Title of Bill: HB 1865, HD1 RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.

Purpose of Bill: Requires the state public charter school commission to disburse funds directly to public charter schools. Repeals the exemption for charter schools from requirements on the administration and use of the federal funds allocated to the State for public education purposes. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

Department's Position:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony with comments on HB 1865, HD1.

The Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) has concerns regarding the proposed amendments to Section 302D-28(d), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), contained in Section 3 of this measure, specifically the change that reads, "Federal funds received by the department for charter schools shall be transferred [to authorizers for distribution] directly to the charter schools [they authorize] in accordance with the federal requirements."

This proposed change would present logistical challenges by requiring the Department's federal fund programs to work with each charter school directly rather than coordinating through the Hawaii State Public Charter School Commission (Charter Commission) staff. This change would exponentially increase operational inefficiencies and the potential for mis-communication between Department programs and charter schools, particularly as each charter school may have unique practices and financial systems.

In addition, this change does not appear to recognize the authority and responsibilities conferred to the Charter Commission as an authorizer in Sections 302D-5 and 302D-17, HRS.

Chair Kidani and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General (Department) provides the following comments.

This bill requires the State Public Charter School Commission to disburse funds directly to public charter schools, and also repeals the exemption for charter schools from requirements on the administration and use of the federal funds allocated to the State for public education purposes. The bill also clarifies that the disbursement of these funds shall not be conditioned on the agreement of a public charter school to amend an existing charter contract.

The bill seeks to amend section 302D-28(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) in pertinent part, to state:

(e) <u>Per-pupil funding disbursement shall not be</u> withheld or conditioned on the agreement of a charter school to amend an existing charter contract, including without limitation amendments that may compromise student eligibility for the Free Appropriate Public Education Program under federal law.

Page 6, lines 13-18.

Under federal law, there is no "Free Appropriate Public Education Program." Rather, the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), as amended in 2004, codified at 20 U.S.C. § 300.1, *et seq.*, requires states to ensure that a free appropriate public education (FAPE) is made available to eligible children with disabilities. Moreover, the Department of Education is ultimately responsible for ensuring that all eligible students attending a public school, including a public charter school, receive FAPE, so per-pupil funding disbursements to charter schools should not impact special education and related services received by IDEA-eligible students.

The Department respectfully suggests that the Committee remove the reference to "student eligibility for the Free Appropriate Public Education Program under federal law" and revise the proposed amendment to section 302D-28(e), HRS, on page 6, lines 13-18, as follows:

> Per-pupil funding disbursement shall not be withheld or conditioned on the agreement of a charter school to amend an existing charter contract[, including without limitation amendments that may compromise student eligibility for the Free Appropriate Public Education Program under federal law].
