The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) **STRONGLY SUPPORTS** HB546 HD1, which would faciliate the State's kuleana to 'Ōlelo Hawai'i by providing 'Aha Pūnana Leo with "invited" member status on the state's Early Learning Board (ELB). Because the perpetuation of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i is so important to the evolving culture, health, and wellbeing of Native Hawaiians, this measure may be crucial to ensuring the continued use and growth of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i in Hawai'i and beyond.

'Aha Pūnana Leo provides the ELB with a unique and highly-specialized perspective due to its predominant role in 'Ōlelo Hawai'i early learning education. Although our state is constitutionally mandated "to promote the study of Hawaiian culture, history, and language[,]"¹ and 'Ōlelo Hawai'i has been an official state language since 1978,² much remains to be done to ensure the re-normalization of the Hawaiian language, and 'Aha Pūnana Leo remains the only statewide early learning system conducted in 'Ōlelo Hawai'i immersion for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers. Since the inception of the ELB's predecesser, the Early Learning Advisory Board, 'Aha Pūnana Leo has consistently served as the board's "representative of Hawaiian medium early learning providers."³

Unfortunately, the ELB seat historically filled by an 'Aha Pūnana Leo representative is currently limited to two, 2-year consecutive terms.⁴ Thus, this "Hawaiian medium early learning provider" representative may not serve more than a maximum of four consecutive years. These term limits create a significant challenge for 'Aha Pūnana Leo to find a representative with the requisite experience and institutional knowledge to consistently fill this highly-specialized position, and has limited the ability of 'Aha Pūnana Leo to establish the continuous presence necessary to effectively advocate for the importance and value of a Hawaiian medium early education. Notably, this seat is currently empty and the ELB is suffering from the lack of 'Aha Pūnana Leo's voice, which has otherwise consistently

ensured that all ELB members understand and recognize the essential role of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i medium programming in the development and education of Hawai'i's growing keiki.

OHA commends the tireless efforts of 'Aha Pūnana Leo, which has always strived to ensure that 'Ōlelo Hawai'i survives and thrives as a living language for future generations to come. By providing 'Aha Pūnana Leo with an "invited" voting member seat, without term limits, HB546 HD1 will ensure a consistent Hawaiian medium voice on the ELB, as well as help to fulfill the greater mission to perpetuate and normalize the state's official language of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i.

The strength and endurance of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i is intrinsically connected to the health and wellbeing of the Native Hawaiian people, and it is part of what makes Hawai'i an authentic, unique, and beautiful place for all our local keiki to enjoy, learn, and ultimately thrive. We therefore urge the Committee to **PASS** HB546 HD1.

Chair Nakashima, Vice Chair Matayoshi and members of the House Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs:

Aloha e nā alaka'i o ka 'aha'ōlelo o Hawai'i nei,

Mahalo for the opportunity to submit testimony on HB 546 HD1. The University of Hawai'i at Hilo (UH Hilo) supports the distinctive provisions of HB 546 HD1 relating to the representation of Hawaiian language medium education on early education. UH Hilo is home to Ka Haka 'Ula o Ke'elikōlani, College of Hawaiian Language, who has been leading efforts to revitalize the Hawaiian language while also serving as a model to national and international indigenous communities who also seek to revive their endangered languages. With support from the Hawai'i State Legislature, UH Hilo/Ka Haka 'Ula has established a complete baccalaureate through to PhD program that offers high quality education to develop capacity for Hawaiian medium education and the further advancement of Hawaiian and indigenous languages writ large.

HB 546 is important legislation that needs to be passed. There is an extreme shortage of qualified individuals for all aspects of education through Hawaiian. This provision allows the state access to important contributions from the small pool of highly qualified individuals in this highly distinctive area of education of our state. Without this legislation, there is a danger that the state early education advisory board could have individuals without the necessary expertise to represent the interests of one of the most vulnerable populations in our schools – those attending schooling through Hawaiian in accordance with US policy expressed in the Native American Languages Act of 1990.

