## Testimony on behalf of the Hawai'i State Commission on the Status of Women

### Support for H.B. 955

Dear Chair Belatti, Vice Chair Takenouchi, and Honorable Members:

The Hawai'i State Commission on the Status of Women **supports H.B. 955**, which would allow for an additional, rigorous, and nationally-recognized pathway to midwifery licensure.

In 2019, the Hawai'i State Commission on the Status of Women was tasked by the State Legislature to chair the Hawai'i Homebirth Taskforce, which led to a year of intense facilitation and report drafting between diverse stakeholders. HSCSW ED also serves as the President of the Board (unpaid; volunteer) of the National College of Midwifery. With our direct and in-depth involvement as a mediator between contesting perspectives and interests related to birth-related health care, we believe this bill is a fair and important compromise that would improve consumer safety and reproductive choice. In hindsight, Act 32 (2019) was an overcorrection for public safety that should have provided the Portfolio Evaluation Process-exam path to licensure.

Childbirth is more than just a medical event. The fight for "my body, my choice" should extend to a woman's decision where and how to give birth and access to more involved care, especially in light of negative outcomes linked to medical sexism and racism in the United States.

Accordingly, the Commission asks that the Committees pass H.B. 955.

# On the following measure: H.B. 955, RELATING TO CHAPTER 457J, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES

Chair Belatti and Members of the Committee:

My name is Lee Ann Teshima, and I am the Executive Officer of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' (Department), Professional and Vocational Licensing Division's (Division) Midwives Licensing Program. The Department offers comments with concerns on this bill.

The purposes of this bill are to: (1) make permanent the existing exemption for birth attendants to continue to practice without a license, under certain conditions; and (2) expand qualifications for licensure to include the North American Registry of Midwives portfolio evaluation process.

The Department is concerned with the amendments to page 5, lines 16-21, the exemptions provision, which deletes the requirement that a student midwife must currently be "enrolled in a midwifery education program..." and that the North American Registry of Midwives (NARM) preceptor is not a "midwife," or that a Midwifery Education

Accreditation Council (MEAC) qualified preceptor is also not a "midwife." The NARM website provides that:

A NARM Registered Preceptor is a midwife who meets requirements for supervising CPM candidates and has current, approved registration through NARM. The Registered Preceptor must be credentialed as a Certified Professional Midwife (CPM), Certified Nurse Midwife (CNM), Certified Midwife (CM); or must be a licensed practitioner legally recognized by a state/jurisdiction to provide maternity care. A preceptor must have an additional three years of experience after credentialing or fifty primary/co-primary births beyond entry-level CPM requirements. Additionally, they must also have ten continuity of care births beyond entry-level CPM requirements. A preceptor must have attended a minimum of ten out-of-hospital births in the last three years.<sup>1</sup>

The suggested language in this bill is inconsistent with the standards set forth by NARM. Further, it is unclear whether these amendments would meet MEAC standards.

Page 6, lines 4-5, the deletion of the repeal date for the birth attendant exemption of July 1, 2023, the Department takes no position on this amendment. However, it should be noted that prior to this chapter being enacted, the Department expressed concerns with the inclusion of an individual who may practice midwifery as a birth attendant, but not be subject to the same licensing requirements of this chapter. The Department does not believe HRS chapter 457-J is an appropriate chapter for these exempt birth attendants based on the Hawaii Regulatory Reform Act's policy set forth in HRS section 26H-2.

Finally, on page 9, lines 7-16, the Department feels that completion of additional pathways towards a recognized national certification for certified professional midwives would meet the minimum qualifications for midwife licensure.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this bill.

Aloha Chair Belatti, Vice Chair Takenouchi, and members of the Committee,

I am writing to you in strong support of HB 955. This is an accessibility issue for those across our State but specifically in Hawai'i County. As the largest island with the most rural population areas we need to be providing more freedom and options for those with limited resources to birthing support in ways that meet their unique needs. Under the exemption (Act 32 (2019), Section 457-J, Hawai'i Revised Statutes), that currently allows birth attendants to attend births without State licensure, traditional and indigenous midwifery practices are protected from risk of criminality or, worse, cultural erasure. If this exemption is allowed to expire on July 1, 2023 it will be a direct hinderance to birthing people's rights to choose where to give birth and who they want as their preferred birth attendant. These choices are integral to providing safety, care, bodily autonomy, and comfort during birth. This is of significant importance to our State as maternal mortality outcomes are disproportionately high among Black, Filipino, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander birthing people. Also of note are that the requirements for licensure detailed in Act 32 (2019) are prohibitively difficult for many local families to achieve because there are currently no Midwifery Education Accreditation Council schools in Hawai'i. Thank you for taking these concerns into account in your deliberations on this matter.

### Testimony of the Hawaii Home Birth Task Force Chair And Board President of the Hawaii Home Birth Collective

Aloha Chair Belatti and Members of the Health Committee:

My name is Kristie Duarte and I was the Chair of the Hawaii Home Birth Task Force created by Act 32 (2019). I am also the Board President of the Hawaii Home Birth Collective, a home birth midwifery organization dedicated to the preservation, perpetuation, and diversity of home birth practices and autonomy in home birth midwifery care. We continue to offer full **support of HB 955 with additional comments on this bill.** 

As the Chair of the Hawaii Home Birth Task Force, I want to stress how important this 2023 session is. On July 1, 2023, birth attendants with different cultural skills and practices will become illegal unless we pass new legislation this year. Act 32 (2019) stated "By the end of the three year period, the legislature intends to enact statutes that will incorporate all birth practitioners and allow them to practice to the fullest extent under the law."

The Hawai'i Regulatory Licensing Reform Act states that "regulation must not unreasonably restrict entry into professions and vocations by all qualified persons". Hawaii's midwifery law currently leaves out a nationally recognized pathway to certification which would allow for more local midwives to obtain licensure through an approved educational route of entry provided by the North American Registry of Midwives (NARM) through the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP). People certified through this educational evaluation process have completed a rigorous approved educational route and attended at least 55 births under the supervision of a registered preceptor, demonstrated clinical skills, and passed the same exam that is required for certification of those who attend a MEAC accredited college (which is not available in person on island). Although a few of the MEAC accredited colleges are available online, this does not make it accessible for those who do not have steady online access (like our rural areas) and for those who are not financially supported. Requiring only the MEAC accredited pathway is causing a disproportionate hardship for people who live in Hawaii, especially women of color and people who live in underserved communities.

The Hawaii Regulatory Licensing Reform Act also states that:

"Regulation in the **form of full licensure or other restrictions** on certain professions or vocations shall be retained or adopted when the health, safety, or welfare of the consumer may be jeopardized by the nature of the service offered by the provider".

Regulation of the birth attendant through use of "other restrictions" other than licensure is found in the requirements set forth in HRS 457J (6)-5, which outlines informed consent disclosure forms and very specific conditions under which the birth attendants are allowed to practice. These restrictions on the birth attendant has allowed the community to still have access to culturally appropriate care and still have a choice when it comes to their reproductive rights. Ultimately, the health, safety and welfare of the consumer is protected through the regulations set forth in HRS 457J(6)-5.

We are open to exploring any amendments that may allow the community to continue to access culturally appropriate care provided by the (1) birth attendant and (2) the CPM who has obtained certification through the educational route of entry through the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP).

The Pacific Birth Collective strongly supports HB995 and we urge you to pass this important piece of legislation.

PBC serves women, families, and birth and wellness service providers throughout Hawaii. We support autonomy in birth choice, whatever that choice may be. We support this resolution because as a birth organization working throughout the Hawaiian islands, we personally know the positive impact our traditional midwives have on maternal health in our communities. This resolution is a good step toward respecting cultural traditions, protecting the autonomy of women and families, and not policing women's reproductive choices.

Access to midwifery care improves health outcomes and safety for all birthing people and their children. We support the continuation of the Birth Attendant exemption and the addition of the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP), certified by the National Association of Registered Midwives (NARM) to be included in HRS 457-J. These exemptions allow for the profession of Midwifery to continue to grow in equitable ways, allowing accessibility, diversity, and cultural and religious freedom for Hawai'i.

After July 2023, the temporary exemption is set to expire, criminalizing midwifery practitioners who are filling a vital need in our communities. The perpetuation of community-based apprenticeship for the training of midwives is essential for safety and equitable access to midwifery care for all people, especially Black, Indigenous, and Women of Color families today and for future generations.

Please support Birth Attendant Exemption and the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP) for Hawai'i. Maintain a pathway for local people to learn traditional practices of health and healing from elders in their own communities.

We do recognize that midwifery licensure was a positive step toward better maternity care for Hawai'i's families. Though there were good intentions behind the law, the exclusion of traditional midwives is rooted in historical injustices that cannot go unrecognized and unremedied. For too long, Native Hawaiian and other cultural traditions and practices have been controlled, dismissed, and lost to history.

Families in Hawaii always have and will continue to seek out prenatal, birth and postpartum support from traditional midwives as they have for many generations. To take that choice away from them is oppressive and infantilizing.

Hawai'i's women deserve autonomy in their choice of childbirth provider. Choosing where and with whom to give birth is a basic human right. Families in Hawai'i have always sought the care of traditional midwives, and it is essential that they are able to continue doing so. Continuing to regulate women's reproductive health by limiting their choices in prenatal and birth care is not safe, because women will continue to access these services even if it is not legal or recognized by the state of Hawaii.

Many women in Hawai'i seek care outside of the medical setting for childbirth. Reasons are many, but some cite safety. Maternal health outcomes in Hawai'i are on par with American maternal health outcomes, which is to say they are not good. Cesarean rates in Hawai'i are 26.8%, with one out of ten babies being born preterm. The WHO reports that 1 in 6 women in the US experience mistreatment during childbirth, and their findings suggest that mistreatment is experienced more frequently by women of color, when birth occurs in hospitals, and among those with social, economic or health challenges. Another survey of over 2,000 doulas, nurses, and childbirth educators found that almost 90% had witnessed a healthcare provider

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conducting procedures "without giving a woman a choice or time to consider," and nearly 60% had observed providers performing procedures "explicitly against the wishes of the woman." Numerous studies show that women, particularly women of color, are less likely to have their medical concerns taken seriously by doctors.

We respectfully ask that you pass HB995 for all of these reasons.

Aloha Kākou,

Ho'opae Pono Peace Project is a cultural peace resource focused on building cooperative solutions in the context of Aloha 'Āina, human rights, and genuine perpetuation of Indigenous well-being and cultural continuity.

We support HB 955. It is imperative that the risk to mothers and babies created by the looming termination of legal traditional practice on July 1, 2023 be addressed. While far from a complete solution to the problems in the current law, this measure is an important step toward setting this matter right, and preventing a disaster resulting from sudden criminalization of many of the best clinically trained midwives in Hawai'i. HB 955 is an absolute minimum protection for many birthing families to avoid being forced into underground or unassisted birth scenarios unprepared.

Please note that other problematic aspects of Act 32 need to be addressed as well; if this measure cannot be amended to protect deeply traditional practitioners, including extended family and culture bearers without realistic access to required forms or procedures, then this will need to be done in the future, as it is a serious matter of racial and cultural injustice for which the current law holds no effective mitigation.

Traditional midwives are keepers of some of the oldest and deepest aspects of ancient cultural and spiritual practice. These practices need protection, not persecution, and should be exempted outright. While HB 955 does not achieve this, it at least provides protection to clinically trained midwives who meet PEP standards, so that many families will not lose access to birth support entirely. This is important.

Birthing practices are one of the oldest women's rights issues in history, all over the world. Excessive regulation of midwives has historically been linked to misogyny, racism, violent persecution, forced assimilation and Indigenous extermination, largely in the name of safety and modernization. This history must be turned.

While it does not rectify many of the problematic aspects of Act 32, HB 955 at least helps many who would otherwise be harmed by its effects. For these reasons and more, Hoʻopae Pono Peace Project asks that this measure be passed by this committee.

We are available as a peace resource for continued dialogue in the building of genuine understanding based on true respect, peace, and pono. Please contact me at any time.

Aloha,

I would like to introduce myself, my name is Mariah Strong. I was born and raised with my seven brothers and sisters in Pauwela, Maui. I have two daughters, born safely at home with traditional midwives. I am a senior midwifery student that is working towards getting my CPM (Certified Professional Midwife) license. I am one of the founders of Pacific Birth Collective (PBC) nonprofit, and a current board member. For nearly a decade PBC has focused on advocacy, education and support in the birth community, serving the entire state of Hawai'i.

I support SB1047 and HB955 RELATING TO CHAPTER 457J, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES; Supporting the PEP (Portfolio evaluation) process as a licensing option as well as the continuation of legal access to traditional birth attendants, therefore upholding female reproductive choice and cultural representation in health care for Hawai'i for generations to come.

My mother has been a traditional birth attendant on Maui for 4 decades. She has helped hundreds of 'ohanas welcome their children safely. I always knew I would follow the same work as my mother and aunties. I've witnessed the huge need in all areas of our island for birth workers, and how much our community requests and honors their care and service.

I have first hand experience as a Hawai'i resident trying to get a CPM license on the island and know how impossible it is. Due to this, I have had to make the heartbreaking decision to move off island to continue with my education. With intentions of returning and continuing to serve our birthing community. I have actively been working on obtaining this westernized midwifery license for a decade now. These programs are not short term, they take many years to complete. I have driven thousands of miles, been away from my young children for weeks on end, and spent many thousands of dollars to continue my education out of state. These are privileges that many are not afforded and therefore do not have access to this education pathway. We must support midwifery advancement in Hawai'i, and address these barriers to licensure, especially for native and BIPOC people, not create more.

There is NOT an accessible midwifery training path in Maui, or in the state of Hawai'i, to obtain a CPM license. I can personally attest to the fact that by training with midwives in the mainland they have no understanding of our values and lifestyle on the islands. They don't know how to care, support and honor our people and their beliefs. When I graduate, I will need to actively

forget this westernized programming I've spent years attaining for testing, to appropriately care for our unique community.

There are solutions being presented to address this oversight, one being the "Sovereign's Law" SB1047, allowing traditional birth attendants to continued to legally serve our community after July 1, 2023 and the recognizing of the PEP process. Maternal health and midwifery care are connected, and have been for thousands of years, home birth attendants an integral part of our community wellness. The future of midwifery in Hawai'i deserves proper attention and care to protect our unique way of life, traditions and most importantly, our people. Please hear our voice.

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to this draft legislation regarding the Bill. The executive board of the Hawai'i Affiliate of the American College of Nurse Midwives (HAA, ACNM) has reviewed A BILL FOR AN ACT. In 2019, HAA provided testimony relating to the licensure of midwives and is attaching that with supporting documents. HAA is not in support of this bill, as it stands.

