HOUSE BILL NO. 3040 SD1 RELATING TO PESTICIDES

Chairperson Creagan and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on House Bill 3040 SD1, relating to Pesticides. The bill requires the Department of Agriculture to provide annual reporting on pesticide inspection and compliance investigations and increases fines for pesticide use violations. The Department offers comments.

While the Department supports the concept of transparency of the Pesticides Branches functions, there are elements of the proposed reporting requirements in the bill that gives the Department concerns. First, there is no exception for reporting on open investigations. If an investigation uncovers a violation, the results can become part of a civil or criminal proceeding. As such, and in accordance with HRS 92F-13(2) and (3), information regarding ongoing cases is not disclosable and must remain confidential until such cases are closed, adjudicated, or settled. The Department requests that it be made clear in the bill that open investigations are not subject to reporting. The Department maintains relevant data to report to EPA as required. Some of the reporting criteria in this bill, such as the number of days between the complaint being filed and the case being closed, the specific nature of the complaint, the location of inspection and the active ingredient of the pesticide involved, is not maintained electronically. This



information is only located within each inspection jacket., Our method of maintaining electronic data would need to be revised, and the data would to need be extracted manually from each inspection report on an ongoing basis. The Pesticides Branch conducts several hundred inspections annually, including on average 75-100 stemming from complaints. The Department needs additional staffing to fulfil the reporting requirements in this measure. The Department notes that Act 45 SLH 2018 added reporting requirements for restricted use pesticides (RUPs). Act 45 SLH 2018 provided two (2) temporary positions to fulfil these new requirements, in addition to other duties. These positions have expired, and the Department is now using the Pesticide Use Revolving Fund to fund one of these positions through the end of this fiscal year in order to meet Act 45 obligations. The RUP summary required by Act 45 and associated necessary actions (following up with applicators who submitted insufficient information, instructing applicators on how to report, etc.) has proven to be a nearly full-time job in and of itself, and will continue to require substantial resources every year, for which the Department does not have ongoing budget. Without additional staffing the Department will have a difficult time on an ongoing basis meeting the reporting requirements in this measure (should it be enacted) or those in Act 45. The Department believes it could handle both with one additional one full time permanent position.

The Department supports increased fines for pesticide use violations. The Department always started violators off with small fines, and only increased fines as violators made repeat violations. Raising the fines at the higher end does not stop the Department from beginning with minimal fines for first and second-time violators. Currently, if the Department feels that our maximum possible fine has not deterred a violator from violating again, we refer the case to the EPA. If the EPA takes action, the fine is generally substantially higher, and any collected fines go to EPA. After the passage of Act 45 SLH 2018, all fines collected by HDOA for violations of 149A, HRS are placed into the pesticide use revolving fund, where they may be used for training, educational workshops, environmental surveys, and other pesticide branch related activities. The Department would benefit from fines going to us, rather than going to EPA. The Department would only use these highest end fines for businesses and

individuals who repeatedly violate pesticide law without any attempt to better their practices.

Aloha Chair Creagan, Vice Chair DeCoite, and Members of the Committee:

I am Brian Miyamoto, Executive Director of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,800 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

## The Hawaii Farm Bureau respectfully opposes SB 3040, SD1. We believe this bill is unnecessary and will actually hurt the Department of Agriculture's efforts to provide timely pesticide enforcement.

The purported purpose of this bill is to "protect the State's residents and environment and ensure more stringent enforcement of the Hawaii pesticides law". We are very familiar with the current pesticide laws and regulations and how they are being enforced. We are very concerned about **the unintended consequences** of SB 3040, SD1.

Adding an *additional* annual and complex reporting requirement will not in any way accomplish the purpose of the bill because it will detract from the time and effort of the current Pesticides Branch staff and its deputy attorney general.

## • Examples cited show the bill is unnecessary

The examples of enforcement actions cited in SB 3040, SD1 clearly show that the bill is unnecessary – every single complaint *is* being investigated immediately, routine inspections and investigations *are* being conducted appropriately, and severe and extraordinary fines *are* being exacted from those who violate the law.

 <u>New and stricter State pesticide regulations are now in effect</u> Just last year, after working for several years with the community and the Board of Agriculture, the Department overhauled and revised its pesticide rules to be even more stringent, and nearly tripled its fees.

