RELATING TO FIREWORKS

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

House Bill No. 1969 adds a new section to Chapter 132D, HRS, mandating each county to offer and pay monetary rewards to individuals who report the illegal use of fireworks under certain conditions. This measure also makes an unspecified general fund appropriation in FY 23 to the various counties for implementation.

B&F notes that, with respect to the general fund appropriation in this bill, the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act requires that states receiving Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) II funds and Governor's Emergency Education Relief II funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

Further, the federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires that states receiving ARP ESSER funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

The U.S. Department of Education has issued rules governing how these maintenance of effort (MOE) requirements are to be administered. B&F will be working with the money committees of the Legislature to ensure that the State of Hawai'i complies with these ESSER MOE requirements.

Aloha Chair Johanson, Vice Chair Kitagawa and Committee Members,

On behalf of the Hawaiian Humane Society, thank you for considering our support for House Bill 1969, which mandates each county to offer a monetary reward to individuals who report the illegal use of fireworks and to pay the reward under certain conditions and appropriate funds.

Hawaiian Humane supports any attempt to remove fireworks from residential neighborhoods by keeping these dangerous products out of our state entirely and/or enhancing enforcement. At what should be joyous times for local families, illegal fireworks fill our neighborhoods with unexpected explosions that terrorize pets and people alike.

Animals who flee their homes in fear are at enormous risk of injury and death. An average of 8 stray dogs per day came into the Hawaiian Humane Society in 2021. As the new year arrived, that number spiked to 36 between Jan. 1-2. Hawaiian Humane has long educated our community about keeping pets safe from the terror of fireworks around New Years and July 4, but these bombs increasingly go off for months at a time. That makes it impossible for pet owners to prepare and creates sustained stress on people and animals, which can do lasting damage to their emotional and physical health. Neither people nor animals should have to take tranquilizers just to survive the impacts of illegal behavior by their neighbors.

We urge the committee to restore peace and safety to our neighborhoods and leave fireworks displays to the professionals. Mahalo for your consideration.

To whom it may concern,

As a lifelong resident of Hawaii, I am in favor of offering a monetary reward to individuals who report the illegal use of fireworks in Hawaii. This will make people think twice about setting off fireworks, and incentivise people in our community to speak up about illegal fireworks.

As a child, Fireworks were a joyous occasion and would occur a handful times a year (on Holidays). Now we have aerial fireworks going off almost every day and night, all year long, in my neighborhood of Ahuimanu. They are very loud, setting off car alarms, and some causing the house to shake. (It seems someone in my neighborhood has been making homemade fireworks, that sound more like bombs.) Every time the fireworks go off, it causes all the dogs in the neighborhood to start barking, no matter what the time. Fireworks go off at all hours of the night and day. Fireworks going off on a random Tuesday at 2am is a common occurrence.

My dog has become so terrified of the fireworks that she can cause physical damage to our belongings and the house if left unattended. She refuses to eat and visibly shakes for hours, and must be confined to a crate with a blanket covering it. The fireworks over the past two years have gotten so bad, and so frequent, that now my dog starts to get scared and anxious at dusk, simply because she knows the fireworks are coming.

The Fireworks have been disrupting my sleep, waking me up multiple times a night. Not good for my health. The only solution to the constant "BOOMS" of the fireworks, is to close all the windows and run the AC, in an attempt to block out the noise. Running the AC for this reason seems really silly when it's 60 degrees out in the winter time next to the Koolaus. But closing the windows and running the AC is the only way to get sleep and do my job the next day. But running the AC costs me extra \$\$ every night and is a waste since the natural weather is so

pleasant most of the time. We run the AC more during the winter time, than we do during the hot summer, simply because of the fireworks.

It has gotten so bad that my Husband and I have talked about moving to the mainland simply because the Fireworks have been negatively affecting us so much. I want to continue to live in Hawaii, it's my home, my family is here. Please help put a stop to all the illegal fireworks going off in our communities. Thank you.

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE HAWAII CONGRESSIONAL AND LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATIVES TO REQUEST ASSISTANCE FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO EMPLOY THEIR RESOURCES TO STOP TONS OF ILLEGAL AERIAL FIREWORKS EXPLOSIVES BEING TRANSPORTED TO HAWAII

WHEREAS, several Hawaii residents have complained about illegal aerial fireworks that are negatively impacting their daily lives with bad actor neighbors and individuals launching low altitude extremely loud aerial bomb firework explosions at all hours of the day, all year around and primarily targeting neighborhoods late evenings while people are resting or at sleep, and

WHEREAS, bad actor individuals have modified illegal fireworks into Improvised Explosive Devices (IED) such as pipe bombs to create a much greater low altitude or ground extremely loud explosions which severely impacted the health and safety of the elderly in care homes, disabled Vets with PTSD, children and family pets with some running away from home and being hit by vehicles, and

WHEREAS, the State Legislature previously took action on illegal aerial fireworks with increasing fines and developing a task force in the year 2010 comprised of the Federal Government representatives from ATF, U.S Customs, U.S. Coast Guard, HPD, HFD and port facilities commercial shipping companies; however, this task force did not produce results or any interdiction of illegal fireworks at our port facilities due to the excuse of inspectors claiming there are too many containers to be inspected and the community perception of possible corruption with inspectors, and