Regarding Section 1 (page 4 line 3) HB 955 states its purpose:

"(1) Permit persons acting as birth attendants after July 1st, 2023, to practice midwifery without a license: and (2) Include the North American Registry of Midwives portfolio evaluation process as proof of a successful completion of a formal midwifery education and training program for certified professional midwives (CPM)."

The HAA executive board seeks to point out that although this is the stated purpose of A BILL FOR AN ACT there is mention of certified nurse-midwives (CNM) and certified midwives (CM) within this draft of legislation regarding the Bill:

In the **Exemptions** of Section 3 (page 5 line 11), CNMs are mentioned regarding practice without a license. In the State of Hawai'i all CNMs who practice must be licensed and are currently regulated by the Board of Nursing (BON).

HAA moves for removal of CNM mentioned in this bill.

Under the **Application for license as a midwife** of Section 4 (page 8 line 12) CMs are mentioned regarding obtaining license under this chapter. HAA seeks to reiterate that CMs are distinct from CPMs and Traditional birth attendants in their certifications and scope of practice. As stated in the previous HAA testimony of 2019, midwifery as practiced by CNMs and CMs is defined by American College of Nurse-Midwives (ACNM). These midwives are educated in programs accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Midwifery Education (ACME) and must pass a national certification exam administered by the American Midwifery Certification Board (AMCB).

HAA moves for further debate regarding statues of SB 1033 to address the distinctions of CNM, CM, CPM, and Traditional Birth Attendants.

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to this draft legislation regarding the Bill. The executive board of Hawai'i Affiliate of the American College of Nurse Midwives (HAA, ACNM) has reviewed the Bill for an Act. The HAA board recently invited HAA members to provide feedback as well. A summation of comments from the HAA board and members is as follows:

For the protection and safety of childbearing women, newborns and families, we support licensure of Certified Professional Midwives (CPMs) and Certified Midwives (CMs). We also support a woman's right to choose her place of birth and access to birth providers.

The bill is entitled "a bill for an act relating to the licensure of MIDWIVES". MIDWIVES is a generic term that applies to different types of midwives with different education, training, and scope of practice. CNMs (certified nurse midwives) are midwives as well who are already licensed by the Hawaii State Board of Nursing (as the proposed bill states), so this bill does not apply to ALL "midwives" and should be clearly written in the title: a bill for an act relating to the licensure of certified midwives (CMs) and certified professional midwives (CPMs).

The current proposed bill would be more clearly described if there were two distinct sections; one for CMs and one for CPMs. The definition, education, certification, scope of practice, location of practice, continuing education, prescriptive authority, and authority to use legend drugs are not the same for CMs versus CPMs. Therefore if CMs and CPMs must be in the same bill in order to attain licensing in the State of Hawaii, we recommend dividing the bill into two sections that specifically focus only, wholly and completely on definition, education, certification, scope of practice, location of practice, continuing education, prescriptive authority related to CMs, followed by a section that addresses definition, education, certification, scope of practice, location of practice, continuing education, and authority to use legend drugs as it relates to CPMs. We support CM legislation that includes scope of practice compliant with ACNM (Definition of Midwifery and Scope of Practice of CNMs and CMs) and we support CPM legislation that includes scope of practice compliant with US MERA (United States Midwifery Education, Regulation, and Association) agreements.

# International Confederation of Midwives' Definition of MIDWIFE

While the profession of midwifery has developed differently in each country, we share a common understanding of the midwife internationally. The International Confederation of Midwives' definition is:

The midwife is recognized as a responsible and accountable professional who works in partnership with women to give the necessary support, care and advice during pregnancy, labor, and the postpartum period, to conduct births on the midwife's own responsibility and to provide care for the newborn and the infant. This care includes preventative measures, the promotion of normal birth, the detection of complications in mother and child, the accessing of medical care or other appropriate assistance and the carrying out of emergency measures. The midwife has an important task in health counseling and education, not only for the woman, but also within the family and the community. This work should involve antenatal education and preparation for parenthood and may extend to women's health, sexual or reproductive health and childcare. A midwife may practice in any setting including the home, community, hospitals, clinics, or health units.

Group Testimony in Opposition of HB 955 RELATING TO CHAPTER 457J, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

`Ahahui o Na Kauka is an organization of Native Hawaiian physicians dedicated the health of the people of Hawai`i. We recognize that there is mistrust among Native Hawaiian and other indigenous communities towards western medicine. There is still much western medicine can learn from traditional practices to improve the health of our *mākuahine* and *keiki* (mothers and babies), as physicians have moved away from outdated practices such as

immediate umbilical cord severance or separation of mothers and babies after birth and have made traditional practices such as skin to skin bonding between mother and infants immediately after birth now the standard of medical care. Such practices can co-exist with life-saving standards of care in modern medicine, particular in the early recognition of complications during pregnancy, labor or neonatal care where timely referral to advanced medical care services can prevent permanent disability or death.

A recently published study in 2022 based on data from the state of Hawaii and the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at Kapiolani Medical Center for Women and Children demonstrated that infants with hypoxic brain injury were three times more likely to have had a planned home birth in Hawai'i. <a href="https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/35037395/">https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/35037395/</a>. Our mākuahine (mothers) in Hawai'i have the right to decide where to give birth and with whom as their birth attendants. They have the right to seek Reproductive Justice, defined as the human right to personal bodily autonomy and have children in a safe community. This proposed bill seeking to allow any person to practice midwifery without a license completely undermines the Hawaii midwife licensure law's intent to ensure that home birth occurs as safely as possible with appropriately licensed and skilled providers and thus undermines the ability of wāhine (women) to seek Reproductive Justice. While there already is a provision in the original bill that exempt Native Hawaiian healing practices, this proposed bill seeks blanket exemption to allow any lay-person midwife to manage a woman's pregnancy, labor and newborn birth regardless of their education/training/skills.

While creating pathways through which individuals may obtain licensure is necessary, more information is needed to determine whether including the North American Registry of Midwives portfolio evaluation process as proof of successful completion of a formal midwifery education and training program is sufficient. Additionally, more information is needed regarding whether the supervisors of the portfolio activities would include currently unlicensed birth attendants and whether they would be able to effectively provide appropriate supervision and apprenticeship to midwifery trainees in Hawaii.

Rejection of HB 955 will ensure that *wāhine* (women) who choose to have a home birth will be attended by competently skilled providers with the *'ike* (knowledge) to both embrace traditional cultural values and advanced medical interventions when needed to achieve *Mauli Oli* (optimal health balance of spiritual, physical, mental and social wellbeing).

Position: OPPOSE

The Hawai'i Section of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (HI ACOG) represents more than 200 obstetrician/gynecologist physicians in our state, and we oppose HB 955. This bill would create an exemption to the midwife licensure law that was recently passed by this legislature.

We support every birthing person's right to make informed decisions about their pregnancy and delivery. We believe that people should be informed that several factors are critical to reducing maternal and perinatal mortality and achieving favorable community birth outcomes. These factors include appropriately identifying circumstances that may make community birth riskier for either mom or baby; the availability of a midwife whose education and licensure meet International Confederation of Midwives' (ICM) Global Standards for Midwifery Education, or a physician practicing obstetrics within an integrated and regulated health system; ready access to consultation; and access to safe and timely transport to a hospital.

We also acknowledge the critical importance of protecting and preserving indigenous traditions and birthing practices. The current midwife licensure law already has an exemption for practitioners of Native Hawaiian birth practices.

The majority of births occur without major complications, whether they occurred in the hospital or out of the hospital. However, we do know that complications occur. It is critical that when they occur, the providers attending the birth are trained and competent to recognize it. In a recently published study in the <u>Journal of Midwifery and Women's Health</u>,1 investigators looked at records from the neonatal intensive care unit at Kapi'olani Medical Center of newborns who had been admitted for hypoxic ischemic encephalopathy – a brain injury that occurs during the birth process – and compared them to Hawai'i statewide birth data. The newborns in the neonatal ICU with this brain injury were three times more likely to have been planned home births compared to the normal neonates. This emphasizes that complications during birth occur, and it is critical to have trained, licensed healthcare providers capable of recognizing and managing these complications wherever that birth is occurring.

We understand and appreciate the important role of midwives, as defined by the midwife licensure law, in healthcare delivery, especially to rural and underserved areas of Hawai'i. We were pleased that the Hawai'i State Legislature recognized the importance of midwives, and the rigorous training they have undertaken and expertise they hold, by granting them the opportunity to be licensed health care professionals. Licensure of midwives was critical to making community (or out of hospital) births in Hawai'i safer. Licensure of midwives was also important for future efforts at promoting a more integrated maternal health care system, similar to those seen in western Europe where maternal and neonatal outcomes exceed those in the U.S.

'Sovereign law' HB 955 is in alignment with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and The United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous People. UNDRIP Articles 3; 4; 8-1; 11-1; 12-1; 20-1; 23: 24-1 run alongside the PEP process for Certified professional Midwifery education routes and Traditional Midwifery here in Hawai'i. The Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination; Articles 1-1; 2-c,e; 4-c; 5-e, iv, v, vi; 7 must be acknowledged. Sovereigns Law exemptions in HRS 457-J are at baseline what we need to protect Traditional Midwifery practices in Hawaii.

As we sit here debating about the less than 10% Midwifery workforce, the domination 90% Obstetrical monopoly continues to harm, neglect, and disrupt the majority of Birthing people. Currently, America is the most dangerous industrialized nation to give birth in with 60%-80% unnecessary deaths (ACOG Data), with the least amount of accessible Midwifery care.

Why would we uphold these horrific statistics for Maternal health care providers in Hawai'i. Versus the humanitarian Hawaiian Kingdom, birth was a normalized sacred process along side of exceptional Collaborative Prenatal, and Postnatal care. We can see with Kukaniloko, cosmology of Haloa, wellness protocols of Haumea, Kapi'olani Maternity home, and much more Hawai'i has always been invested in Maternal and Infant health. American laws outlawing of Cultural practitioners from the past have had devastating long term effects. Hawai'i and Midwives have always been about the collaborative well being of the future and safety. Midwives from the Bible have stood for life respecting autonomy with cultural birth practices over a system of death and. "Then the king of Egypt spoke to the Hebrew midwives, one of whom was named Shiprah, and the other was named Puah; and he said, 'When you are helping the Hebrew woman to give birth and see them upon the birth stool, if it is a son, then you shall put him to death; but if it is a daughter, then she shall live.' But the midwives feared God, and did not do as the king of Egypt had commanded them, but let the boys live. So king of Egypt called for the midwives, and said to them, 'Why have you done this thing, and let the boys live?' And the midwives said to Pharaoh, 'Because the Hebrew woman are not as the Egyptian women; for they are vigorous, and they give birth before the midwife can get to them.' So God was good to the midwives, and the people multiplied, and became very mighty. And it came about because the midwives feared God, that He established households for them." Midwifery will never disappear regardless of the laws or consent to death sentences commanded of the 'Pharaohs'. HRS 457-J with out exemptions in HB 955 will uphold the command of death based on race and culture while removing competent Midwives that choose pathways out side of oppressive domination.

The data shows globally when Obstetrics is used for emergency care and Midwives are used as standard of care; there are much better outcomes for the families and the Maternal Health workforce. As long as surgeons (Obstetrical) are the baseline care for Healthy pregnancy people the morality and morbidity will never shift. As long as White suprematist domination of inaccessible and biased education is the standard we will continue to harm current and future Midwives. The Medical model data shows the continued rise of Maternal Mortality and Morbidity, often in a spectrum based on race, routinely neglects pregnant people and infants. Quoted from White Coats for Black Lives, "Health justice means being committed to dismantling medical racism and exploitation both within and outside of constructed national borders, transferring stolen power back to our patients and communities, crediting and compensating healers for their knowledge, and prioritizing the knowledge and perspectives of patients and their communities in the understanding of health and delivery of healthcare." Hawai'i must remain dedicated to anti-racism, true health care, and honoring the rich variations of brilliance from culturally congruent practitioners. Tradtional Midwives and Birth Attendants are cornerstones to healthy society. Midwifery criminalization is not the answer!

I hold the stance that Community Midwifery led Maternal Health care is a cradle of support encouraging experts in their fields, including families, while facilitating best outcomes. I ask for your support in shifting the Maternal health crisis by amplifying Midwifery accessibility. A Diverse unified Maternal Health Care system must include Midwives, in all forms, as experts of Birthing peoples healthcare. The cornerstone of humanity is the continuation of birthing practices. Community led collaborative care has been the standard of care for most Human existence. Can we return to an equitable system placing the family first with experts focused on their gifts? Or, will systematic racism, greed, and violence continue to dominate in Industrialized

birthing spaces? The continued division of care providers, a colonized model, keeps women at high risk. The exemptions of HB 955 protect traditional Birth attendants alongside the Portfolio Evaluation Process that allows a person to sit for the national accredited test to become a Certified Professional Midwife. Pregnancy is not a sickness. Women's bodies are not a problem. Babies deserve to be born in to safe respectful spaces. We are all affected by the Maternal health of our society. Reproductive health care starts in the womb and the right to choose, how, where, if, and with whom someone chooses to grow their family. Please support HB955 and carry it through all bill passing into law.

Aloha Chair Belatti and committee members,

My name is Lantana Hoke. I was born and raised on Maui, and I am an educator at the University of Hawaii Maui College, an employee at Pacific Birth Collective, and a home birth mother.

I am testifying today as an individual in strong support of HB955.

I recognize that midwifery licensure was a positive step with good intentions toward improving maternal health care for Hawaii's family. However, HRS 457J does not account for some very important considerations. This bill addresses two major holes in that law and is a win-win solution.

The first positive aspect of this bill is respecting reproductive choice. Through my work with PBC, I have counseled many women through making choices about their care. Many of them do not want to go to the hospital for very valid reasons. The WHO reports that 1 in 6 American women experience mistreatment during childbirth, and their findings show that that mistreatment is experienced more frequently by women of color, when birth occurs in hospitals, and among those with social, economic or health challenges. There's also a really high c-section rate, and a growing maternal health care crisis in America largely driven by for-profit, non-evidence based institutions. I have worked with many women who refuse to go back to the hospital after a traumatic experience. We already have too few midwives to meet the demand from the community. I have worked with women who have struggled with the choice to give birth at home, alone, with no attendant, because they are so scared of the hospital and they could not find a midwife. When confronted with this reality, it is very clear that we don't want to further reduce choices and force pregnant women into such difficult situations.

Families in Hawaii always have and will continue to seek out prenatal, birth and postpartum support from traditional midwives as they have for many generations. To take that choice away from them is oppressive and infantilizing, and in fact, impossible. Women will continue to seek this care no matter what the law says. To not include these measures will put traditional midwives in a very difficult ethical position as they try to serve those who need them. It may also cause complications with hospital transfers. There have been no problems with traditional midwives over the last few years and decades.