#### <u>Annual report to legislature is already being provided</u>

Requiring the Department to submit a report to the legislature on what the Pesticide Branch has accomplished in the prior year *is appropriate <u>and is already</u> <u>being done</u>. However, it is not appropriate to require the proposed detailed information on complaints, inspections, and investigations prior to the closure of a case. Anyone can allege a complaint and many do....against a neighbor they don't like, against a business they don't like. Some complaints may be altogether without merit, while others may require a protracted investigation to determine the facts and whether or not a violation has occurred.* 

#### • Flawed information that can be misused

What purpose does it serve to have a detailed accounting of how many *unsubstantiated* complaints were made? The proposed report calls for *ALL* complaints to be reported along with the number of DOA enforcement actions taken. WHY would this be helpful?

For example, if there are 97 unsupported complaints but only 3 legitimate ones, we should expect a maximum of 3 enforcement actions – not 100. This report will be used to vilify the department for not taking action on complaints that have no basis. It will be used to falsely claim that public health is not being protected. And what is to prevent fake claims from being made, counted, and publicized, against a particular farmer/farm whose type of farming, while legal and in conformance with all best management standards, is opposed by certain groups with strong beliefs against that particular farm or type of business?

#### • Disclosure concerns

It would be an infringement upon the basic rights of the alleged violator *and* the complainant to publicly post detailed information, including names and locations of complaints and investigations before determining the facts. Instead of working on case development and legal review, the deputy attorney general assigned to the pesticide branch will also be preoccupied with the paperwork burden this measure will mandate as she ensures that proper confidentiality and disclosure laws are not violated.

# It is extremely ironic that since the outbreak of COVID-19, pesticide wipes are being used (they are even selling out in stores), by individuals and business around the world to prevent the spread of the virus. There is no outcry against this use. In fact, health authorities are encouraging this use.

Contrary to efforts made by some, pesticides can and are being used safely. Pesticide use is a fact of life worldwide, and especially in climates like ours in Hawaii, where there is year-round disease proliferation, insect-breeding, and weed-growing. Eliminating pesticide use altogether, or demonizing its use ignores the reality that these products are very much needed to prevent human and animal diseases, to protect the watershed and other natural resources, and to safeguard our homes and crops.

Of course, it goes without saying that pesticides must be used properly. Stringent enforcement of the strict federal and State pesticide laws and regulations, as well as timely and routine inspections and compliance investigations of potential misuse of pesticides, are crucial to protecting public health and ensuring public confidence in the State's oversight of pesticide use. **The good news is that this is already being done.** 

This bill and its mandated reporting will detract from the real work the department must continue to do, without any benefit to the public or the environment. In fact, the skewed information that will be provided by the proposed report will hurt efforts to focus on and address real safety issues.

To further the purpose of this bill and to better support the Pesticide Branch efforts, **this measure should be held.** Instead, additional staffing and other resources could be allocated to the department to carry out its current responsibilities.

Paul Achitoff The current state fines for pesticide use violations are only a maximum of Kaleikoa Ka'eo \$1,000 dollars for individuals and \$5,000 for commercial applicants. Even in cases where the commercial applicant knowingly violates pesticide labels and Michael Miranda laws the maximum state fine is currently only \$25,000. SB 3040 would propose to change the maximum allowable fines to \$5,000 for an individual, Walter Ritte Jr. \$10,000 for a commercial applicator and \$35,000 for a commercial applicant Pua Rossi-Fukino that knowingly violates. Karen Shishido In cases, such as the 2016 and 2017 Syngenta (Kaua'i) failure to adhere to pesticide use instructions, exposing farmworkers to the (now banned) Leslie Malu Shizue Miki neurotoxin pesticide chlorpyrifos and injuring their health, or the recent Monsanto/Bayer guilty plea regarding the illegal use of the banned pesticide Penncap-M on Maui and Molokai, the state should have the ability to issue a fine that is reasonable, especially considering they are multinational chemical

corporations. Bayer profited over \$13 billion dollars in 2019. The maximum the state could have fined them for this severe violation would have been \$25,000. Any increase to this amount should be supported.