EXECUTIVE OFFICE ON EARLY LEARNING'S POSITION: Supports the Intent

Good afternoon. I am Lauren Moriguchi, Director of the Executive Office on Early Learning (EOEL). EOEL supports the intent on H.B. No. 546 HD 1– relating to education.

EOEL is statutorily responsible for the development of the State's early childhood system that shall ensure a spectrum of high-quality development and learning opportunities for children throughout the state, from prenatal care until the time they enter kindergarten, with priority given to underserved or at-risk children. The Early Learning Board (ELB) was established as a governing board through Act 202, SLH 2017.

ELB is responsible for directing the EOEL on how best to meet the developmental and educational needs of children, from prenatal care to entry into kindergarten; providing recommendations to EOEL on improving the quality, availability, and coordination of early learning programs; promoting collaboration across agencies and stakeholders serving young children; and appoint the EOEL director and evaluating the director on an annual basis.

THE ELB provides crucial input, direction, and oversight necessary for EOEL to achieve the statutory responsibilities of the Office. Representatives on the board are reflective of the diversity of the early care and education field in Hawaii, providing unique and important input on how to best serve Hawaii's families and young children. Hawaii is the only state in the United States that has designated a native language, Hawaiian, as one of its two official state languages. The endurance of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i is conneced to the health and well-being of Native Hawaiian people and as such, the representative seat for Hawaiian medium early learning providers is a critical member and advocate for the important values of a Hawaiian medium early education.

The Hawaiian medium early learning provider seat is limited to two consecutive, two-year teams according to current statute. Thus, the representative cannot serve more than 4 years before terming out. The sense of the Board is that the term limit as provided is a barrier to continuity of experienced representation that the amended bill would address. The consistency of representation is the issue upon which many Board members agree. At the same time, there are some on the ELB who would like to investigate the composition of the Board given current needs and whether the proposed solution of making an APL representative a standing member is the best one moving forward to address the current barrier.

HB 546 will allow for a stable and consistent Hawaiian language medium voice on the Early Learning Board (ELB).

The current statute sets a two-term limit for this seat. This negatively impacts the continuity of representation for the Hawaiian language medium programs on the ELB because of the small group of people who can potentially serve in this role. Currently, because of these limits, the seat remains vacant on the ELB. 'Aha Pūnana Leo serves a unique purpose in Hawai'i's early learning system and the representation provided by this critical seat is vital to nurturing understanding and wisdom on the part of the ELB with regard to matters of importance to Native Hawaiian people. The organization has advised that because of the specialized knowledge required, continuity in representation would best serve the needs of the organization as well as the ELB when it comes to matters concerning Hawaiian language medium early learning programs. This measure is affirmed by testimony from the ELB and Executive Office of Early Learning.

As members of Kaulanakilohana, we believe that passage of **HB 546**, which provides an exemption from a member serving more than two consecutive terms, will allow the Hawaiian language medium early learning providers' seat on the ELB to be better represented through a consistent designee. Knowledge of these unique programs and institutional and policy expertise, is required to effectively advocate for the programs. Additionally, a stable board member will create the longevity needed to foster the reciprocal relationships necessary to impart wisdom to the ELB members as they engage in policy work. It will help members to intentionally impact programs for Native Hawaiian keiki and their 'ohana as well as avoid making decisions that result in unintended negative consequences. A consistent representative will also allow the ELB to stay current with the issues and vital work underway to revitalize Native Hawaiian language and culture that require consideration as we build an early learning system.

We are mindful of the need to build a system that will perpetuate and normalize 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, one of our two official languages as reflected in Article X, Section 4 of the Hawai'i State constitution.

For the above reasons, we strongly support HB 546.

I am Robert G. Peters, Chair of the Early Learning Board (ELB). Thank you for this opportunity to offer written testimony in support of the intent of HB 546, HD 1 on behalf of the Early Learning Board.