The second win is by providing a reasonable path toward licensure for traditional midwives. As others have testified, the current restrictive pathway does not account for the geographical restrictions we encounter in Hawaii. To go to midwifery school on the mainland is expensive and out of reach for many practicing traditional midwives, many of whom have been learning and working for decades via the apprenticeship model. The current pathway toward licensure excludes many women, especially women of color, who provide important care to their communities. The Portfolio Evaluation Process is a nationally approved educational route, and is a reasonable and attainable pathway to licensure.

At a time when much of America is whittling away at women's reproductive freedom, we have a real opportunity to be a part of protecting the most vulnerable women and children in our population. Midwives will play a major role in addressing the dire maternal health care crisis in America, and we should do everything we can to increase the number of midwives in our communities.

#### **Honorable House Health Comittee**

Thank you for taking the time to consider this important piece of legislation.

Act 32 aimed to license two types of midwives to provide services to families and also states, "This Act also exempts a separate category of birth attendants for a three-year period, to allow this community to define themselves and develop common standards, accountability measures, and disclosure requirements. By the end of the three year period, the legislature intends to enact statutes that will incorporate all birth practitioners and allow them to practice to the fullest extent under the law". Midwives across the state, the DCCA, HHA, DOH, and ACOG all went through the motions to collect data, the disclosure form was crafted and released to the public, and standards and accountability measures were discussed and solutions were drafted to address these concerns. Act 32 was presented to the legislation under false pretenses that our community was in direct danger by being supported by midwives in home births. The Hawai'i home birth task force proved these allegations were incorrect in 2019. In 2020, 2021, and 2022, there have been 3 bills presented to the legislation in order to finalize the legality of the "separate category of birth attendants" and make good on the promise that was written into Act 32.

The bills being presented this year (HB955 and her sister bill SB1047) are the work of years of conversation and compromise amongst local community members, government departments, and national organizations. They are reasonable and have working precedent in other states. If the intention of Act 32 is in the name of safety for our community members, then transparency and freedom of choice allows honest conversations to flow between caretakers should the need arise. These sister bills aim to build that bridge. Hawai'i residents have experienced and know there are more choices than what Act 32 presents and they want those choices LEGALLY protected. There are thousands of pages spanning nearly a decade offering support for legalizing the many choices midwives and "birth attendants" have to offer. Legally acknowledging and protecting the diversity around reproductive choice is basic human rights. It is the elected official's duty to serve their constituents and uphold their freedoms.

Thank you for your respecting ALL your constituents, even the minority.

I am writing in regard to HB955 and I STRONGLY SUPPORT this bill. Midwifery needs to be preserved and available to all Hawaii families! There is heaps of evidence that prove home births are very safe. As a mother, you should have the right to choose how your baby enters the world.

There have been numerous studies conducted over the past 40 years to compare the safety of homebirth as compared to hospital birth. The consensus from the research shows that homebirth is as safe or safer than hospital birth for low-risk women with a skilled birth attendant - a midwife.

One such study conducted by Lewis Mehl compared the birth outcomes of 2,092 women. His results showed that the incidence of interventions such as forceps, manual placental traction, episiotomy, laceration, and birth injuries was significantly higher for a hospital birth than for a home birth.

This is an extremely valid reason that we should preserve midwifery.

I felt loved and cared for. I share this in vulnerability to show the deep understanding and trust my support team had for me, my baby, and the family they were caring for.

I was listened to and respected as a birthing woman.

I had the freedom to make choices without being pressured into unnecessary interventions.

I never felt pressure to birth at a certain hour or time. My baby would come when she was supposed to be here. I was confident in this and so was my support team.

I had the opportunity to move freely, as well as take advantage of multiple spaces in my home. I also ate and drank as I pleased. This comfortability allowed me to relax, open up and deliver my baby in an environment that was familiar + safe.

When birthing at home, a woman is legally entitled to have whomever she wishes at her birth. (This was not the case for me in a hospital in 2020 mid-pandemic.)

Once I gave birth; I was honored hours of uninterrupted skin-to-skin. There was no need to cut the umbilical cord, weigh or measure her, all that could wait.

The aftercare my baby received from my midwives resonated with how I wanted my child to be treated. This may be controversial, but my daughter is a healthy two-year-old who has never once visited a doctor's office + has had no need to.

Cozying up in my bed with my husband and baby after hours of exhausting labor was the most ideal situation I could imagine.

I truly believe my success as a mother has been based on how I brought my baby in to the world. I support this bill with my whole heart. Please!

## Aloha mai Kakou,

My name is Ki'inaniokalani Kaho'ohanohano and I am in strong support of HB955, which will protect pathways and cultural and religious traditions in birthing practices in Hawai'i. I have been serving Maui as a cultural practitioner of lomi lomi, la'au lapa'au, ho'oponopono, for over twenty years. It is this work which brought me to birth work and the opportunity to apprentice as a pale keiki. I have had multiple sources and Kumu, and learned by doing, the way of our kūpuna. I apprenticed and assisted one of my mentors Tina Garzero, "Maui's county's women of excellence award winner", for over 10 years until her passing. I have since continued to hold the torch, and provide full spectrum of care to women and families in Maui County. My many mentors continue through the years to support my growth and learning. This is not a job, and I don't often even get paid much. It is my kuleana... I work by donation and work often with underserved rural and often low income families. I offer free prenatal clinics from Honokohau to East Maui, birth education classes, nutritional support and more. Our approach is based on preventive and proactive care, and we expect full accountability and integrity from our families, as they do from us. We spend hours in preparing and educating our families.

The education required by the current law doesn't exist in our state, is very expensive, and requires preceptors which Hawai'i does not have. Quite honestly, medical midwifery is a model that contradicts everything I am. The 'Ike that has been passed down to me is rare, almost to erasure, and these practices are what heal women of all backgrounds, because we all are human first. We all need to regain our cultural traditions that will heal us, and to receive the care we deserve in our most vulnerable times. When folks ask me to attend their births, they choose me because of my mindset and approach to their heightened state of wellness, pregnancy. They choose me for the training and dedication I DO have, which is based in traditional and cultural practices. I know we have become other people's children in Hawai'i and beyond, adopting new traditions and practices, and for some that is okay. For some it is not. All birthing families should have bodily autonomy and medical freedom in the most sacred rite of passage, giving birth! We were born, created as wahine to procreate, hanau...It is proven that cultural competency improves health disparities, especially in the birth process, and we fill that gap. It is shown clearly in countries where midwives/birth attendants are abundant, there are less disparities. Where as the US has the highest disparities of all "civilized" nations, with very little midwives/birth attendants. Modern medicalized birth is not anymore safe, it's quite the contrary, causing terrible harm in too many cases attempting to control a natural process. If that's where someone feels safe, that's where they should be! But the bottom line is they already have that choice. We deserve to have a choice too Terrifying statistics just released state that most maternal deaths could have been avoided in hospitals, and black and brown bodies have the highest disparities.

I am a mother of five homebirth babies, and have been able through my own births, to heal generations of trauma. My keiki were born, gently into this world on the lands that their kūpuna were once born...prepared, held, and guided by traditional midwives each time. If you have never attended birth at home, you can't even imagine how beautiful it can be

For the past 3 years we have practiced under the current traditional birth attendant exemption, and been busier than ever since Covid! My transfer rate was less than 5%, never in emergency. When in prenatal process I discover that for whatever reason the birth is not low risk, I transfer care of mamas, but never leave their side. We care very much for our families which become like 'Ohana to us. This is what is missing in modern medicine, relationships. I have 'ohana that I have helped with all their babies, and in July 2023, if this legislation sb1047/hb955 (2023) does not pass, it will prevent them from having me, and prevent me from helping them, even though they choose me for future births. I have had multiple apprentice for years, and this will also eliminate this pathway, and our ability to share with future generations.

There are so few traditional birth attendants left, due to intentional erasure of cultural practices. Let us learn from the task force report, the report to the governor, the United Nation's recommendations, and all the very important sources that show that traditional birth attendants improve health and wellness of birthing families. Please don't let this exemption be taken away from all of us. My keiki are begging you....especially my Wailua girl who hopes to be a traditional birth attendant one day like her mama

My name is Rethabile Molapo and I wish to express my support for traditional midwifery practices in Hawaii as well as the expansion of the qualifications for midwifery licensure. As an aspiring midwifery student of color, I have witnessed and am currently experiencing westernized licensing requirements unfairly impact communities of color and limit the options available to birthing people. I am acutely aware of the challenges faced by aspiring midwives in the state, particularly in terms of access to education and certification.

One major barrier to becoming a licensed midwife in Hawaii is the lack of Midwifery Education Accreditation Council (MEAC) accredited schools in the state. There are no options available. This makes it difficult for midwifery students in Hawaii to obtain the certification they need to practice. However, I believe that the inclusion of the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP) pathway in the licensure process would help rectify this scenario and provide a more accessible route for midwifery students in Hawaii to become certified professional midwives (CPMs). As it stands, only CPM candidates who have taken the MEAC pathway to certification are able to pursue licensure in Hawaii. This specifically limits the pool of qualified midwives available to families in the state and unfairly disadvantages aspiring midwives who may not have access to out of state MEAC-accredited schools.

I believe our collective goal is to achieve safe pregnancy and birth experiences while reducing maternal mortality and morbidity. I support making permanent the existing exemption for birth attendants to continue to practice without a license, under certain conditions.

Midwifery is not just about providing care during pregnancy and birth; it is about protecting women's health and sovereignty during these critical moments in their lives. Traditional midwives are experts in low-risk reproductive health care and provide a unique perspective and skill set that should be valued and utilized.

Preserving the practice and legal pathway of traditional midwifery is essential for future generations in Hawaii. It is imperative that traditionally-trained midwives are available to continue this important work and provide families with the care and support they need.

I support the expansion of qualifications for licensure to include the North American Registry of Midwives portfolio evaluation process. This will help ensure that the full range of knowledge and expertise held by traditional midwives is recognized and utilized in providing care to families in Hawaii.

I ask that you consider these views and take steps to include the PEP pathway in the licensure process for midwives in Hawaii and support the role of traditional midwifery. Thank you for your time and attention to this matter.

Aloha committee members,

My name is Jordan Hocker and I live on the island of Maui. I need to outline my enthusiastic support for this piece of legislation. I have 2 daughters, aged 7 and 6 months and both were born at home with a traditional midwife or birth attendant. In both cases, my midwives had obtained training and apprenticeship through hands on, community direct care, under the guidance of a teacher. In both cases, they were/are highly respected and sought after birth professionals with decades of experience serving the community. Licensure alone, doesn't make a good midwife. Some licensed midwives who fly into our communities already credentialed cause harm because they are unaware of the context and culture of our communities. A good midwife has accountability and investment to their families and overall their overall health. They are deeply aware of the need for healthy outcomes for mothers and families. For each of my births, I had a good midwife.

We know the state of birthing in the hospital system in Hawaii is deplorable for certain groups of women. Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander women are dying in the hospital system due to a lack on continuous and culturally aware care. Systemic racism and lack of deep cultural wisdom like traditional food pathways for health threaten our families. A midwife for every women is the remedy to that tragedy. We know that access to care in neighboring islands can be hard to come by. While licensure at it heart seeks to make our communities safer, the lack of accessible education pathways outlined in the current revised statute poses a large barrier to midwives lacking \$40,000+ and the ability to fly to the continent to seek the education to become licensed, then there is the barrier of a certified individual to take births under here in Hawaii, which means hands on experience has to happen outside of the community as well. The current statute falls short of meeting the need of our mothers, especially neighboring islands where families may live remotely. This bill seeks to exempt the individuals who are directly immersed in their communities, to provide a midwife for every woman and helps to ensure accessibility for rural communities. I live 30 minutes from the hospital and my last active labor was incredibly short, totaling 3 hours and 47 minutes. The first 3 hours, I slept through and woke up to realize my daughter was coming very quickly. I would have certainly given birth in the car had I tried to make it to a hospital, luckily my midwife lived 15 minutes down the highway.

As the great great great great granddaughter of Louisa Painter, a traditional midwife who served early American settlers in the plains of Kansas, I implore you to pass HB955 out of this committee so that this legislation makes it closer to allowing our communities to be served by

the dedicated and qualified individuals. I implore you to protect the health of all women and mothers, but specifically those who have been classically underserved and harmed by conventional options. The strength and foundation of our lives hangs in the balance with this bill, please serve us by passing this out of committee.

Hello, my name is Surya Nguyen Tybuszewski and I am 9 years old. My mom is a naturopathic doctor but she is also a traditional Midwife. She has taught me at a very young age that it is important to have the phrase "my body my choice" in your mind. My body my choice means you are in charge of your own body, not the government. I want you to have that phrase in your mind too. Thank you for your time, attention and consideration. I support HB955 and so should you. Have a nice day! And thank you once more.

In January of 2022 I gave birth. My son came after two years of trying to conceive and one miscarriage. My husband and I were following the model of most before us, assuming the medical community would guide us through an enriching pregnancy journey.

The very negative experience I had with a miscarriage in 2020 led me to leave the gynecologist I'd been with for twelve years and seek out new support in my fertility journey. I joined a practice at Kapiolani and was once again met with a cold, sterile environment where I was shuffled from seat to seat with no connection or feeling of wellness. I would sweat, shake and freeze up at every appointment and I knew from my first check up with baby that this team was not aligned with my health needs. I have always felt a deep connection to homeopathy, nature and relate to more indigenous practices regarding medicine. I had to break from the system my insurance provided and seek out alternative options.

I dove deeper in researching birth and quickly learned it is quite natural to birth in your home environment and that medical admittance only became relevant when male doctors realized they could commoditize the experience using fear tactics. I highly recommend delving into the disturbing history behind gynecology and modern maternal care.

Women have handed over the most magical power in living beings, the ability to birth independently; allowing the medical community to litter the most perfect portrayal of a miracle with interventions based on unsupported myths and unthinkable practices driven by greed, and allowed by an absolutely clueless population.

I made the choice that a birth modeled after native practices, guided by a CPM and mid-wife students, in my home, was the safest and most ideal way to meet my son.

On a Sunday in January, at 42 weeks pregnant, after managing contractions for 6 hours at home alone with my husband, my midwives arrived at my home and gently encouraged my child to greet his mother.

My birth team created the most amazing experience for us without even being noticed. My husband literally pulled my son from my body that day, not just cutting the cord, but holding the most precious life in his hands as he took his first breaths of existence. My husband coached me through delivering my baby in my bedroom, and it was the most natural thing you could have ever witnessed. I felt so connected to God in that experience and it has not left my body since.