Exposure to Penncap-M has been linked to impaired neurological development in the fetus and in infants, chronic fatigue syndrome, and Parkinson's disease. What is the fine amount that matches the true cost of the impact to the health and life of our people? The maximum allowable state fines should be raised to represent the full damages to our communities and environments and the exposed workers in the fields.

SB 3040 is a step in the right direction but still a relatively small increase compared to the costs involved with misuse of pesticides and the federal fine limits. State fine limits could be increased to much higher values then even the increase proposed in this measure. The EPA has the ability to fine pesticide violators millions of dollars and even then they often end up paying a fraction of the maximum, or originally issued fine.

Furthermore, the low fine threshold is a lost opportunity for the department of Agriculture to obtain the funds they need to better implement their programs and new laws around pesticide use in Hawai`i.

We support transparency in the process and the reporting associated with pesticide violations. The community deserves the right to know how complaints are being addressed and what the result of the investigations were.

This bill is an important step to better protecting our farmworkers, communities and the environment from pesticide misuse and I strongly urge you to support SB 3040.

Dear Chair Creagan:

On behalf of the Western Plant Health Association (WPHA), I am writing to express our **opposition** to SB 3040, SD 1, which would increase fines for pesticide violations and substantially increase reporting requirements on the Hawaii Department of Agriculture (HDOA). WPHA represents the interests of fertilizer and pesticide manufacturers, agricultural biotechnology providers, and agricultural retailers in Hawaii, California, and Arizona.

WPHA appreciates the author's interest in assuring the safe use of pesticides to protect the public and environment. We understand that while the intent of the bill is that by increasing fines for pesticide violations, growers and applicators will be more attentive in their use of pesticides. However, we believe this bill is unnecessary and will result in higher costs to farmers.

SB 3040, SD 1 would dramatically increasing fines for pesticide violations, including increasing potential fines for misdemeanors to \$35,000. WPHA is concerned that requiring the HDOA to increase penalties for any first-time violations or misdemeanors will result in fewer individuals contacting HDOA for guidance on the use of a product. We believe that one of the strengths of regulatory agencies like HDOA is their ability to act as an educational tool for the regulated community. If growers and distributors believe they could be putting themselves at risk of substantial fines for misdemeanors, they will be less willing to reach out for the educational expertise that HDOA can provide. WPHA could understand the rational for increased fines if there were any indicators of a growing trend of violations by applicators or agricultural users. growers or applicators to observe pesticide rules. WPHA is opposed to increasing fines without a justification of need.

SB 3040, SD 1 would also mandate the HDOA annually compile a comprehensive report that would include the number of inspections, violations, investigations undertaken and the number completed – including a description of each inspection and investigation. WPHA believes this will result in a tremendous cost increase to HDOA. HDOA is currently finalizing a new reporting mandate for restricted use pesticides that was passed by the legislature just two years ago. We believe it is premature to require additional reporting requirements on HDOA while they are seek to finalize the legislatures current reporting mandates. WPHA believes that this additional requirement will require HDOA to redirect resources that could be better spent on actual educational and enforcement efforts with growers and the public. Additional mandates for reporting should not be required unless additional resources are allocated by the legislature to HDOA for this requirement.

We believe increasing fines without a demonstration of need sends a false message about compliance by growers and applicators of pesticide use rules. Requiring additional reporting mandates on HDOA without any demonstrated need for additional reports and without additional financial support from the legislature will negatively impact HDOAs ability to fulfill their educational and enforcement mission. For these reasons we **oppose** SB 3040, SD 1 ask for your **no** vote. WPHA thanks you for your consideration of our comments and welcomes any questions you may have.

Aloha Chair Creagan, Vice Chair Decoite and members of the committee,

My name is Lauryn Rego and I am the Director for the Hawai'i Center for Food Safety (CFS). CFS is a nationwide public interest, sustainable agriculture nonprofit organization whose missions include the promotion of agricultural production methods that are beneficial to the ecosystem. We have over 950,000 farmer and consumer members across the country, including nearly 14,000 in Hawai'i. On behalf of CFS and our members, I thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony today regarding this important bill.

CFS has been dedicated to addressing the human health and environmental impacts of our increased reliance on pesticide use in food production, both in the State of Hawai'i and nationally. We were instrumental in providing legal and communications support in the passage of numerous ordinances relating to pesticide use and disclosure, such as Kaua'i's Bill 2491 and Act 45 (Session Laws of Hawai'i 2018). Since 2014, we have worked closely with community members across the state, in all counties.

