SENATE BILL NO. 655 RELATING TO HEMP

Chairpersons Gabbard and Wakai and Members of the Committees:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill 655. This measure gives authority to the Department of Agriculture (DOA) to align state hemp production administrative rules with federal law, with regard to exemptions for fiber, fuel, and seed grain hemp crops. DOA supports this bill and offers comments.

Under sections 141-42 and 141-43, Hawaii Revised Statues, the DOA is tasked with monitoring the transportation of hemp within the State, enforcing restrictions regarding the growth of hemp within the State, and adopting rules pursuant to chapter 91. In addition to aligning state hemp rules with federal law to exempt fiber, fuel, and seed grain crops, DOA respectfully requests deleting the language on page 5 lines 3 to 7 of this bill pertaining to nuisance issues. DOA does not find it necessary or appropriate to create additional rules to address nuisance issues, including smell, noise, and excessive lighting arising out of the activities of hemp growers. Pre-existing



regulations and authority under the Department of Health and county land use ordinances already address (and are the appropriate method of addressing) the areas of nuisance referenced. DOA has serious concerns regarding the creation of a duplicative enforcement framework that may result in confusion and challenge due to incompatible oversight and conflicting actions and decisions.

Aloha Chair Gates and Members of the House Committee on Agriculture and Food Systems,

Thank you for your continued support of Hawaii Hemp farmers. The Hawaii Hemp Farmers Association, which is composed of Hawaii hemp farmers, processors, and manufacturers, is in strong support of SB 655.

Hawaii's hemp industry has been stymied for a several reasons. There are numerous projects in the state exploring ways to make building materials from hemp and using hemp in affordable housing, but most of these projects import hemp due to the regulatory barriers to growing hemp in Hawaii that make farming hemp in Hawaii very expensive.

The U.S. Congress will be amending federal hemp cultivation laws in the near future to allow for exemptions for hemp crops that are grown for fiber, fuel, or grain for food.

The federal exemptions may include relief from testing and transportation requirements. SB 655 authorizes the Department of Agriculture to amend Hawaii state rules to align with federal laws as soon as exemptions for hemp fiber, fuel, and food grain are passed by Congress. This ensures Hawaii farmers and the Hawaii hemp industry can benefit ASAP from the exemption instead of waiting 1.5 to 2 years for legislation and then rules to be developed. SB 655 ensure Hawaii farmers can remain competitive and provide hemp for instate hemp projects.