After only five months of gently monitoring my health and progression I welcomed these women into my home. I felt their love, their warmth, their innate passion for welcoming existence, a feeling that unfortunately, hospitals have no time for. I felt their strength as educators, practitioners, mothers, and I inherently became my own - creator, deliverer of life- a mother.

On that day I experienced the most empowering euphoria. Without home birth options, without native practitioners, I would have been robbed of that God Given Right that all womb bearers were gifted. Women have the right to know there are other options.

Home birth, mid-wife supported birth, unsupported birth, they are all exceptional ways to birth. It is for the creator of life and the new life within to decide how, when and where they will meet.

BIRTHING is none of the state's business.

Aloha honorable Representative Bellati and committee members,

Thank you so much for scheduling a hearing for this bill.

### I am in strong support of SB955 and urge you to pass this bill as is.

I have lived here since I was 10 years old. I'm a licensed midwife currently serving the island of Oahu. I did the majority of my training on Oahu starting in 2017 and opened my own practice about 1.5 years ago. Here are my insights from my experience as the "boots on the ground" in the home birth community.

There are currently <u>28 licensed midwives in the entire state</u>. There are <u>only 2 licensed midwives on Oahu that are actively attending home births</u>. Some licensed midwives don't even live here, and some of those only got their license here in order to be preceptors for students who do live here. So not all licensed midwives are actively attending home births, and some don't live in Hawai'i. I offer this information to contextualize the reality of what "28" licensed midwives actually looks like right now. <u>At least 3 of my colleagues will no longer be able to continue practicing on Oahu if the TBA exemption expiration date is not lifted.</u> One of these is my teacher. She taught me how to become a midwife - yet she herself will no longer be allowed to practice?

### There are two components to this bill.

- 1- Accept the Portfolio Evaluation Process as a valid pathway for CPM's to access licensure. This makes sense because the North American Registry of Midwives (NARM) supports this pathway. NARM is the national certifying agency for midwives. Its standards are what Hawai'i licensure has been based on. Yet, even though NARM certifies midwives who have gone through a MEAC accredited school **OR** those who have gone through the PEP process, Hawai'i doesn't. Hawai'i only currently recognizes the MEAC accredited school pathway. You can read more about the PEP process on the NARM website where they clearly state PEP as one of the options for achieving the CPM credential: <a href="http://narm.org/certification-recertification/">http://narm.org/certification-recertification/</a>. Why use NARM as the standard for licensure but then pick and choose which aspects of NARM the state supports? It's an illogical discrepancy truly.
- 2- Permanently exempt Traditional Birth Attendants (TBA's). NARM is also in support of this. Preserving TBA's are a way of preserving <u>cultural birth practitioners</u> and THUS preserving culturally appropriate options

I've seen what happens in states without integration of cultural practitioners. States where MEAC accredited based CPM's are the only option. It creates a limited situation where women only have licensed midwives available to support them at home. Many women distrust these providers, and without culturally appropriate providers available, they turn to unassisted birthing.

They birth on their own without a trained/experienced attendant because they feel they have no other choice. They birth on their own not necessarily because that's their first choice but because they don't have access to their own cultural providers that they can trust. I know this because I'm part of community groups both locally and nationally where women are planning their unassisted births.

# This is a national and international contemporary phenomenon- women are running the extreme opposite way of western providers.

They're running from OB's, Certified Nurse Midwives AND Licensed midwives. Why? Because OB's and CNM's are part of a maternity system that has the worst neonatal and maternal morbidity and mortality rates out of all industrialized nations. AND those rates are increasing despite the US also being the country that spends the most amount of money on our maternity system. How do Licensed midwives fit into this? Although their outcome statistics are better, their field has become regulated by western culture and western authority. This is where the distrust from the community grows. For those whom western culture is not their own, they need access to providers of their own culture. Cultural providers who have been around for thousands of years, long before the western version of midwifery. *The MEAC accredited CPM pathway is a culture*. And it's not everyone's culture.

By supporting TBA's and the PEP pathways we can offer Hawaii's womens more options to avoid the polarized extreme situation that pushes women to choose unassisted birth out of fear. I've seen this first hand while studying in California and Texas. States with longstanding licensure. Let's learn from their experience and let's give the ohanas of Hawai'i choices.

Licensed midwives and birth attendants can coexist AND compliment each other. It's the minority that chooses to birth at home. It's the minority who chooses a midwife. It's the minority who chooses a birth attendant. Today I ask you to vote in support of minorities.

Please read the report, "Traditional Home Birth in Hawai'i," and the Report to the Governor from the Hawai'i Home Birth Task Force from 2019. These are rich in the knowledge and expertise of Hawai'i's midwifery community and the fact that midwifery and homebirth are extremely safe.

While Hawai'i attests to being a progressive, pro-choice, pro-women state, our current midwifery law goes against the fundamental rights of choice and continues the perpetuation of advantages to white settler midwives and criminalizes traditional cultural midwives. This must change.

I believe the regulation of midwifery pits 2 groups of predominantly women in honorable professions (Midwifery and Obstetrics/Gynecologists) against each other while the industrial medical complex run primarily by white men makes money off women's bodies, again. My name is Gianny Navas, and I am a student midwife here on O'ahu. I am doing an independent study program that is not MEAC accredited, and I am doing the PEP route. Like the states of Oregon, Texas, Virgina, and more, these all allow PEP students to become legally practicing midwives in their state; and the PEP route, and traditional midwives can be quite similar in how they learn. I chose the pep route not because it is "easier" or "less expensive" heck, almost all student midwives pay for additional educational programs that arent MEAC accredited anyway to go along with their clinical training. I chose the PEP route because it is the route most similar to what midwives have been since the beginning of mankind, passing down their wisdom from one generation to another; learning with their hands with guidance from a seniro midwife; learning through observation of real birth, not a class room; being able to take away an important topic from a birth, and go home to study it from every obstetrical and midiwfery textbook I have, and applying it to this real life woman, her birth, and situation that will stick with me forever. A PEP student doesn't necesarily mean they will become a traditional midwife. PEP students vary in their style of practicing midwifery - from being traditional if they learned that way, to deciding they want to be a more medical midwife. PEP students have different preceptors which varying styles, so they can have as many tools under their belt, be well-rounded, and practice the way that fits best for their birth philosphy when the time comes. This is tested in the NARM exam. Whats the difference between a MEAC graduate and a PEP student if both pass the NARM?

A traditional midwife is not a nurse-midwife, or a labor nurse, or an obstetrician. She is a homebirth midwife who practices differently than a hospital medical provider. Pregnant women choose her for a reason, not because they are ill-informed. Traditional midwives, and PEP route midwives give informed consent, because that is what they learn early on in their apprenticeship; to give women informed choices to make the best decision for them.

You can not expect a nurse-midwife to go to a naturopathic nursing school where they teach herbs, diet, exercise, and physiology, as their main form of treatment, to then practice in the hospital setting for patients who expect the medical midwifery model of care. This is the same for traditional midwives. A traditional midwife who practices one way that is expected and WANTED by a certain community, should not be forced to go to school to learn western medicine and then practice it. THIS IS THEN NO LONGER A TRADITIONAL MIDWIFE. Traditinal midwifery in Hawai'i is sacred, limited, and should be honored, and kept safe. Please keep traditional midwifery safe for our state. Please allow future generations of midwives to

practice the way their ancestors did, to serve the women who CHOSE and had this service since the beginning of time.

I have attended births with both, very medical midwives, and very traditional midwives, and they were all beautiful births, because the women wanted these midwives for a reason. Both were safe with the different methods used. Midwifery is not medicine, and it does not need to be practiced with just medicine. It never was medical, and never should be. We should not change this role and medicalize it. They have made a medical midwife... it's a CNM, so this is an option for those wanting to pursue this because THEY think it is best. But they should not eradicate the other (traditional midwife).

I would like to respectfully submit my testimony as a mother of nine who has received midwifery care for each and all of my children and birthed eight at home. The one not birthed at home was attended by a competent and experienced midwife whose care for me was so complete that she diagnosed a severe complication and followed every protocol to have me transferred to a local emergency labor and delivery unit where I received care from the attending physician. My diagnosis: prolapsed cord after dilating to nine. My midwife was fully trained and competent to attend me and, indeed, took steps to save the life of my baby.

I have used a total of six midwives during the course of my childbearing, which spanned 18 years. Each one was fully competent to care for me my during pregnancy, birth, and the postpartum period identifying and supporting NORMAL, natural physiological birth. In the case of something that falls outside of normal, midwives are trained and competent to identify this and transfer or collaborate with a higher level of care. Midwives are trained health care professionals and deserve to have legal status to practice in Hawai'i.

Women and their families deserve to have the choice of a traditional midwife to attend them for their pregnancies, births, and postpartum period up to six weeks. To deny women the right to choose their health care provider goes against everything women have been fighting for in regards to bodiy autonomy.

My midwives provides all of my prenatal and postnatal care and I can't even begin to describe what a night and day difference it was compared to my experience of prenatal care at kaiser, birth at the hospital, and the ONE post natal visit I had 6 weeks after giving birth. My midwives shared so much knowledge, guided me towards the best actions for me and my baby, and genuinely cared for my physical and mental health and well-being and well as my baby's. Their knowledge and thoroughness of care was above and beyond what I ever received from the doctors at kaiser. Midwifery is not only safe but dramatically improves the health and safety outcomes for women and their children. My midwives who attended my birth will not be able to continue to legally practice in Hawaii unless this bill goes into law and a permanent exemption is put in place.

I support the continuation of the Birth Attendant exemption and the addition of the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP), certified by the National Association of Registered Midwives (NARM) to be included in HRS 457-J as written in SB1047 and HB955. Midwife appointments will last at least an hour where doctors offices rush you in and out without ever truly listening to your needs or concerns. In addition to the advanced personal care midwife's provide giving birth at home allows the mother to be in a safe environment. Home birth lessons the exposure to harmful sicknesses that are associated with hospitals. Home birth allows the family to be involved with supporting the mother. During Covid many mothers could not even have the father in the room for support at the hospital. Home birth allows safe & supported bonding for the mother and baby. My name is Donia and I live in Hilo. I'm incredibly lucky to have birthed both of my children at home via midwife. Both of the births were beautiful and the care I received was as good as it gets. I feel very blessed to have gotten to work with the two midwives I worked with.

During my first pregnancy I ran into several challenges as a result of midwives not being able to be officially "licensed" and I assert that it would make a huge difference for birthing people if midwives could be licensed here in the state of Hawaii. From insurance coverage, to getting blood work done to obtaining a medically necessary rohgam shot, the lack of ability for my first midwife to be granted licensure personally caused me many challenges. Paying out of pocket for my two home births was not easy and was disappointing. People who avoid straining the already understaffed and overburdened Hawaii medical care system should be granted insurance coverage rather than punished with a fully out of pocket bill. Midwife licensure would allow for this. Also, the hospital in Hilo was nearly at capacity when I gave birth this past October. I was able to avoid taking a hospital bed, and occupying nurses and doctors who were needed for other patients by delivering at home. In the UK most non complicated pregnancies are done via midwife, and I can't understand why Hawaii wouldn't encourage this given the medical professional shortage on the island. Please let the care providers who are highly trained and knowledgeable focus on doing what they do best, and make it legally uncomplicated by allowing midwives to be licensed.

I also want to stress the importance of allowing traditional birth attendants to continue practicing as different cultures and different people seek different types of care. Any birthing person should be allowed to pursue the type of birth they desire as long as it is safe and basic precautions are taken. Birthing is a scared journey. Birthing people need to be given freedom of choice. Let us respect and give legal rights to and protection for the tradition of birthing that has been relied on for hundreds of years.

Ultimately I want to be clear that my two birth experiences were otherworldly and magical, due to the powerful skills of certified midwives. The gave me all the time I needed and provided calm, nurturing care putting my needs above all. Whereas, hospitals are run as a business (see the film the Business of Being Born should you have any doubts about that) and midwives carry

out their work because they are passionate about it and highly trained in it. If a birthing person does not need to deliver in a hospital and would like to work with a certified midwife or a traditional birth attendent they should have full legal rights to make that choice for themselves. Licensure would enable both midwives and birthing people to have many benefits they are currently denied under the system in place now. Make the change. Make this easier on our cherished and dedicated midwives and the families that seek to work with them.

On June 5th, 2022- Id given birth to my beautiful twins, a boy and a girl. These two were also my first kids. I never thought that I'd be able to have twins because of my tiny petite frame. Even less did I imagine I'd be having them via natural/vaginal birth. No epidural or anything. I luckily started at a good time and not in the middle of the night to bother anyone. It was one of the most beautiful days of my life weather wise somehow. And event wise of course too. I woke up at 8am to take my millionth piss of the morning, and on the way back to the bed- my water broke. I woke my husband up, who had been up all night still building and setting things up in the baby room we had created for the two. He held my hand and took me downstairs slowly, where I sat on my yoga ball to ease the pressure a little bit. While finding ways to feel a little less in pain, my husband called my doula/midwife and told her about my water breaking. While she was on the way, she stayed on the phone with me telling me about ways I could relieve pressure and how I should stand so it benefits me and helps with the dilation. After arrived, she had lots of many herbs and herbal scents prepared for a better atmosphere while being sensitive to smell still. She and my husband filled the mini pool we had built a few nights prior, with warm water and warming essential oils to make me feel more calmed. My midwife helped me into the water slowly as my husband started contacting the family friends and family members I wanted to have there during the births. From breathing techniques, to different frequencies played in the background, to slow exercises in the water- she was there every step of the way. Treating me like a mother would treat her daughter during a first birth, which was so important to me since I'd lost my parents (my mom rather recent), and I wanted someone I felt safe with, within the comfort of my home. She did everything with so much love and so much care. Every detail was just so abundant. Even postnatally. She checked in and gave tips and advice for the recovery of my body, as well as for the growth for the babies.

I strongly stand for traditional midwifery because, from experience, it was probably the best way I could've gone. Homebirths are peaceful and so much more rewarding, and having a trusted foundation between midwife and mother is just so important!

I am an apprenticeship-trained midwife and acquired my CPM credential via the PEP process in 2005. If it had not been for this educational pathway, I would not have had the financial ability to become a midwife in the underserved community where I lived. Experience is powerful education. More valuable than any book or on-line classroom. Creating financial and educational hoops which remove us from working in our communities is not the answer.

Please let traditional midwives demonstrate their skills and competency and continue the irreplaceable service they are already providing. Support safe practices by encouraging registration, collecting statistics on out-of-hospital birth outcomes, offering continuing education, and furthering integration with EMS and public health programs. We need more midwives not less! Midwives serve our community in a life-changing way and provide services that are not otherwise available to birthing families. I would like to see fewer barriers for student midwives, with the hope of creating increased access and more diverse cultural representation in midwifery care.