I am writing in strong support of SB3040 SD1 which increases fines for pesticide use violations and requires the Department of Agriculture to prepare and submit an annual report detailing these violations.

The study entitled "Pesticide Use by Large Agribusinesses on Kaua'i", published in May 2016 by the independent Joint Fact Finding Study Group, points out the need for more timely pesticide inspections and compliance investigations, as well as better reporting on the results of pesticide inspections and investigations. According to the same study, the use of drift-prone pesticides should be more strictly monitored through inspections and proven violators should be fined.

In light of the recent history of known pesticide violations, we strongly support SB3040 SD1, which will help establish a written public record of violations, and incentivize compliance.

The people of Hawai'i have the right to decide that the risks associated with the improper use of toxic pesticides in commercial agriculture are unacceptable. The public deserves access to the knowledge of such violations to take action to reduce and prevent the potential negative impacts of such misuse.

## SB 3040, SD1, RELATING TO PESTICIDES

**POSITION:** Support, with amendments.

**RATIONALE:** IMUAlliance supports and suggests an amendment for SB 3040, relating to pesticides, which requires the Department of Agriculture to provide annual reporting on pesticide inspection and compliance investigations, and increases monetary fines for pesticide violations.

In the debate over regulating local agriculture, there is one thing that everyone should agree to condemn: causing harm to other people. Unfortunately, Hawai'i's pesticide code allows chemical abuse to go unchecked. Today, the State Department of Agriculture must warn pesticide abusers before investigating potential legal violations. A farm that fails to take caution when using harmful chemicals, then, may suffer no consequences for its actions, since the warning gives owners time to hide evidence of their crimes. Even when caught, chemical criminals face minimal penalties. State law currently grades pesticide abuse as a merely a misdemeanor offense, meaning farm operators who apply dangerous doses of chemicals face a maximum one-year prison sentence.

In the islands, pesticide abuse poses major health risks. According to an investigation conducted by the *Cascadia Times*, pesticide application by four large agrichemical companies on Kaua'i–Syngenta, BASF Plant Science, DuPont Pioneer, and Dow AgroSciences–is ten times the national average. In their report, *Cascadia* found that a number of restricted use pesticides were overused, including chlorpyrifos, atrazine, and paraquat. A study published in the medical journal *The Lancet Neurology*, in March of 2014, found that the neurotoxin chlorpyrifos led to developmental

disabilities in children. Similarly, atrazine and paraquat are banned in the European Union. Atrazine is known to contaminate groundwater supplies, while paraquat has been linked to the onset of Parkinson's disease. Yet, both herbicides remain widely popular in the United States, where the Environmental Protection Agency prematurely declared with "reasonable certainty" that neither carry a significant risk of harm.

Pesticide abuse is not limited to the outer islands. On O'ahu, IMUAlliance has provided services to cancer-stricken sprayers of restricted use pesticides, some of whom have are also victims of labor trafficking. Not only were our clients provided with little to no information about the health risks of pesticides placed in their hands, they were also not given equipment to protect themselves from harm. To protect against pesticide drift impacting sensitive educational areas and making children ill–as happened in 2007 at Kahuku High and Intermediate, in which a dozen students fell ill when a nearby sod farmer ignored windy weather while applying pesticides, and in 2008 in Waimea on Kaua'i, where dozens of students got sick after farmers applied pesticide on a nearby seed corn plot–it is incumbent upon lawmakers to crack down on pesticide abuse.

In addition to raising penalties for restricted use pesticide violations, as this measure does, **we urge you to consider eliminating, rather than revising, the warning notice requirements from the state's pesticide code under HRS §149A-41**, thereby allowing investigators to probe allegations of noncompliance without tipping off their targets. It's time that we started fully prosecuting those who sacrifice people's health to personal profit, even when the weapons involved are chemical carcinogens.

In 2018, elected officials passed SB 3095, banning chlorpyrifos and establishing increased disclosure requirements for pesticide applications. It is imperative that political leaders stand up for safety again during this year's legislative session, given recent court rulings curtailing county jurisdiction over pesticide use and land management. If you wait, our children will breathe in the fallout for generations to come.