Through Act 202, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, ELB transitioned from an advisory to a governing board for the Executive Office on Early Learning (EOEL) and is charged with formulating statewide policy relating to early learning.

The ELB is composed of 17 representatives from across the early childhood field, in both the public and private sectors. One of those members is the representative of the Hawaiian medium early learning providers.

Hawaii has designated Hawaiian as one of its two official state languages. As such, and to insure the ELB reflects the diversity of the early learning community, the representative for Hawaiian medium early learning providers is a critical member and advocate for the important values of a Hawaiian medium early education. `Aha Punana Leo (APL) is currently the only provider of Hawaiian immersion statewide that offers programs for infants, toddlers and preschoolers. To date, the Hawaiian medium early learning provider seat has been filled by a representative of `Aha Punana Leo for both the Early Learning Board and its earlier iteration, the Early Learning Advisory Board.

The Hawaiian medium early learning provider seat is limited to two consecutive, two-year teams according to current statute. Thus, the representative cannot serve more than 4 years before terming out. The sense of the Board is that the term limit as provided is a barrier to continuity of experienced representation that the amended bill would address. The consistency of representation is the issue upon which a majority of Board members agree; at the same time, there are some on the ELB who would like to investigate the composition of the Board given current needs and whether the proposed solution of making an APL representative a standing member is the best one moving forward to address the current barrier.

Aloha Legislators,

I write in support of HB 546. My name is Dr. William H. Wilson. I am an education focused applied linguist at the Hawaiian language college mandated by the State Legislature in 1996 and established at UH Hilo in response to that mandate. I have particular interest in issues of equity for Indigenous linguistic minorities. I teach from preschool through to the Ph.D. both with Hawaiian students and Native American students. Part of my duties include providing service to national organizations as an expert in providing equity to Indigenous language minorities.

The Hawai'i State Legislature has been a national leader in addressing issues of equity for Indigenous peoples of the United States through legislation such as HB 546 now before you and other unique support for Hawaiian language medium early education as done in the 2020 Session. One of the national educational equity-focused organizations with which I have worked uses a cartoon illustrating the difference between "equality" giving all the exact same thing (without changing unequal outcomes) and "equity" (targeting distinct challenges to assure equal outcomes). I submit that cartoon as part of this testimony.

HB 546 is equity legislation. It assures that the state board tasked with issues of early learning has representation with expertise in the area of Hawaiian language medium education. It does so by naming to that board the one organization guarenteed to be able to provide such expertise and allowing it to lend such expertise to the state from its own small human resource base with an equity provision related to length of individual service. I know that the 'Aha Pūnana Leo has that expertise and is willing to carry out that responsibility, as I am privileged to serve as a volunteer member on its board.

HB 546 is important legislation that needs to be passed. Without this legislation, there is a danger that the state early education advisory board could have individuals without the necessary expertise to represent the interests of one of the most vulnerable populations in our schools – those attending schooling through Hawaiian in accordance with US policy expressed in the Native American Languages Act of 1990.

As I said earlier, Hawai'i, under legislative bills such as HB 546 has a proud history of national leadership in this area. However, much more needs to be done. A well known example of what happens when proper "equity" attention (versus "equality" attention) is not given to Hawaiian language issues are the Clarabal case from LÄ• na'i. The Hawai'i State Department of Education using standard "equality" approaches (rather than "equity" solutions) have still not solved the Clarabal issue since the LÄ• na'i community first met to ask for an program in December 2013 – seven years ago.

Other areas where there are Hawaiian language issues, include, but are not limited to, access to Hawaiian language courses in high schools, challenges to providing appropriate Hawaiian language courses to Hawaiian speakers regarless of where they are in the University of Hawai'i system, assuring DOE and charter Hawaiian medium schools teachers to hire who have both full proficiency in Hawaiian and subject area content matter knowledge. These things can be addressed and addressed without huge expense if the State Legislature thinks "out of the box" and takes the lead with bold "equity" legislation like HB 546. I strongly urge you to pass HB 546