There are currently very few licensed midwives on Kaua'i. Further restrictions to licensure and access to homebirth will not improve outcomes for anyone. It will simply encourage illegal and dangerous practices. It is essential to the safety of mothers, birthing folks, and babies for birth attendants and midwives to feel safe when transferring care to a medical provider as necessary, without fear of legal repercussions. Outlawing traditional birth attendants will not improve safety, as families will continue to choose these providers. It will simply lead to an increasingly hostile and unsafe environment for all.

I choose to be licensed because it broadens the scope of care I can provide by ordering labs and ultrasounds, and carrying and administering life-saving medications and oxygen. I don't, however, believe it is my license that defines me as a good midwife. We are all accountable for our own decisions and actions, and directly accountable to the families we care for. I do not believe that all licensed midwives are safe or skilled, or that unlicensed midwives are not. I was able to practice my traditional ceremonial practices at home that the hospital setting regulates. The ease and grace that I was able to birth in allowed me to have a healthy mind set moving forward through the postpartum period in which I was looked after by a practioner through 6 weeks. This lessened any chance of postpartum depression or any difficulties after birth. I have seen how home birth has changed the manor or my children as they grow up knowing they did not come into this world with any sort of traumas. I chose a traditional birth attendant to support me as many of the ones practicing here in Hawaii already are very knowledgeable and have specialized in the practice of birth. I felt safe and comfortable with my attendant. Having more options of midwives to choose from is imperative. Many women, like myself are terrified to give birth in the hospital as it is too chaotic, too many people, lack of respect for mother's choices in the birth space, limited options. I am also a doula and hope to be a midwife in training soon. I will hope to train under a traditional birth attendant that has specialized in the trade and gained education from experience and not just from one class or certification. There is much to learn from traditional practioners and we cannot lose this type of education and practice.

In hospitals there is no guarantee chance that birthing in the hospital is safer. many indigenous and black women feel quite unsafe in hospitals which leads to an already uneasy birthing experience. The government has no place in our traditional practices of medicine and ceremony. Birth is ceremonial. Birth is a right of passage. Birth belongs to women. Period.

I am in STRONG support of this bill.

As a doula, medical massage provider, and woman in this state, I have seen the importance of choice in birthing care.

Many women prefer to birth in the comfort of home and with a provider trained with cultural sensitivity and respect for traditions, the family system, and non invasive methods. There are countless studies on the benefits of traditional midwifery and homebirth, that I have no doubt will be presented to you.

One of the greatest benefits is the in depth knowledge that traditional midwives have of their patients, since they are in their homes and meeting with them much more regularly than allopathic medical providers. They can spot and help manage behaviors and habits during the course of the gestational period that can prevent major complications during labor and postpartem.

I have seen first hand in my work as a doula (labor support person), how much the comfort and intimacy that traditional midwifery provides allows the birthing parent to have a more easeful labor. It was certainly less stressful for the mothers during COVID, where as per hospital policy they were not allowed more than one person to provide support. Those with a traditional midwifery care team and plan could have their family of choice present to support them.

On Kaua'i, we also have limited medical care options and traditional midwives provide a huge service in alleviating the workload of the hospital system, allowing the Dr's to focus on the true medical emergencies.

Every birth is not an emergency and does not need to be treated as such. Labor is a process that can unfold gracefully and naturally with the appropriate environment and support team. Traditional midwifery provides this opportunity.

All birthing parents or potential parents should be allowed this right to choose their method of care and birthing team.

Please support and protect traditional midwifery for all of Hawaii's future generations.

Aloha. My name is Zoe. Mom of two. I'm just reaching out with a testimony in hopes of being heard before you make a decision. Long story. It is so important for women of this community to be able to make the choice for themselves if they want a licensed vs unlicensed midwife. If it wasn't for my right to choose a traditional & unlicensed midwife, I wouldn't be able to have more children. I fall into the category of being a high-risk woman stuck in a rural community. The option of hiring my traditional midwife saved me in more ways than one. Let me explain my story. It brought me the most beautiful, undisturbed birth with my second baby. My first birth was out of a horror story. I was a young single mom, coerced into interventions that led to my baby almost dying in utero and resulted in a emerg emergency esection. Literally at the hands of the doctor. She was 40 weeks but still had a 11 day NICU stay. To make things crazier, while she was there a NICU nurse misplaced my baby without her equipment. She was found in their laundry room. The birth trauma and betrayal I was feeling from it all was overwhelming. Knowing I'd have to go back to the same place that traumatized me made it impossible for me. I knew when I got pregnant with my second baby five years later that I needed to research the whole thing. My findings led me to a traditional midwife. An unlicensed midwife was the only person who could take me on and look at my pregnancy as an individual. This type of midwife isnt bound by any hospital policy preventing her from getting me access to emergency care if needed.. traditional midwifery has been a part of the fabric of women. Women who birth in the tide pools, the forests, the waterfalls. The high risk, the people of native heritage, the birthtraumatized women who are like me... truth is, so many of us are preyed on. A certified midwife would have looked at my birth story and postpartum body and tell me of all the things to fear. They would be restricted by policy to helping me with my VBAC homebirth. They would have required me to go into a hospital. Its against everything I believe in. The United States maternal mortality rate is frightening. My traditional midwife truly supported and guided me throughout my second pregnancy. She provided much closer care than my OBGYN did during my first pregnancy. I went from doubting my body to feeling empowered.

My family was included in it all, my midwife taught my 5 year old daughter to listen to baby's heartbeat. My partner caught the baby in his hands. All I could say in that moment was "oh my god I DID IT". She flew out of me so fast it was euphoric! My midwife was an absolute angel, her experience helping women is truly inspiring. The hidden hero for women of these islands. Traveling to the sacred tide pools of even the outlying islands to help these rural communities of women. They are a tight knit and important community who are beyond competent. It was so amazing that throughout my pregnancy she provided me with many hours of checkups every month. If I needed anything she was always a phone call away. The community that I fall into deserves that up close and personal care.

It was eye opening to meet other women like me through her as well. It was so comforting having her spirit there at my birth, her massive hands on experience in the wildest of places & she had suitcases full of all the life saving equipment. Thankfully we didnt need any of it at the birth. She also saved my life from a bladder infection a couple days postpartum. She was able to get me access to antibiotics same day I needed them. She snuggled with me and let me sleep. She brought me tea herbs and soups. She cleaned the house and played with my five year old while I recovered in bed. I owe my healing to her.

I think we as women deserve the right to make this choice for such a sacred and otherworldly experience for their family. I would 100% recommend a traditional unlicensed midwife over a certified one for so many women, for so many reasons.. we aren't broken. At the end of the day, I hope we all can agree that only we as individuals deserve a choice in who we have present during pregnancy/birth/postpartum.

We are so glad we made that CHOICE and to have the expertise of a traditional midwife to guide us along.

We as a family will always strongly advocate for the preservation of traditional midwives and the amazing services they provide for families who make the choice to birth at home. When my wife and I would attend prenatal appointments at Kaiser, we would be in and out in about 5 minutes (not including the 30 min of waiting in the lobby prior). We never felt heard in those meetings. We knew our choices in our birth plan would be ultimately respected but we were always met with verbal opposition and disagreement. At our prenatal visits with our midwife, in the comfort of her home, we spent an extended amount of time, sometimes 2 hours, discussing my wife's diet, exercise routines, checking vitals and keying in on her overall wellness and mental state. The amount of care that our midwife put into making sure that I, as the father, was also doing well and on the same page as my wife was greatly appreciated. It was the personal touch and intentionality in building relationship that allowed us to feel confident and assured of what the process would be going into labor and birth. We knew that we could put all our trust into the experience of our midwife. That is the stark difference between hospital and home birth.

Choosing to birth in a hospital is a choice parents make. If medical doctors, medical procedures with pharmaceutical drugs, and laboring in an unfamiliar and cold place is a parent's choice, that choice should be treated with the utmost respect and sacred regard. The same goes for parents who choose to labor and birth at home with the aid and professionalism of a traditional midwife. We demand that our right to choose this course be respected and untouched by our state government.

She wore many faces, both in the ancient Celtic ways and stories, and later as a saint within the Christian faith. She was known in many cultures, under many names. She was the Woman of Fire, Hearth and Light, hailed as the Goddess of Poets, Healing, and of course, Midwifery.

Midwife is a word of old English roots. Of "Mid"- "to be with" and "wife"-woman. One who is with the woman/mother. Where I come from they are called "sage femme" meaning "wise woman". This role has been held, shouldered and honored by women throughout all of time. Birth itself demands that kind of presence, the knowledge of breath, of body, of death, of blood.

Who are we to determine today that midwifery is one way, to the exclusion of others? That only one type of education, privilege and access could support the entire function of midwifery for all women? There are so many ways to relate to birth, birthing bodies, and our faiths around this initiation rite. We can no longer impose one world view over another, and cut out people from long-standing traditions that go beyond our very lifetimes..

This is why I strongly support HB955, and the continuation of the Birth Attendant Exemption for traditional practitioners. There is a true human need, beyond standardized certifications and recognition, to allow community members to learn and apprentice inside of their own culture & beliefs. And there is an even greater need for women to be held by those who have answered to such a calling. May we learn to honor and protect midwifery in its widest scope, for all future generations.

My name is Aubrey Lacaillade, and I am a mother of two boys with another one on the way. I have experienced many variations of health care with each of my pregnancies and I strongly support HB955. Traditionally approved obstetric care, not only in the state of Hawai'i but also in this country, is severely lacking in caring for a woman's mental health, helping women educate themselves regarding their bodies, and recognizing and supporting when women need assistance. It is imperative that this bill pass so that women have the opportunity to continue receiving the excellent and well-established midwifery care that is currently available in Hawai'i.

In my previous pregnancies traditional obstetric care, I found my care to be incredibly difficult to navigate. From the very basics of driving to see my OB, sitting in the waiting room for up to forty-five minutes, and finally seeing the OB for less than fifteen minutes. To more intricate details of managing gestational diabetes as a post bariatric patient and being handed off to an unequipped diabetes clinic that gave poor advice on the best diet I should be following. It was not until the end of my second pregnancy where I began to ask more questions, received almost no answers, and began researching the answers myself that I decided to switch from traditional obstetric care to midwifery care.

After switching to a midwife, I was given proper tools and guidelines to help manage my gestational diabetes as a post bariatric patient. My midwife came to our home and met my family, showed my son what was going on in mommy's belly, spoke with my husband about his observations regarding my physical and mental wellbeing and spent hours talking with me, not only checking on baby and mom's medical wellbeing but also checking in on my mental health and educating me on different ways my body might react to labor and birth and postpartum and the different ways in which I could prepare.

The postpartum care I received after my first pregnancy with the standard six-week visit, I did not understand at the time that I was going through post partern anxiety and struggling. When I compare the postpartum care received from my OB in my first pregnancy to the postpartum care, I received from my midwife with my second pregnancy I can clearly see that our medical system needs to do better for the women in this state and country giving birth. My midwife came to see me eight times in six weeks, she helped me manage and find support for the postpartum anxiety that was starting again.

The level of care provided by midwifery practices should be the standard care given to all women going through pregnancy, labor, birth, and postpartum. Unfortunately, that level of care

is not standard at this time, the very least we can do is have this level of care be available for those seeking it as an alternative to the inadequate standardized care currently being offered. Limiting the midwives Hawai'i currently has and future midwives the come into practice will have devastating impacts. I strongly support HB955 and urge the committee to pass this bill. Thank you for the opportunity to give a personal testament in this critical matter.

My name is Morea Mendoza and I am from Kihei, Maui. I am testifying in support of SB1047 and HB955 RELATING TO CHAPTER 457J, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

Access to Midwifery care improves health outcomes and safety for all Birthing people and their children. I personally gave birth to a healthy baby girl three months ago with the help of a traditional midwife, and have her to attribute to the most positive parts of my prenatal and postpartum care as well. I support continuation of the Birth Attendant exemption and the addition of the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP), certified by the National Association of Registered Midwives (NARM) to be included in HRS 457-J as written in SB1047 and HB955.

These exemptions allow for the profession of Midwifery to continue to grow in equitable ways, allowing accessibility, diversity, cultural and religious freedom for Hawai'i. Without these exemptions, mothers like myself will not be able to birth according to our cultural practice. And for many mothers who live on Maui and other outer islands, we would be forced to birth in the only hospital on island, which in my case, is somewhere I have experienced cultural insensitivity with regard to my healthcare.

After July 2023 the temporary exemption is set to expire, criminalizing traditional midwives. Indigenous midwives have always learned through traditional apprenticeship pathways in Hawai'i, in part because there are no midwifery schools in our state. However, the knowledge they possess from an apprenticeship model of education has been passed down for generations and cannot be gained from midwifery schools on the mainland. I am providing testimony in support of midwifery care. I birthed both of my children at home and received excellent care throughout my pregnancy and in the postpartum by my midwife team. In contrast: I had co-care with Tripler and received completely awful care there. My midwives spent literal hours listening to me, asking me about my mental and physical health, my support system at home, my health history, and everything else inbetween. They became an extension of my family. They took every opportunity to provide me with external resources when I needed and always monitored me to ensure I was not high risk and was a safe candidate for home birth. When it came time to birth my babies, I did so knowing I had a capable and supportive team of trained women at my side. I never would have felt empowerment or security in the hospital setting. Whenever I had an appointment on the hospital side, I felt like I was being read a script of information that didn't fully apply to me or answer the questions I had. I would see the physician for 10 minutes and then be told all manner of concerning things which ultimately felt like I was being fear mongered into additional tests I didn't want based off nothing other than it being "standard procedure." While I could text my midwives about questions and appointments, I felt like I could never reach the hospital providers even when I was wanting to see them. I felt like I was a number and an automatic insurance payout guaranteed for the hospital. But with the midwife I felt like family. It actually mattered to them when I was having a hard day, when I slept wrong, that the burrito I had for lunch gave me heartburn.

Through my own personal research regarding birth and pregnancy, I firmly believe that the care a woman receives should be unique to her. No two pregnancies are the same, even if you are looking at the same body. I can personally attest to having two very different pregnancies and deliveries. Both overwhelmingly positive, but different.

The biggest point I could make here is that both times, **I was given the choice** on what care I desired. Every woman should have that choice. Being able to decide where you will birth and the team of people you want to support you is such a huge part of empowering people through this major life transition. I personally believe that birth is a physiological process first and not a medical process unless risked into needing medical intervention. While the medical side can be necessary, and is still a beautiful and empowering experience for some, it is not necessary for all. In fact, it is/could be a nightmare come true for some. Free birthing is becoming more popular and will probably become the only other option to hospitals should the option of midwifery care be taken away. While that is also a valid choice, it should not be the only other alternative to hospital births. There are risks associated with each type of care but we should be allowed to make that choice and by extension have access to those different types of care.

