The Honolulu Board of Water Supply (BWS) strongly supports House Concurrent Resolution (HCR) 6.

This resolution requests the United States Navy to decommission the Red Hill fuel facility, establish a water treatment facility and pay for all remediation costs to the State.

The BWS has shut down its Halawa Shaft, Halawa Wells and Aiea Wells due to fuel releases from the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility that has contaminated the groundwater aquifer where these BWS wells and the Navy's water supply well obtains its water. Contamination of the Navy's water supply well, Red Hill Shaft, has caused a water contamination crisis at Joint Base Pearl Harbor Hickam unlike any experienced in Hawaii's history. The shutdown of the affected BWS wells poses of the possibility of mandatory water conservation and other measures during the hot summer months in the event the maximum use of available BWS wells is unable to compensate for the loss of Halawa Shaft, Halawa Wells and Aiea Wells.

As alarming as the current crisis is, the permanent shut down of Halawa Shaft, Halawa Wells and Aiea Wells is not the worst-case scenario. The worst-case scenario is a future catastrophic fuel release from the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility that further contaminates Oahu's sole-source aquifer and our critical drinking water resources. The BWS respectfully suggests amending the twentieth recital to replace the phrase "the worst-case scenario" with "a possible scenario" to more accurately reflect existing circumstances and possible future outcomes.

A recent contested case hearing and Navy incidences of fuel releases reveal the facility has reached its useful life, the chances of further leaks are real, and the Navy is unable to safely operate the facility without releases. Defueling of the Red Hill tanks is imperative to prevent the risk of further releases into our irreplaceable aquifer and environment. This resolution is calling for the protection and elimination of any further damage by fuel releases into our sole-source drinking water aquifer and environment now and into the future.

The recent leaks from the facility have directly impacted too many of our members and the communities in which they teach. One such teacher had this to say about their situation:

"We are more impacted by the tainted water. I am only able to have students wash their hands twice a day with the bulk water they gave us with a pump. I am spending a lot of time outside pumping the water out of the bulk bottle, or using the individual water bottles to wash their hands. I don't feel comfortable using the spray hand sanitizer we were given to clean their hands. (It doesn't take off food particles, or other dirt and grime from their hands.) They did give some wipes for their hands, but those will be gone soon. I was washing their hands often, but not anymore. The custodians do not clean our desks. So I use the sanitizing wipes to wipe them down daily. Lots of prep time spent to clean the room. We are still not able to use the AC. We are required to keep windows open. Lots of dirt comes in all day. I also get some stray preschoolers come in the back door. The noise is ridiculous. (Airplanes, lawn mowers, other students at recess.) I don't understand how they think we are supposed to get these students up to grade level with all the distractions."

Civil Beat recently reported (<a href="https://www.civilbeat.org/2022/02/red-hills-firefighting-system-was-damaged-long-before-contamination-crisis/">https://www.civilbeat.org/2022/02/red-hills-firefighting-system-was-damaged-long-before-contamination-crisis/</a>) on Red Hill's fire suppression system, the myriad of problems that exist and that the leak into the water system likely came from fuel sitting in that malfunctioning fire suppression system. It was noted in the same article that the system remains unrepaired and that the entire facility is past its design life.

The Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility cannot be allowed to continue to operate and put at risk Oʻahu's primary source of fresh water. It must be closed as soon as practically possible.

To provide a safe water for our O'ahu communities, the Hawaii State Teachers Association asks your committee to <u>strongly support</u> these resolutions.

#### Comments:

Aloha e Hawaii State Legislature committee on Red Hill HHH/EEP,

I whole-heartedly support HCR 6, requesting the US Navy to prepare a plan for the permenant decommissioning of the Naval Red Hill Bulk Fuel Underground Storage Tanks at Kapūkaki in a manner protecting public health and safety, establish a new water treatment facility and ensure the DoD compensates for all costs to State tax payers for past, present and future remediation efforts.

I appeal to you as a parent, a home owner assocation officer, a former public teacher and US Army medic who depends on clean water to live here with my family in Moanalua. I am also a community volunteer with Hawai`i Peace & Justice, Veterans for Peace Hawai`i Chapter 113, and O`ahu Water Protectors.

However, I would like to address you as a plaintiff with the Wai Ola Alliance, a coalition filing a citizen lawsuit to hold the Navy accountable and prevent any further damage of our natural resources beyond recovery. While the imposition to place such liabilities directly our island's sole source aquifer was short-sighted in the past, the DoD is obligated to remove this constant threat to our communities in the present, so that we may secure a future here for our children's children.

It was not enough that people the military claims to protect were sent to ERs due to the poisoning by fuel leaks to respect local concerns of these ticking time-bombs that have fallen on deaf ears for years. Since the 2014 fuel leaks, our `ohana has worried on a daily basis if today would be the day we found out our water has been detrimental to our child's development. As we know from the latest leaks, our worries have not been unfounded.

The Navy has been aware of and on notice for decades that their tanks and delivery system are in a chronic state of corrosion, improperly operated and under invested in upgrades, resulting in the real possibility of catastrophic failure. Due to the history of leaks and the events of recent months, the Wai Ola Alliance concludes there is no scenario in which O'ahu's water users and ecology are secure with the facility operating, demanding that the Navy immediately close and permanently decommission Red Hill.

It is not anti-military to defend our `ohana, for which so-called patriotism is too narrow. This is not about debating national security as nothing could be more critical to our security than the

resources that sustain life here. We love our children more than we fear US political insecurity. This is about the ability for local democratic governance, for which the Navy keeps showing contempt. Our water is our true wealth and security - culturally, economically and politically.

I am writing in **strong support** of HCR 6, which requests the U.S. Navy to prepare a plan to decommission the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility and store its fuel in a manner compliant with state law.

A recent tweet from *Civil Beat*'s Christina Jedra noted a **1978** *Honolulu Star-Bulletin* article where then-Sen. Daniel K. Inouye observed that the Red Hill fuel tanks were already "deteriorated" and threatened Honolulu's aquifer.

I grew up and currently reside in Aliamanu, which is very close to impacted military households, public schools, and private businesses. The ongoing displacement of servicemember families and the continued closure of some businesses at the Moanalua Shopping Center, including national franchises, is a chilling harbinger of what would happen if fuel were to contaminate Honolulu's aquifer. More than 400,000 city residents would have their water tainted, perhaps irreparably. This foreseeable environmental catastrophe would cripple city businesses and send the state's larger economy into a downward spiral. Residential and commercial real property values would plummet, further harming the economy.

Some argue, without merit, that those who are calling for shuttering of the Red Hill fuel tank facility are "anti-military" or are otherwise "endangering national security." The health security of servicemember families and civilian families alike, including access to clean water, is a vital part of any meaningful notion of national security.

The military's response after the November 2021 leak has regrettably oscillated between denial, obfuscation, mendacity, and cavalier disdain for the well-being of servicemember families, Honolulu's civilian population, and Oahu's natural resources. This is not the posture of a trusted community partner to say the least, and military leadership should endeavor to remediate the lasting harm it has wrought upon servicemember families and Honolulu residents.

The continued operation of the current fuel tank facility at Red Hill should be a categorical non-starter.

One also hopes that President Biden can be encouraged to prioritize the health, safety, and welfare of servicemember families and Honolulu residents and maintain the integrity of Oahu's irreplaceable aquifer.