Chair Creagan and Members of the Committee:

I am Tim Lyons, Executive Director of the Hawaii Pest Control Association, an association composed of pest control operators who perform structural pest control operations. We are opposed to this bill.

Our opposition lies in the fact that we think it is not a "balanced" bill. If it were, the annual report which contains the information called for in the bill, would call for a complete picture of the information. Aloha Kakou,

As a group who are the eyes and ears on the ground, sometimes in remote locations and sometimes very near schools and community areas of transgenic experimental fields, we see an urgent need for an increase in fines, transparency, and buffer zones.

All too often biotech/chemical companies are taking advantage of our remote isolation, our Important Agricultural Land, water resources, and the lack of oversight. The experimental development of herbicide tolerant crops calls for high levels of pesticide spray. The drift of spray has infected our keiki in schools across the neighbor islands. Residents have been affected in their homes, endangered species suffer, critical habitat diminishes, and our ditches, streams, ground water, and coastal ocean have been harmed.

Perhaps worst of all, the field workers are put on the front line of risk from harmful neurotoxins. They have little to no recourse when they are sickened. We see the persistence of these practices time and time again.

Fines are not enough and are factored in as a "cost of doing business" within the billion-dollar chemical corporations.

On Molokai. the pesticides are sprayed by trucks near the elementary, middle, and the one and only high school. How can we turn a blind eye when counties are suffering and children's developing bodies and brains are in harm's way? This is unacceptable, and in fact criminal behavior.

Our children, our people, our rare and endangered animal species, and our `aina deserve more. We are a world class visitor destination; our economy depends on the protection of the environment and pristine reputation, as a tropical paradise.

Two decades of chemical cocktails is much more damaging than sugar and pineapple crops that mature in 18 months. The nature of transgenic (the crossing of unrelated organisms) experimental fields are to plant as many crops as possible, often 3 times per year. Each crop starts with a highly toxic pre-emergent herbicide. The seeds are coated with a dangerous neonicotinoid insecticide which is taken into all parts of the plant, including the pollen. The engineered laboratory insert of DNA includes Bt production, herbicide tolerance, a viral promoter, and antibiotic resistance. This is a new lifeform that allows copious of pesticide spray application.

Please take this seriously. Countries around the world have banned these practices. Can we start to pivot our understanding of the substantial harm by protecting our children and pregnant woman?

Increased fines are one way to establish a fund for future remediation, and subsequent changes to these bad practices and wasting of our vital resources. Ideally these companies should have been bonded before they ever began to sully our precious air, water, and soil. No one has considered the long-term harm.

Please begin to address these issues by protecting our keiki and increasing the fines for bad practices and EPA and county violations. There is a reason we have the laws. No one should be above the law.

Chair Creagan, Vice-Chair DeCoite, and members of the committee:

Please find below the Hawaii Crop Improvement Association (HCIA) comments regarding SB3040 SD1, which would require the Hawaii Department of Agriculture (HDOA) to provide annual reporting on pesticide inspection and compliance investigations as well as increase monetary fines for pesticide violations.

HCIA has reservations regarding SB3040 SD1 as the Statute's verbiage does not align with its intent to "protect the State's residents and environment and ensure more stringent enforcement of the Hawaii pesticides law." Specifically, Section 2, "§149A- Annual report.", has the potential for misuse and the misrepresentation of certified applicators while simultaneously violating confidentiality requirements and removing enforcement staff from their primary duty.

Firstly, the Hawaii State Department of Agriculture Pesticide Branch currently provides an annual report of their activities to the Hawaii State Legislature. Duplication of these efforts would be both costly and an ineffective use of enforcement staff. Secondly, the Uniform Information Practices Act (UIPA) already provides a vehicle for the distribution of pertinent information that may be provided under the proposed §149A. The UIPA vehicle provides said service with the appropriate confidentiality guidelines and fiscal assessments to offset cost to the Department.

HCIA supports the appropriate use of pesticides as detailed by label requirements and recognizes the importance of the stringent enforcement of said requirements. Routine inspections and compliance investigations of potential misuse of pesticides are also crucial to protecting public health and ensuring public confidence in the State's oversight of pesticide use. However, we respectfully maintain the belief that it is not in the best interest of the State to expose law abiding applicators to undue risk while burdening enforcement staff with a workload that would be duplicative and remove them from their primary duty. It is for these reasons we suggest removing the "Annual Report" language from this measure.