Especially when it is culturally and racially important. We need to be giving women more options, not stripping away the accessible care that works for them. I support midwives and I support the expansion of birth options and birth education. I am a walking example of what an empowered birth experience can look like. I wish that for every mother who comes after me. Whether they chose elective Caesarian or to birth at home in a tub. A positive and empowering experience begins with choice and the execution of that choice. Midwives have been the primary source of birth support for far longer than the medicalized practices we see today. We should not abandon one for the other. Instead we need to put more effort into making training more accessible and better funded.

Giving birth in a hospital with professionals and medical equipment does give a mother a sense of comfort when it comes to things like maternal mortality, however, it also adds stress when thinking about the medicalization of labor and delivery. When I found out I was pregnant and began to do my research, I was mind blown. The American <a href="health care system">health care system</a> views childbirth as a medical emergency rather than a natural occurrence. There is an emphasis on medicines and costly interventions. The moment I found that out I looked into other birthing options rather than a hospital birth.

I have two daughters. My first daughter was birthed at Kapi'olani Medical Center and my second was at my hale. Both labor and delivers were safe and healthy. The difference between the two were my midwives. During my first birth, I had no midwife. I felt like my birth was treated like a medical event. I went in to bring life into this world, not to have knee surgery. All emotional support was not present, as far as the medical staff. The staff made me feel unsure of myself as a mother. They disregarded my concerns because I was a first time mother and, according to them, I didn't know what I what I was doing. However, I did know. I took birthing classes through, Ka Lāhui o ka Pō, also known as Birthing the Nations. They work with midwives. This class surrounded us with support and gave us practical 'ike. It gave me so much confidence in my self emotionally, spiritually, mentally and physically as well as knowing what to advocate for in a hospital setting. I knew what I was doing going in that day. I prepped for that moment for nine months. But the moment I got face to face with that hospital staff, I was belittled.

My second birth was a dream. My midwives listened carefully and responded to my individual wants and needs. They were kind, patient, and paid attention to every little detail. They were well educated, skilled, and dedicated to serving myself and my baby. They made me sure of myself as

a mother. What they did for me was invaluable and it is everything that a hospital and medical staff lack.

Midwives are a vastly underutilized segment of the health workforce and are an important part of the solution. Midwives have supported women for centuries. They are trained with a focus on supporting natural births and they are distinctly positioned to provide respectful, high-quality care that places women and newborns at the center. Research has shown that women who have access to a midwife, experience less preterm births, fewer interventions during labor and shorter hospital stays. Governemnts that have invested in midwives are seeing the benefits. Countries including Sri Lanka, Indonesia, and Ethiopia have shown significant and sustained reductions in maternal and newborn mortality as a result of including midwives as a core aspect of their health systems. Alongside efforts to improve access to health facilities, these countries established professional unions for midwives and expanded midwifery training programs.

If other countries are able to accomplish all of that, here in Hawai'i, we should be able to:

- 1) Permit persons acting as birth attendants after July 1, 2023, to practice midwifery without a license; and
- 2) Include the North American Registry of Midwives portfolio evaluation process, or PEP Pathway, as proof of a successful completion of a formal midwifery education and training program for certified professional midwives.

Just as this Bill states. As there are no Midwifery Education Accreditation Council, or MEAC, accredited schools here in Hawai'i, it does not make sense to allow only certified professional midwife candidates who have taken the MEAC pathway to pursue licensure here.

Midwives play a crucial role in ensuring that women and babies are supported during the natural birthing process and have access to the high-quality, patient-center care they deserve. I experienced both first hand. Even though both of my experiences were safe and healthy, one was lacking. Midwives are angels are on this earth. There is a need for them and there are women who are ready to answer the call.

So today, let's recognize the incredible work of midwives and pass House Bill 955.

I am proud to be the first licensed Certified Professional Midwife (CPM) in the state of Hawai'i. I am a member of the Hawai'i Home Birth Taskforce, the Hawai'i Home Birth Collective, the Midwives Alliance of North America (MANA), the North American Registry of Midwives (NARM), the National Association of Certified Professional Midwives (NACPM), and La Leche League International (LLL).

The current Hawai'i midwifery law only allowed PEP educated midwives who were certified prior to 2020 to obtain a license. There is a whole generation of new midwives, who are desperately needed by the communities they are intended to serve. Despite having dedicated years of their lives to obtain their CPM credential and Bridge Certificate; their education is not recognized by the state of Hawai'i. This should be corrected. Please allow these midwives the opportunity to be licensed.

I practiced as a traditional midwife in Hawai'i for 15 years before I received my CPM credential through the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP). I have received a midwifery Bridge Certificate from NARM and am a registered NARM preceptor.

I was trained by a traditional midwife, also known as a traditional birth attendant, my teacher was trained by a traditional midwife, as was her teacher before her, and so on for millennia. As of July, the amazing elder midwife who shared her wisdom and knowledge with me will no longer be able to legally attend to women giving birth in Hawai'i. With over 40 years of experience and having been blessed to attend thousands of births, she will no longer be legally recognized as relevant to her community who has loved her for decades.

The outer islands have a long-standing shortage of women's healthcare providers. Further limiting access to proper maternity care is not in the best interests of the women and families of Hawai'i.

I write this testimony today strongly supporting HB955. All available healthcare options should be available to families during pregnancy and childbirth including traditional midwifery. Early in 2020 my wife told me we were pregnant with our first baby and we could not be more excited. Like most in our position we asked for recommendations of the best OB doctors to reach out to for helping us thru the process of our first pregnancy and delivery of our baby girl. We strarted down that road for our first 4 appointments with a very well respected Kapiolani Medical Center physician, but thru the process of our appointments we felt more and more like we were just taking a number and being treated like protocol robots. Each appointment we would check in and wait for 45 minutes only to be seen for 5 minutes by the busy physician who would assign us next steps we needed to follow rather than giving us the options available to us at each step of the process. With each appointment we wanted better and more personalized care where we could be educated on the birthing process, our rights and options and parents during pregnancy, and to learn more about what to expect and build confidence and peace and the pregnancy progressed. So we began to research more and reach out to others who had felt the same way. It was thru this process that we explored all of our options including leaving the state for well respected birthing centers since options are already limited in Hawaii. However we ended up building a strong relationship and comfort level with a local midwife who has been practicing in Hawaii for nearly 2 decades and delivered hundreds and hundreds of babies successfully. We had the most amazing prenatal care where our midwife and doulla would spend hrs with us, evening coming to our home and bringing us home to make is as easy as possible for my expectant wife and I as the due date closer. Even bringing us home baked bread and goodies at every appointment. We felt listened to and fully educated on the process, our options, what to expect etc. so much so that my wife became so relaxed and confident in herself that she for the first time in her life was not just considering a home birth, but had decided that we were going to have our baby girl at home. This was not something either of us had really wanted until going thru the process, and learning what was important to us, and finding such better and more personalized care with a midwife and doulla team then we found with the highest recommended obgyn doctors. My wife went into labor at 10pm on Oct 7, and our Midwife monitored us all the way until she came to our home at 4am and our baby girl was quickly and safely and naturally delivered at 634am Oct 8. Our baby was perfectly healthy, my wife was perfectly healthy and we all were in the comfort of our home being monitored by our birthing team, sleeping in our own bed, eating from our own fridge. Not haveing to exit the hospital after 1 night and driving home when my wife needed to rest, recover and bond with our baby latching for the first time. Being at home was incredible and offered the most calm and relaxing environment to spend as our new family of 3. The amazing care continued after our

birth as our Midwife and Doulla continued to come to our house provide post partum care for the next 2 weeks. Again, we didnt have to leave the comfort of our house or expose our newborn or recovering Momma to anything unecessary, and they took care of everything evening bringing us dinner so we didnt have to cook. This level of personalized care is what health care should be like for everyone. This is the health care that every Hawaii family deserves the choice to access. I write you as a father with another baby now on the way that my wife and I want to have cared for and delivered by our same Midwife who will now not be allowed to help us. I ask that you not take away this option from my family or the many other Hawaiian families that want care of traditional midwifes. I strongly support HB955 and ask for your gracious support of this bill as well.

Dear House Committee on Health and Homelessness,

I oppose HB955, Relating to HRS457J, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

I recognize it can be difficult to sort through the many messages coming to this committee regarding this bill. It can be confusing when there is charged language being used about making cultural and traditional midwives illegal. This sounds awful. And when we start to ask questions, we can recognize that the truth is there are a handful of birth attendants who have been trained by licensed midwives and licensed naturopaths. The birth attendants have not completed the minimum education and training to be licensed as a midwife. That is all. They are welcome to choose to do so, or not. And so, in July 2023 they will not be made illegal, as this law does not make humans illegal. Their choice to practice as primary healthcare providers without a license will no longer be condoned by the State of Hawai'i as the 4 year grace period from 2019-2023 will have closed. Currently the State of Hawai'i allows for anyone to practice midwifery without a license. You, committee members, are being asked to support this indefinitely through HB955, and that is why I urge you to vote NO on HB955. I encourage you to ask yourselves: How would supporting this bill demonstrate that this House Comittee on Health and Homelessness protects the health of Hawai'i?

A midwifery education is obtainable in Hawaii. Since July 2020, when licenses were first issued, a total of 28 midwives gained licensure in Hawaii.

A question you could ask yourself: knowing for 4 years that licensure would be required, how have the birth attendants planned for this due date? They currently care for clients as primary healthcare providers during families pregnancies - all of which have a due date. And there are standarized care practices that are expected to ensure a minimum level of care has been provided for pregnant families. We are approaching the due date of June 30, 2023 for licensure, and my observation of the management of this time is that it has not been well planned and cared for, and we are being asked to assist in what has been vocalized as a crises, that never needed to be a crises if it had been appropriately managed.

Would we find it competent for primary healthcare providers to know a mother is due to give birth, and their management plan is keep the baby in forever? This is harmful, eventually fatal, to both the mother and baby and we know this. When we are this close to the due date thawe have known sicne the beginning, we don't change it - that is evidence based maternity care.

This current perceived crises is due to people who have actively chosen not to obtain minimal education in midwifery. I respect that a handful of people do not wish to enroll in midwifery education. That is their choice. And that doesn't make it a public health crises in Hawaii.

I encourage you to ask yourself: do I have a definition of a birth attendant that actually demonstrates they are practicing differently than a licensed midwife? So far your defintion is that they don't carry medication, and their education is not reviewed by the State. That is all. Does that equate to safety for our birthing families when one of the identified causes of maternal mortality and morbidity is a delay in care? How does making unregulated primary healthcare providers a standard in Hawaii ensure that families get appropriate on time care? How does removing a providers access to medication in exchange for not ensuring they are minimally educated and competent equate to a family getting timely appropriate care?

I will close with bringing your attention to an error that is listed on page 2 of HB955, line 3. It states that HRS457-J was originally drafted based on the Oregon law. This is erroneous. If you look at the original draft of HRS457-J there was no exemption for birth attendants. The legislature added that in during the 2019 session. The reason that HRS457-J was not originally drafted with an exemption to practice without a license is because that is against our state licensing laws and does not ensure consumer safety. Oregon families who have poor outcomes, such as the death of their baby, while under the care of an unlicensed midwife have no recourse. And they don't truly understand this, because people generally don't believe anything other than routine normal will happen to them. Please allow me to quote from a news article from 2011:

"Among the 40 states that <u>allow midwifery</u>, the laws regulating them vary greatly. Oregon and Utah, however, are the only states that have optional licensure of midwives."

"I didn't go into this thinking, 'Oh, there's going to be a chance that my son's going to die," [A mother who hired an unlicensed birth attendant] said.

"Because unlicensed midwives are not regulated by the state, [the mother] cannot file a complaint against this midwife."

I want to be clear that I do not support the continuation of voluntary licensure in Hawaii, as leaving the exemption open indefintely negates mandatory licensure and allows for anyone to practice without a license. This does not align with our state laws on licensure, and it is not pono for our community.

I urge you to vote NO on HB955.

Losing the care of these midwives for our Ohana on Oahu will surely increase morbidity and mortality as families will continue to birth out of hospital. There are not nearly enough midwives that provide this service. I vote to strongly support HB955 and you should too. Mahalo!

As a midwifery student I studied to become a CPM and chose the PEP process.

The amount of hours I spent training was countless and the numbers of births I attended were near to 100 before I was even eligible to sit for the exam. I was required to demonstrate and sign off on a multitude of skills that I had developed throughout the training. The best part about this training was it was the style of learning suited me best. Much of my training was hands on. This Kinesthetic method of training is valued as one of the main learning styles. Each of us learn in different ways. The four main learning styles include reading/writing, auditory learning, visual learning and kinesthetic learning. This MEAC pathway relies heavily on the reading/writing method of learning. Many individuals will lean towards the PEP style of learning because they have a better stronger grasp of the information that they learn when it is taught in this way. It is important to preserve the PEP pathway and other traditional midwifery pathways because those individuals practicing can demonstrate an expertise in the art of community or home birth. THEY ARE EXPERTS IN THEIR CRAFT. The other licensed midwife categories in Hawaii are CNM's who mainly practice in a hospital setting. They are licensed but they are not well versed in the practice of home birth they are not practicing in a community setting because they were not trained to practice this way. In fact their training does not require them to have attended birth out of the hospital setting. The PEP and traditional midwives are trained to know what is normal in a home birth setting. Those of us who choose to sit for the exact same exam as the MEAC trained students demonstrate our grasp of the material we have learned when we pass. This is why it is crucial that we allow licensure for PEP CPM's as well as the MEAC trained CPM's. They are experienced and well versed in home birth. This is important to note that of the 4 learning styles, many cultural and traditional learners thrive from the kinesthetic learning styles. We have to place value on different learning styles and at minimum allow them a pathway to licensure.

## **TESTIMONY IN OPPOSITION HB955**

Hawai'i Department of Health regulated midwives for over 65 years, providing registration, then certification, then licensure, while overseeing that competencies were met. By an oversight of the legislature in 1998, they repealed the midwifery law under the Department of Health and moved the licensure of midwives to the Board of Nursing. However, only certified nurse-midwives were eligible for licensure and there was no longer a law that stated one must be licensed to practice midwifery. It was not the legislature's intention to allow anyone to practice midwifery without oversight, it was the result of the licensure of midwives being moved out of the Department of Health to the Board of Nursing.

The HRS 457-J was not drafted after "Oregon's Bill" and there was not an erroneous oversight in omitting the exemption. Rather the language used took guidance from US Midwifery Education, Regulation and Association (US MERA) and International Confederation of Midwives (ICM) as decisions were made on standards for education, they included legislative guidance in support of a standardized education.