WHEREAS, the Honolulu Police Department is overwhelmed with the number of 911 calls that come in all year round and especially for New Years celebrations but the current law requires police officers to actually witness bad actor neighbors and individuals lighting the fuse of illegal fire works before any citation can be initiated or any further City prosecution which is not realistic for arresting the bad actors, and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government such as ATF, FBI and Customs and Border Protection have the classified resources, technology and capabilities to identify, track, interdict and prosecute individuals involved in trans-national organized crime rings transporting and selling tons of explosive illegal aerial fireworks between China and the U.S., which support bad actor residents terrorizing Hawaii neighborhoods, and

WHEREAS, it is suspected by the community and others that the bulk of illegal fireworks are produced in Liuyang, China, transported to Shanghai where the product is loaded into shipping containers and onto Chinese cargo merchant vessels bound for Los Angeles where the product is suspect to be transited by ground to other destinations where the product is then placed into Trojan Horse non-declared explosive shipping containers disguised as high priority goods which are then shipped to major U.S. mainland cities and Hawaii, and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government agencies have the capability to track containers and those suspect containers could be inspected at Honolulu Ports by Federal Agents with trained sniffing dogs or technology devices previously used in the Middle East for detecting explosive material and IEDs, and

WHEREAS, deceptive shipping containers arrive in Hawaii, usually by October each year base on a spike in use of illegal aerial bomb fireworks and this material is temporary stored in commercial warehouses and neighborhood communities and it is only a matter of time where there could be a fireworks accident in this storage area blowing up a city block or residential neighborhood taking many lives of our residents, and

BE IT RESOLVED that the Pearl City Neighborhood Board is requesting our State Legislators and Congressional Representatives to request assistance from the Federal Government to employ their resources to stop illegal fireworks from entering Hawaii ports and to collect evidence for prosecution for all involved in the shipping and storage process to

include bad actor local government employees involved in the distribution of illegal fireworks that should be charged with Class “A” felonies and loss of retirement pensions, and

BE IT RESOLVED that the Pearl City Neighborhood Board requests the State Legislature to improve current illegal fireworks and explosive laws to increase fines and coordinate with the City and County of Honolulu and Judicial authority to develop a monetary reward amount to solicit information from residents on locations of storage of illegal fireworks in warehouses and residential areas to help mitigate this serious safety situation in our neighborhoods and commercial areas; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Pearl City Neighborhood Board requests that Hawaii District Court improve the timeliness for neighborhood residents to litigate potential law suits against bad actor neighbors and individuals to collect punitive damages for the terroristic loud explosions gravely impacting the health and safety of their families and pets with the use of eye witnesses reports coupled with video evidence, signed affidavits by neighbors and HPD police reports for each terroristic loud explosion event that will support the civil suit and possibly lead to criminal prosecution, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Hawaii Congressional Representatives; Governor David Ige; Senator Clarence Nishihara; Senator Bennette E. Misalucha; Representative Gregg Takayama; Representative Roy Takumi; Mayor Rick Blangiardi Honolulu City Council, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives Honolulu Office; Federal Bureau of Investigation Honolulu Office; U.S. Customs and Border Protection Honolulu Office; Joint Interagency Task Force - West USINDOPACOM; and all Neighborhood Board Chairs.

The Pearl City Neighborhood Board No. 21 unanimously approved at its January 25, 2022 Regular Board meeting, by 10-0-0 vote.

Aloha, Chair Johanson, Vice Chair Lisa Kitagawa and Committee members. Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to provide testimony on HB 1969.

I am Chair for the Pearl City Neighborhood Board No. 21 representing our board and all our residents, families and pets negatively impacted by the random, all hours of the day, terroristic loud aerial fireworks explosions impacting our lives daily. Our board unanimously approved our resolution on fireworks at our January 25, 2022 Neighborhood Board meeting to include mitigation recommendations for our Congressional Representatives and State Legislators.

This bill should be focused on where illegal fireworks are distributed and stored. This is the weak link in law enforcement. Organized crime has continued to have a solid distribution ring of selling fireworks to the public. It is suspected that City and State government officials are involved with the distribution of illegal fireworks as bad actors. If the public is empowered with a monetary reward for information leading to the prosecution and conviction of bad actors, this bill would make a huge positive impact for law enforcement. The monetary reward should be directly proportional to the amount of fireworks that interdicted in the warehouse prior to sales. In addition, there should be a monetary reward given to our residents who reported the sellers with the appropriate reward.

I can't over emphasize how important this bill is for approval because we know tons of illegal fireworks are being stored in warehouses in industrial and residential areas. If there is an accidental explosion, the explosion could take out part of a residential home community with many lives lost. Furthermore, with the seriousness of some of these public reports if information leads to City and State corruption; the public information would go to the FBI. If in fact City or State personnel are involved with the distribution and selling of illegal fireworks, their penalty should be not only fines but prosecution of Class C Felony and loss of government pension.

I most strongly urge you to support and approve HB 1969 coupled with the above recommended language for this bill. We are with you! Mahalo!