CropLife America (CLA) is the national association representing manufacturers, formulators, and distributors of pesticides products used in agriculture production. We support and promote scientific-based policy in the regulation of pesticide products at both the state and federal level. We oppose SB 3040.

The Hawaii State Department of Agriculture (DOA) already produces comprehensive quarterly and annual reports to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) therefore much of this bill is duplicitous. DOA inspectors are also very thorough in their investigation of complaints and must keep information confidential for both the complainant and farmer. These protocols are in place to ensure an unbiased and fact-based report for both parties and is necessary to ensure the integrity of the process.

We are extremely concerned about the proposed \$35,000 in potential fines for first-time pesticide violations. This language alone has the potential to shut down small farming operations in the state. The agricultural community faces a number of challenges and SB 3040 is likely to have unintended consequences that will negatively impact the viability of farmers in Hawaii. And with the regulatory burden already facing a Department that is severely understaffed, SB 3040 proposes onerous reporting requirements that do not contribute to the future of agriculture or the safety of our communities.

Aloha Chair Richard Creagan, Vice Chair Lynn DeCoite, Members of the House Committee on Agriculture,

Young Progressives Demanding Action (YPDA) advocates for public policies that reflect the values of young people throughout the State of Hawai'i. One of those values is that all of us deserve to live in healthy communities where we don't have to live in fear of pesticide drift. YPDA is in **Strong Support** of **SB3040 SD1**, relating to pesticides which would require the Department of Agriculture to provide annual reporting on pesticide inspection and compliance investigations. If passed, it would also increase monetary fines for pesticide violations.

It is for the sake of future generations that we need to demand further accountability and meaningful enforcement of our pesticide laws. For years now there have been incidents, notably in Kaua'i, Maui and Moloka'i in which toxic (and banned) pesticides have drifted into schools, communities, and even our environment in our lands and our waters.

This is a serious public health issue. Article XI Section 9 of the Hawai'i State Constitution makes it very clear that, "Each person has the right to a clean and healthful environment, as defined by laws relating to environmental quality, including control of pollution and conservation, protection and enhancement of natural resources." These constitutional rights are not being protected and as a result, in November of 2019 we saw Monsanto now Bayer pled guilty and paid \$10 million as part of a plea agreement with the United States Environmental Protection Agency for illegally using the banned pesticide Penncap-M on Maui and Molokai. This could and should have been avoided, and this measure seeks to address this.

What SB3040 is trying to do is important. In the past, pesticide fines were either not enough or were significantly reduced. Even Bayer's \$10 million plea agreement doesn't cover how much damage has already been done prior to the environment, to the community, and the actual

field workers. Pesticide fines will be increased and to ensure the Department of Agriculture is doing their part to investigate, inspect, and enforce, they will also need to submit annual reports to the legislature. The low fine threshold is a lost opportunity for the department of Agriculture to obtain the funds they need to better implement their programs and new laws around pesticide use in Hawai`i.Many other communities have successfully transitioned away from toxic pesticides to organic land management practices, we can do that by starting here with keeping violators in line. Please protect our keiki and the communities they live in.

As you may know, we live in one of the most, if not the most, unique ecosystem in the world. So much of what we should protect we don't even know about yet; there is still so much to discover and to learn from.

When I take my morning walk to the beach, I walk past a taro lo'i in Punalu'u. Most mornings the lo'i is being sprayed by people with pesticides. I have photos of groups of native stilts, ae'o, on that land when the lo'i is left fallow for short periods on time. There are all types of native insects there as well. Right now, after being sprayed daily for a month, the lo'i has a terrible growth of an unusual single type of algae. The algae is blooming all over the sides of the street too. The taro leaves don't look healthy. Heavy pesticide use is a terrible experiment. Less than 30 yards away many native seabirds find crabs to eat in the sand. People have homes all around this lo'i; children play in their yards 5' away. It's frightening to know that we have been eating taro leaves in our laulau that have been sprayed so heavily, just so no one has to pay a farmer to weed. The people who are spraying the pesticides don't speak English which makes it more difficult to learn about the harm pesticides can cause them and our environment. They do not use masks or suits of anykind. I believe this land to be owned by Bishop Estate. I am watching as more of this land is leased to farmers who are now clearing it. There is neighborhood talk of more pesticides and pesticide drift. There are fewer and fewer people who live surrounded by agricultural land; the people who live close to nature and agriculture deserve to live in a healthy environment too. Is it true that there is more pesticide sprayed per sq' of aq. land in Hawai`i than in anywhere in the continental U.S.? It seems in line with what my studies have led to.