"US MERA organizations approved a resolution to support legislative language that states by January 1, 2020, "all new applicants for midwifery licensure must have successfully completed an educational program or pathway accredited by an organization recognized by the U.S. Department of Education or obtained the "Midwifery Bridge Certificate." -USMERA.ORG

For a direct entry midwifery program the "accredited organization" is MEAC.

Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS) 457-J was enacted in 2019 to license all midwives who were not nurses, after two State Auditor reports the most recent being 2017, concluded the same - midwives need mandatory

licensure. HRS 457-J provided a temporary exemption for birth attendants to attend births without a license until June 30, 2023. The four year exemption was to provide birth attendants time to either define a pathway that they preferred that is not midwifery but demonstrates minimum education and competencies of birth attendance, or to obtain the necessary minimum midwifery education and competencies from accredited schools.

HRS 457-J recognized certified professional midwives (CPMs) who had been trained using the portfolio evaluation process (PEP) through a grandmothering in process. They were eligible to obtain licensure if they received their CPM certification prior to January 1, 2020.

This was a nationally recommended time frame to update midwifery educational policies by all national midwifery organizations (Which includes the National Midwifery Associations- ACME, ACNM, AMCB, ICTC, MEAC, MANA, NACPM & NARM) and the International Center for Traditional Childbearing, who participated in a work group to determine the recommended minimum requirements for midwives in the US. This also aligned with the International Confederation of Midwives minimum education and competencies for midwives. Ensuring a baseline standardized education for midwifery is a minimum update for this health profession, as the profession does not yet require a minimum degree. Several accredited midwifery educational programs confer a diploma or certificate to midwife graduates. This leveling up of midwifery education is normal progress in the profession, just as other health professions have updated their educational requirements over the years from hospital diplomas, to certification, to associates, to bachelors, to masters, to doctoral degree programs. Updating educational requirements as our global knowledge increases within a health field is necessary to keep up with the skill sets and scope of practice of any health profession.

This date for educational requirement changes was publicly provided for several years prior to the law becoming enacted. The North American Registry of Midwives (NARM), who nationally certifies CPMs, NARM also provided a pathway for self-taught birth attendants to apply through a portfolio, called the experienced midwife pathway, through December 31, 2019. NARM chose to close this pathway nationally on December 31, 2019. Some birth attendants in Hawai'i were certified through this pathway and eligible for licensure.

The current midwifery licensure (HRS 457-J) does not impede one's ability to provide cultural practices while providing services as a licensed midwife. MEAC accredited schools and the internship model required, supports the continued passing of cultural knowledge within midwifery as student midwives obtain their clinical hands-on training with midwives within their communities. Of the eight accredited midwifery education schools and programs, six of them allow for and encourage student midwives to obtain their hands-on training (clinical skill sets) in their own home communities. Four of the eight schools offer a completely online course curriculum, meaning that student midwives do not have to choose to attend a school that requires travel to the continent. The average cost of accredited midwifery schools whose curriculum is completely online is between \$4K-\$7.5K a year for three years. This is cheaper than going to UH, Manoa or UH, Hilo and is within the range of cost for a resident attending classes full time at UH Maui College. All of the accredited midwifery schools offer scholarships, half are eligible for government assistance (FAFSA and GI Bill), and five offer payment plan options.

Birth attendants who are not licensed in Hawai'i and are caring for clients utilize modern tools such as blood pressure cuffs, stethoscopes, doppler ultrasound, needles and suture materials, resuscitative equipment, and more. I believe that using these modern tools requires minimum education and clinical competencies, as families expect that their provider knows how to appropriately utilize the tools they are implementing in a client's care and a broad base education, by which to process the values obtained.

The attainment of minimum education and competencies to practice midwifery is needed for an independent, autonomous healthcare provider to safely care for Hawai'i's community and families. Therefore, I DO NOT SUPPORT HB955. This would remove public protections for consumers and allow an open number of people to practice without minimum education and training in midwifery while utilizing modern tools as autonomous healthcare providers.

As a licensed midwife in HI, I strongly oppose HB955 and SB1047 because by permanently exempting birth attendants, it nullifies mandatory licensure. Without mandatory licensure, there is no purpose of having licensure, and then we are no longer creating protections for consumer safety and public health. MAH does not support the continued use of the PEP pathway for minimum educational requirements as we support US MERA which recommends a minimum standardized accredited education from a MEAC school for certified professional midwives after January 1, 2020. This is an update to educational requirements for midwives. As all health professions have updated their education over time. Currently there is no minimum educational degree for CPMs, and so we support a minimum standardized education that is accredited. Hawaii now has 28 licensed midwives in Hawaii, all of which would qualify to be a preceptor for student midwives. And the preceptors that midwives utilize for PEP can also be MEAC preceptors. So midwives who are in Hawaii can choose one of four schools that require no travel for school - just online curriculum classes and hands on precepting in HI with licensed midwives.

As a licensed midwife, I am able to collaborate with other health professionals and hospital providers to optimize patient safety and outcomes for birthing families. Without the ability to order labs, carry medications, order breast pumps, refer for ultrasounds, among many other things, I would not be able to do my job. Licensure and integration into the health system is what has shown to improve outcomes for families.

#### Testimony in strong opposition of HB955

My name is Dr. Diana Kumar, and I am an obstetrician-gynecologist with an office in Waipio. I am writing in strong opposition to HB 955. As someone who spends most of my time with pregnant patients in the office and delivering their babies in the hospital, this bill seeks to open a door that will likely increase the maternal and fetal mortality and morbidity of the state of Hawaii.

This bill seeks to set standards and accountability to birth attendants by citing respect for different cultural values, improved access to people of color, and highlighting choice. I believe the key here is that we should be providing improved access to healthcare that addresses and prevents diabetes, nutrition and postpartum care, obesity, and hypertension. Allowing a group to set their own standards of education and experience, when the current laws have set strict training and regulation of certified midwives, is a disservice to women who may not recognize this is an unsafe choice.

In my experience, if a home birth goes wrong, it goes wrong quickly. Our system is not built for quick transfers of moms to the hospital. These lay midwives/attendants/doulas do not have access to medications or have been properly trained to quick life saving measures. They will transfer a mom who may be infected, septic, bleeding, or a baby that appears without a heart rate. Some will stay with the patient, but the majority leave without good transfer of care. This leaves a mighty burden on our staff, on the parents who may not recognize the issue at hand and likely could have been presented, and extreme liability to our teams-pediatrics and obstetrics. There are no protection for the liability upon all the health care workers who accept these patients.

Most states record maternal morbidity (sepsis, ICU admission, postpartum hemorrhage, etc), maternal mortality, fetal morbidity (NICU admission, cerebral palsy, infection, etc), and fetal death in the location where it is first called. In these cases, for example, if a baby is delivered with a heart beat but in severe distress dies several days later in the NICU, this is recorded as a hospital death and not a home birth death. This makes tracking effects of mortality/morbidity in states such as Oregon, who have more lax bills, difficult if not impossible. The evidence that having increase home births improves care is not there.

This bill is being introduced with passion, and albeit the idea of choice/freedom at hand. We should, however, be highlighting SAFE choices. The idea of a 3 year period is also underestimating and diminishing the amount of training our nurses, certified nurse midwives, and myself a physician have spent learning this art. We can associate the birthing process with a cultural and happy experience, and the majority of the time, it is. However in light of today's pressing patient's needs and health issues, the experience and training needed for patient safety so they CAN enjoy their delivery and their healthy baby should be exemplified by much higher standards and training, reflected in licensure and official training programs. The patients of today do not reflect the patients of 20 years ago, even 10 years ago in their rates of diabetes, hypertension, obesity, and age related risks. They deserve better care, and HB955 does not support this.

- 3. Under Application for License as a midwife: Certified Professional Midwives and Certified Midwives should be separated. Certified Midwives are accredited by the same accrediting body (AMCB) American Midwifery Certification Board that Certified Nurse Midwives are.

Finally, an argument in previous bills is that there are no formal midwifery programs available on Island for those wanting further education to become licensed or that it is a hardship to leave island to get proper training and education. There are pathways for student midwives to complete formal education and to provide care in their home communities. The American College of Nurse Midwives has a Midwives of Color committee (MOCC) and Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) chapter addressing healthcare disparities, the need for birthing persons to have culturally appropriate care and to address diversity. These groups also offer scholarships for midwifery students to complete midwifery programs and grants available

for CNMs to open clinics and births centers. The following programs offer distance education to become a Certified Nurse Midwife.

## Testimony of the Hawaii Home Birth Task Force Chair And Board President of the Hawaii Home Birth Collective

Before the House Committee on Health Monday February 3, 2023 8:30 a.m. State Capitol, Via Video Conference HB 955, Relating to Chapter 457J

Aloha Chair Belatti and Members of the Health Committee:

My name is Kristie Duarte and I was the Chair of the Hawaii Home Birth Task Force created by Act 32 (2019). I am also the Board President of the Hawaii Home Birth Collective, a home birth midwifery organization dedicated to the preservation, perpetuation, and diversity of home birth practices and autonomy in home birth midwifery care. We continue to offer full **support of HB 955 with additional comments on this bill.** 

As the Chair of the Hawaii Home Birth Task Force, I want to stress how important this 2023 session is. On July 1, 2023, birth attendants with different cultural skills and practices will become illegal unless we pass new legislation this year. Act 32 (2019) stated "By the end of the three year period, the legislature intends to enact statutes that will incorporate all birth practitioners and allow them to practice to the fullest extent under the law."

The Hawai'i Regulatory Licensing Reform Act states that "regulation must not unreasonably restrict entry into professions and vocations by all qualified persons". Hawaii's midwifery law currently leaves out a nationally recognized pathway to certification which would allow for more local midwives to obtain licensure through an approved educational route of entry provided by the North American Registry of Midwives (NARM) through the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP). People certified through this educational evaluation process have completed a rigorous approved educational route and attended at least 55 births under the supervision of a registered preceptor, demonstrated clinical skills, and passed the same exam that is required for certification of those who attend a MEAC accredited college (which is not available in person on island). Although a few of the MEAC accredited colleges are available online, this does not make it accessible for those who do not have steady online access (like our rural areas) and for those who are not financially supported. Requiring only the MEAC accredited pathway is causing a disproportionate hardship for people who live in Hawaii, especially women of color and people who live in underserved communities.

The Hawaii Regulatory Licensing Reform Act also states that:

"Regulation in the **form of full licensure or other restrictions** on certain professions or vocations shall be retained or adopted when the health, safety, or welfare of the consumer may be jeopardized by the nature of the service offered by the provider".

Regulation of the birth attendant through use of "other restrictions" other than licensure is found in the requirements set forth in HRS 457J (6)-5, which outlines informed consent disclosure forms and very specific conditions under which the birth attendants are allowed to practice. These restrictions on the birth attendant has allowed the community to still have access to culturally appropriate care and still have a choice when it comes to their reproductive rights. Ultimately, the health, safety and welfare of the consumer is protected through the regulations set forth in HRS 457J(6)-5.

We are open to exploring any amendments that may allow the community to continue to access culturally appropriate care provided by the (1) birth attendant and (2) the CPM who has obtained certification through the educational route of entry through the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP).

Midwives Alliance of Hawai'i (MAH) opposes HB955 Relating to Chapter 457J, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

## **KEY TAKEAWAYS:**

- MEAC accredited education is obtainable in Hawai'i. Requiring a minimum
  accredited education to be a healthcare provider is important for the safety and
  welfare of the public. Requiring mandatory licensure is in accordance with HRS
  Chapter 26H. All licensed midwives and student midwives can participate, offer
  and engage in cultural practices while licensed and/or enrolled in a MEAC
  accredited educational program.
- Hawai'i has a history of regulating midwives that was rightfully restored in 2019

- HRS Chapter 26H requires mandatory licensure "when the health, safety, or welfare of the consumer may be jeopardized by the nature of the service offered by the provider."
- Midwifery care meets the criteria for mandatory licensure under HRS Chapter 26H Hawai'i Regulatory Licensing Reform Act.
- Continuing an exemption for self-identified birth attendants creates voluntary
  midwifery licensure, a permanent ability for anyone to practice midwifery without
  a license, and invites midwives and birth attendants who have lost their license in
  other states or had poor outcomes to move to Hawai'i to practice without
  oversight. This occurred during 1998-2019 when there was no midwifery
  licensure.
- HRS Chapter 26H Hawai'i Regulatory Licensing Reform Act states "the purpose
  of regulation shall be the protection of the public welfare and not that of the
  regulated profession or vocation." Exemption serves birth attendants rather than
  the public welfare.
- There are no current recommendations from the Hawai'i Maternal Mortality Review Committee, American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, Society for Maternal-Fetal Medicine, American College of Nurse-Midwives, National Association of Certified Professional Midwives, or the Center for Disease Control that encourage reducing and/or removing resources from maternal and infant health care in order to improve birth and health outcomes (morbidity and mortality). Changing midwifery licensure from mandatory to voluntary is removing a safe healthcare resource from the public.
- If Hawai'i supports continued exemption of practicing midwifery without a
  license and minimum education and competencies, the State will be condoning
  and supporting autonomous independent primary maternity healthcare providers
  to diagnose, manage, treat, utilize modern tools, and care for the public under the
  same scope of practice of a licensed midwife, except for the use of legend drugs.
- The Portfolio Evaluation Process was recommended to be phased out as of January 1, 2020 by US Midwifery Education Regulation & Association (US MERA). US MERA included all national midwifery education accrediting bodies, accredited certifying bodies, professional organizations and the International Center for Traditional Childbearing. This was an updating of minimum educational training requirements for the certified professional midwife to align with the International Confederation of Midwives educational standards.
- All healthcare professions have updated their minimum required educational standards over the years as knowledge, skill set and scope of practice have grown.

Currently licensed midwives do not have a minimum required degree and this is why it is also important that they minimally achieve a MEAC accredited education.

- All 28 Hawai'i licensed midwives are eligible to be clinical hands-on trainers for students enrolled in MEAC accredited educational programs. Some currently are precepting student midwives in Hawai'i.
- The difference between PEP and MEAC pathways: MEAC is receiving standardized accredited education (curriculum) while also working with hands-on trainers (midwives). PEP is apprenticing with a hands-on trainer (midwife) and learning the midwife's knowledge. The same midwives who can precept for PEP can precept for MEAC schools. The hands-on portion for skills is the same in both programs.
- MEAC accredited schools can be attended exclusively while in Hawai'i and cost \$4-7.5K per year for 3 years. After passing the national exam, they can be licensed as autonomous independent primary healthcare providers in Hawai'i.

