- Proper education about swimming at a young age can potentially save lives in the present and the future.
- According to Pearn, Brown III, & Hsia (1980) of *Military Medicine*, nine children
  drowned, and 49 almost drowned in swimming pools in Hawaii. The age distribution
  curve was bimodal, with peaks at one to two years and eight years.

Having an aquatic safety education program for elementary school students will be very beneficial to our young children. This is why I strongly support HR76 Requesting the

Department of Education to contract with a qualified nonprofit organization to establish an