We are all here because of the time and love our ancestors gave to us and to the land. If subsidies are given for farmers, they must include provisions to work the land by hand rather than allowing unlimited synthetic, poisonous, noxious chemical use. In the state we are in today, I support this bill which "Requires the Department of Agriculture to provide annual reporting on pesticide inspection and compliance investigations. Increases monetary fines for pesticide violations. Takes effect on 6/18/2050. " Can we not do better than 30 years from now for a bill of this sort? How many biological beings will suffer because of this time lapse? Can you help shift the tide in a healthy direction?

Aloha awakea Chair Creagan and the Agriculture House committee. I am Skylar Grossman, a current student attending Hawaii Pacific University, who is here today to testify in support of Senate Bill 3040. Senate Bill 3040 pertains to the misuse of pesticides within the Hawaiian Islands. This bill will require that the DOA perform and conduct regulatory inspections of pesticides as well as compliance inspections from large agribusinesses. In addition to increasing the monetary value of the fines of pesticide violations. This bill will not only increase the protection of the residents of the islands but increase protection of the environment as well.

In the late 2000s, major agricultural business bought up land on the Hawaiian islands. These companies included Monsanto, DuPont-Pioneer, Dow Chemical, Syngenta and BASF. These chemical companies were enticed by Hawaii's prime climate and soil compositions to test genetically engineered organisms to tolerate a vast array of pesticides. According to the Center for Food and Safety, per acre, Hawaii has the most restricted use of pesticides than ordinary commercial farming on the mainland USA (CFS,2012). In addition, the state of Hawaii has more genetically engineered test fields than any other state in the nation (CFS, 2012). In a study conducted by Michiel A.Daam, SóniaChelinho, Júlia C.Niemeyer, Olugbenga J.Owojori, P. Mangala C.S.De Silva, José PauloSousa, Cornelis A.M.van Gestel, JörgRömbke, funded and supported by the Portuegese Government, found that "In tropical countries, pesticides have often been reported to be applied at a high frequency and throughout a large part of the year" (e.g. Albuquerque et al., 2016; Lewis et al., 2016; Rasmussen et al., 2016,). This study also advocated that topical application of pesticides have a very low efficiency due to the vast array of pesticide species inhabiting the tropical climates such as the Hawiian islands. Therefore due to the low efficiency, the dose and frequency of pesticide treatments are substantially increased (Daam A.,Michiel, et al., 2019). As the growing phenomena and advocacy of green jobs, sustainability, and ecoconsouse development is increasing on a global level, the Hawaiian islands have also dedicated to becoming more green and sustainable by adopting the Sustainable Development Goals of 2030. This includes improving health, food supply, water quality and supply, and much more. However, the current domination and increase in pesticide misuse of these chemical companies are not aligned with the 17 sustainable development goals.

In recent years, particularly for the state of Hawaii, there has been an increasing amount of large scale agribusiness operations that have been found improperly using pesticides. However, as these instances increase throughout the years the fine for misuse of pesticides have decreased. The EPA proposed a fine of \$ 4,900,000, however this number was significantly reduced to a fine of \$500,000. The lax regulation and penalty do not accurately show the severity of the effects of misused pesticides have on society and the planet. These effects include increased birth defects and cancer rates of communities located right below GMO Test fields on the islands. The Island of Kauai, specifically the residents of Waimea, have seen these impacts directly. Furthermore contamination of waterways, air and soils have also been analyzed and linked to pesticide usage. For these reasons among others, I believe that SB 3040 should become law in order to protect both humanity and the environment from contamination of harmful pesticides, Mahalo for listening to the Agriculture House Committee. I look forward to seeing where it goes now that it has been referred to the Judiciary Committee. Aloha a hui hou!