Hawai'i Department of Health regulated midwives for over 65 years, providing registration, then certification, then licensure, while overseeing that competencies were met by the regulated midwives. By an oversight of the legislature in 1998, they repealed the midwifery law under the Department of Health and moved the licensure of midwives to the Board of Nursing. However, only certified nurse-midwives were eligible for licensure and there was no longer a law that stated one must be licensed in order to practice midwifery. It was not the legislature's intention to allow anyone to practice midwifery without oversight who was not a nurse from 1998 through 2019, yet it was the result of the licensure of midwives being moved out of the Department of Health to the Board of Nursing.

Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS) 457-J was enacted in 2019 to license all midwives who were not nurses, after two State Auditor reports in 1999 and 2017 concluded the same - midwives need mandatory licensure. HRS 457-J provided a temporary exemption for birth attendants to attend births without a license until June 30, 2023. The four year exemption was to provide birth attendants time to either define a pathway that they preferred that is not midwifery but demonstrates minimum education and competencies of birth attendance, or to obtain the necessary minimum midwifery education and competencies from accredited schools.

HRS 457-J recognized certified professional midwives (CPMs) who had been trained using the portfolio evaluation process (PEP) through a grandmothering in process. They were eligible to obtain licensure if they received their CPM certification prior to January 1, 2020 and completed a Midwifery Bridge Certificate. Some of the midwives who became licensed qualified through this route. This was a nationally recommended time frame to update midwifery educational policies by all national midwifery organizations and the International Center for Traditional Childbearing, who participated in a work group to determine the recommended minimum requirements for midwives in the US. This also aligned with the International Confederation of Midwives minimum education and competencies for midwives. Ensuring a baseline standardized education for midwifery is a minimum update for this health profession, as the profession does not yet require a minimum degree. Several accredited midwifery educational programs confer a diploma or certificate to midwife graduates. This leveling up of midwifery education is normal progress in the profession, just as other health professions have updated their educational requirements over the years from hospital diplomas, to certification, to associates, to bachelors, to masters, to doctoral degree programs. Updating educational requirements as our global knowledge increases within a health field is necessary to keep up with the skill sets and scope of practice of any health profession.

This date for educational requirement changes was publicly provided for several years prior to the law becoming enacted. The North American Registry of Midwives (NARM), who nationally certifies CPMs, also provided a pathway for self-taught birth attendants to apply through a portfolio, called the experienced midwife pathway, through December 31, 2019. NARM chose to close this pathway nationally on December 31, 2019. Some birth attendants in Hawai'i were certified through this pathway and eligible for licensure.

HRS 457-J does not impede one's ability to provide cultural practices while providing services as a licensed midwife. HRS 457-J supports the continued passing of cultural knowledge within midwifery as student midwives obtain their clinical hands-on training with midwives within their communities, including here in Hawai'i. Of the eight accredited midwifery education schools and programs, six of them allow for and encourage student midwives to obtain their hands-on training (clinical skill sets) in their own home communities. This can be done in Hawai'i as there are now 28 licensed midwives since HRS457-J became law. Some of them are currently precepting student midwives at this time. Two of the eight schools offer hybrid programs, meaning students travel a minimal amount of times in the year to the school campus on the continent, with the majority of all standardized curriculum being taught through online platforms. Four

of the eight schools offer a completely online course curriculum, meaning that student midwives do not have to choose to attend a school that requires travel to the continent. The average cost of accredited midwifery schools whose curriculum is completely online is between \$4K-\$7.5K a year for three years. This is cheaper than going to UH, Manoa or UH, Hilo and is within the range of cost for a resident attending classes full time at UH Maui College. All of the accredited midwifery schools offer scholarships, half are eligible for government assistance (FAFSA and GI Bill), and five offer payment plan options.

Birth attendants who are not licensed in Hawai'i and are caring for clients utilize modern tools such as blood pressure cuffs, stethoscopes, doppler ultrasound, needles and suture materials, resuscitative equipment, and more. We believe that using these modern tools requires minimum education and clinical competencies, as families expect that their provider knows how to appropriately utilize the tools they are implementing in a client's care. We respect and support incorporating the cultural practices of the family and of the person attending a birth, and we find that HRS 457-J supports a licensed midwife to incorporate both their midwifery knowledge and cultural practices. There is nothing within HRS 457-J that impedes a person's ability to incorporate their cultural practices while providing midwifery care as a licensed midwife.

Midwives Alliance of Hawai'i agrees with Chapter 26H Hawaii Regulatory Licensing Reform Act requiring mandatory licensure "when the health, safety, welfare or consumer may be jeopardized by the nature of the service offered by the provider." Further, that "the purpose of regulation shall be the protection of the public welfare and not that of the regulated profession or vocation". Providing continued exemption for self-declared birth attendants to practice midwifery without a license serves birth attendants not the public.

The attainment of minimum education and competencies to practice midwifery is needed for an independent, autonomous healthcare provider to safely care for Hawai'i's community and families. Therefore, Midwives Alliance of Hawai'i does not support House Bill 955. This would remove public protections for consumers and allow an open number of people to practice without minimum education and training in midwifery while utilizing modern tools as autonomous healthcare providers.

Thank you for this opportunity to testify. We strongly urge you to vote NO on HB955.

#### Comments:

Hello, I am a 37 year old professional who has moved with my partner to give birth here in Hawaii where our family lives. We lived in Australia previously where home birth is very common--most of my colleagues and friends gave birth at home and many women in my community are respected career midwives. Last year, under the care of a PEP trained certified professional midwife (CPM) as well as a MEAC trained CPM, I gave birth to a healthy 11 lb baby boy at home, completely naturally. He is now six months old and the happiest little boy, sleeps through the night, eats from my breast, and shows all great signs of development. He is calm, secure, and beautiful. I attribute this to the calm home birth environment and the skillful midwives that helped him come through and straight to my breast and skin, instead of the jarring experience of the hospital. I have no problem with women who choose to give birth in the hospital, none at all, but I am shocked to hear that our choice to give birth at home, where we live, where we are comfortable, is being threatened by reducing the number of midwives who will legally be able to care for us. Considering how normal homebirth is, how revered natural motherhood is and the international reclamation of natural living, I am horrified to hear that restrictions are being placed on one of the oldest and most revered professions in the books-midwives!

It is a choice that we make about who we want at our birth and what care we desire. This is our right as birthers, as mothers. We should not be forced into hospitals due to a shortage of legal midwives. We should not be forced into hospitals where we will be assigned a doctor we've never met, nurses will go into autopilot poking and prodding without consent, where we could be administered drugs without proper warning or explanation, where our babies will be taken away, our partners pushed to the side, etc. This sounds horrible.

To many of us birth is still sacred. To many of us this is one of our very last true rites of passage. And we wish to do as our ancestors did. We wish to do as our bodies are designed to. To birth with power, with women around us, with midwives guiding us.

Aloha kākou, My name is Melissa and I have lived in Hawai'i for seven years. I would like to acknowledge the traditional, indigenous, and invaded territory of the Kānaka Maoli on whose land we are gathered. It is important to acknowledge the land as both a Black woman and as a transplant as it relates to this bill, which attempts to preserve traditional Hawaiian healing practices and birth traditions, as well as the traditional and indigenous practices of those who practice midwifery and the people that live, love, and give birth in Hawai'i.

I would also like to acknowledge the history of obstetrics and gynecology, whose foundations are built upon the unethical experimentation on, procedures, treatments, and exploitation of enslaved and other vulnerable women. The medical model of obstetrics and nurse midwifery have co-opted and appropriated the traditional and indigenous midwifery practices as its own. All of this informs a family's choices in childbirth.

I am a mother who gave birth in the childhood home of my partner, surrounded by a highly competent midwife and apprentice midwives. As a Black woman, my decision was based on the documented and undisputed fact that it is not safe for Black women to give birth in hospitals, even in Hawai'i, where Black residents make up less than 2% of the population. To deny my right to choose the model of reproductive care I believe is safest and best for my health and wellbeing as well as for the health and well-being of my child and any future children I may have makes the state complicit in perpetuating poor maternal health outcomes. And based on the current state of maternal health care, to deny me access to all the ways midwifery is practiced in Hawai'i constitutes an act of violence towards me and other mothers and birthing people.

I come from a legacy of grand midwives, Black women who offered a continuity of care to women and their families at a time when Black women were not allowed to give birth in hospitals. It is important to highlight that it's been less than 60 years that Black and indigenous women of color have been allowed to birth in hospitals.

This legacy gave shape to modern midwifery and obstetrics. To deny access to the full practice and scope of midwifery which includes home births dishonors this legacy.

Access to Midwifery care improves health outcomes and safety for all who give birth. The current licensing of midwives severely restricts and limits the profession and its ability to grow and sustain itself. It severely limits the ability of aspiring midwives to learn from the practitioners that have been passing down birth traditions and cultural competencies for generations that the current pathway does not have access to. I support continuation of the Birth Attendant exemption and the addition of the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP), certified by the National Association of Registered Midwives (NARM) to be included in HRS 457-J.

Kalauokekahuli is a non-profit organization based on Maui who supports Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander families by providing culturally-based prenatal, birth, and postpartum education and services.

We support HB 955 and the purpose of this act to:

- 1) Permit persons acting as birth attendants after July 1. 2023, to practice midwifery without a license, and
- Include the North American Registry of Midwives Portfolio Evaluation Process as proof of a successful completion of a formal midwifery education and training program for Certified Professional Midwives.

We support a birthing person's right to informed choice of birth attendant, especially for the Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander communities. We recognize the many factors that birthing people consider when choosing who will attend their birth, including social factors such as institutionalized racism, cultural practices and traditions, immigration status and religious beliefs. The licensure exemption for birth attendants as described in Act 32 requires the birth attendant to disclose verbally and in writing important information to the birthing person, including their licensure status, education and training, that the person is not authorized to acquire, carry, administer, or direct others to administer legend drugs, and a plan for transporting the birthing person, among other requirements of the birth attendant. We believe that amending ACT 32 to permanently exempt birth attendants as described will allow birthing people to make a more informed choice as to who their birth attendants may be. Without this exemption in place, birthing people will still choose who they desire to attend their birth, but without the requirement of disclosure by the birth attendant.

We also support the proposed amendments to section 457J-8 of Act 32 to allow State Licensure of Certified Professional Midwives (CPM) who

- 1) Has obtained certification through the North American Registry of Midwives (NARM) Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP),
- 2) Holds a Midwifery bridge certificate issued by the NARM for Certified Professional Midwives; and
- 3) Has a current cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification for adults and newborns and for neonatal resuscitation.

The NARM allows for both MEAC (Midwifery Education Accreditation Council) graduates and those who complete the Portfolio Evaluation Process to sit for the exam and if passed, receive their Certified Professional Midwife credential. It is crucial that ACT 32 include the PEP process as a pathway to the CPM credential and state licensure. There are currently 8 MEAC accredited programs and institutions in the United States, of which only 3 have distance-learning programs, and of those 3, only 1 has Title IX funding. By only allowing CPM's who graduated from a MEAC school to apply for state licensure, we are not only disenfranchising qualified CPM's from practicing in Hawaii (those who completed the PEP process), we are disenfranchising our own community by eliminating an integral educational pathway to the CPM credential. This disenfranchisement disproportionately will affect our Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander communities.

Kalauokekahuli encourages the healthy growth of Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander families by supporting and enhancing the well-being of birthing people, parents, and their infants with holistic, multi-generational, and culturally-rooted care regardless of socioeconomic privilege. In doing so, we seek to revitalize and normalize 'Oiwi prenatal, birth, and postpartum practices foregrounding 'ike kupuna and Indigenous knowledge and by centering the care/support of Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander families through community outreach. By offering culturally relevant educational classes and workshops, in addition to providing access to high quality prenatal, birth, and postpartum services, we strive to positively influence birth and postpartum outcomes for Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders.

To become a licensed massage therapist I can choose to go through an approved massage therapy training program or become an apprentice to a licensed massage therapist. Either pathway allows me to sit for the state licensing exam. I can choose from several school-based massage therapy programs or licensed massage therapists.

Currently, there are no midwifery schools in Hawai'i, which severely restricts access to the profession and limits its ability to grow and sustain itself in ways that are culturally appropriate and reflect the values of Native Hawaiian and other cultures that are represented throughout the islands. The current licensing has, however, allowed for a number of non-residents to become licensed. These licensed midwives have not been required to demonstrate core cultural competencies and cultural humility or even a commitment to preserving Native Hawaiian and traditional birth practices, and by doing so, risks harm to both the profession as practied in Hawai'i as well as the values of the community.

The National Association of Registered Midwives accepts the same two pathways to be eligible to sit for the national exam. It is incongruous to allow massage therapists the opportunity to become licensed through either pathway and not extend the same rights to student midwives.

Respecting a person's right to choose where and how they give birth means lawmakers must also do their due diligence with regards to acknowledging traditional and indigenous birthing traditions and birth autonomy as they work to protect these rights and establish a standard of midwifery care.

Thank you for allowing me to provide testimony in OPPOSITION of HB955 I'm Melissa Chong a licensed midwife in Maui.

HRS 457-J was enacted in 2019 to license all midwives who were not nurses, after two state auditor reports the latest being 2017, concluded midwives needed mandatory licensure HRS 457-J provided a temporary exemption for birth attendants, this was to allow time for anyone who felt they were a Traditional Birth Attendant, to define their own pathway towards recognition. We had in 2019, 15 Midwives in Hawaii that qualified for licensure. Currently, we have 28 licensed midwives, and it is true that some of these new providers moved here because we became a favorable state towards midwives. But what we also see are several individuals that testified, previous to licensure, that "they would be put out of business" "erased" --Many of the charged words you may hear again today, but in fact when HRS 457-J was enacted they became the first few midwives licensed here. The state of Hawaii is asking autonomous healthcare providers to support core competencies'. The MEAC school programs have a requirement of two sections to the schooling, didactic education, which allows midwives to have standardized core knowledge and a community based apprenticeship or preceptorship. This structure is supportive of someone learning any traditional, cultural or regional aspects to the care they provide. There is no part of the model that inhibits a person from practicing their culture or any cultural aspects to their practice. There are 8 MEAC schools that offer some hybrid or online elements. 4 out of 8 of these programs can be completed online and all but two of the programs expect and encourage you to complete your preceptorship in your community. We have 28 licensed midwives that would eventually become the preceptors. These students can attend and complete school all without leaving Hawaii. I'm asking the committee to vote no to HB955.

I am Erynn Duquette. I have lived in Hawai'i for 23 years. I strongly support HB955 and Resolution #23-28.

Access to midwifery care improves health outcomes and safety for all birthing people and their children. I support the continuation of the Birth Attendant exemption and the addition of the Portfolio Evaluation Process (PEP), certified by the National Association of Registered Midwives (NARM) to be included in HRS 457-J.

These exemptions allow for the profession of Midwifery to continue to grow in equitable ways, allowing accessibility, diversity, and cultural and religious freedom for Hawai'i.
