springs and so forth. Also, by making it illegal to purchase these parts, local firearms shops would lose the largest part of their business, which is accessory sales. This would result in lost tax revenue from lost sales and higher unemployment as shops lay off employees or cut their hours to account for the shortages in income.

And in Hawaii, firearms are already required to be registered. This same requirement would hold true on self made firearms in the same manner as firearms brought in from out of state as stated in HRS 134-3.

The Bill as written would also ban every part for firearms repair or upgrade. Many firearms owners in Hawaii are competitive shooters and purchase parts for their firearms for competition use. Hunters would not be able to acquire replacement parts for their rifles. By banning these parts, they will be unable to repair or upgrade their legally possessed firearms. Parts affected by this ban would be, but are not inclusive of; bolts, upper receivers, slides, barrels, extractors, ejectors, trigger shoes, firing pins, sights, springs and so forth.

Also, by making it illegal to purchase these parts, local firearms shops would lose the largest part of their business, which is accessory sales. This would result in lost tax revenue from lost sales and higher unemployment as shops lay off employees or cut their hours to account for the shortages in income.

To pass this Bill does nothing but place more burdensome restrictions on law abiding citizens who wish nothing more than to exercise their Constitutional right to keep and bear arms as set forth in both the United States and the Hawaii Constitutions.

Prior to NJROTC, I proudly served 32 years in the United States Navy as Cryptologist Warfare Officer with tours ashore, afloat, and my last tour in Afghanistan. I have spent a career that required me to utilize firearms as a tool to protect lives and property in support of our great nation. If a person is not legally able to own a firearm, it is already illegal for them to make their own firearm. In addition, it is illegal for a person to make firearms and sell them without a license to engage in the business of manufacturing and selling firearms. These are all of the relevant points of the law, as they exist today.

This bill seeks to make simple metal and plastic blocks illegal, pushing the definition of a gun much further than federal ATF definitions. The ATF defines these kinds of thresholds based on extensive technical knowledge about firearms.

For example, I am a machinist. Any block of metal can be made into a firearm through milling or other means. This bill basically describes every manufacturing process, ever. The Bill as written would also ban every part for firearms repair or upgrade. Many firearms owners in Hawaii are competitive shooters and purchase parts for their firearms for competition use. Hunters would not be able to acquire replacement parts for their rifles. By banning these parts, they will be unable to repair or upgrade their legally possessed firearms. Parts affected by this ban would include but not limited; bolts, upper receivers, slides, barrels, extractors, ejectors, trigger shoes, firing pins, sights, springs and so forth. Some of these are high wear parts that require replacing from time to time. This bill is essentially a work around to an all out ban on firearms by not allowing replacement parts, so if something breaks, the firearm is useless.

Also, by making it illegal to purchase these parts, local firearms shops would lose the largest part of their business, which is accessory sales. This would result in lost tax revenue from lost sales and higher unemployment as shops lay off employees or cut their hours to account for the shortages in income.

To pass this Bill does nothing but place more burdensome restrictions on law abiding citizens who wish nothing more than to exercise their Constitutional right to keep and bear arms as set forth in both the United States and the Hawaii Constitutions

Report Title: Firearms, "Ghost Guns", Registration

Description: Makes it a Class C felony to purchase, manufacture, or otherwise obtain firearm parts for the purpose of assembling a firearm with no serial number. Amends certain requirements relating to firearms registration.

My name is Molly Hernandez. I'm standing before you today in 100% support of SB2943 relating to Ghost Firearms with no serial numbers or ID. The lack of laws pertaining to ghost guns allows anyone to easily obtain firearms even though strict laws are already established to permit and register firearms. We need to support each other to keep our communities and ohana safe by establishing SB2943 into law to strengthen firearms being used and prevent tragic incidents from happening to others.
