

## THIRTY-FIFTH DAY

Wednesday, March 11, 1970

The House of Representatives of the Fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1970, was called to order at 11:30 o'clock a.m.

The Speaker presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend Yoshiaki Fujitani of the Honpa Hongwanji Mission.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Thirty-Fourth Day.

### THIRD READING

The following bill, which was on the calendar for Third Reading, was read throughout and the following action was taken:

Third Reading of H. B. No. 1267-70.

Representative Wakatsuki moved that H. B. No. 1267-70, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Minn.

Representative Garcia offered the following amendment to H. B. No. 1267-70:

"House Bill No. 1267-70, H. D. 1, is

amended as follows:

1. On page 25 thereof, after line 6 and before line 7, the following is inserted:

'Section 9A, Chapter 237, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding two new sections to read as follows:

'Sec. 237-29.1. Exemption of food products. There are exempted from the taxation provided for in section 237-16 (b) the gross proceeds of sale or gross income received or derived from the retail sale of food products for human consumption. 'Food products', for the purposes of this section, include cereals and cereal products, milk and milk products, oleomargarine, meat and meat products, fish and fish products, eggs and egg products, vegetables and vegetable products, fruit and fruit products, spices and salt, sugar and sugar products, coffee and coffee substitutes, tea, and cocoa and cocoa products.

'Food products' do not include any intoxicating liquor or beverages such as are ordinarily dispensed by persons licensed under chapter 281.

None of the exemptions provided for in this section shall apply:

(1) When the food products are served as meals on or off the premises of the retailer;

(2) When the food products are furnished, prepared, or served for consumption at tables, chairs, or counters or from trays, glasses, dishes, or other tableware provided by the retailer or by a person with whom the retailer contracts to furnish, prepare, or serve food products to others; or

(3) When the food products are ordinarily sold for immediate consumption on or near a location at which parking facilities are provided primarily for the use of patrons in consuming the products purchased at the location, even though such products are sold on a 'takeout' or 'to go' order and

are actually packaged or wrapped and taken from the premises of the retailer.

Sec. 237-29.2. Exemption of medicines. There are exempted from the taxation provided for in section 237-16 (b) the gross proceeds of sale or gross income received or derived from the retail sale of medicines prescribed for the treatment of a human being by a person authorized to prescribe the medicines and dispensed on prescription filled by a person authorized to dispense drugs in accordance with law.

'Medicines', for the purposes of this section, mean any substance or preparation intended for use by external or internal application to the human body in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease and which is commonly recognized as a substance or preparation intended for such use. Insulin sold by a registered pharmacist to a person for treatment of diabetes as directed by a physician shall be deemed to be dispensed on prescription within the meaning of this section.

'Medicines' do not include any intoxicating liquor as defined in section 281-1.'

2. On page 25 thereof, the last sentence of Section 10 (lines 11 and 12) is amended to read as follows:

'Sections 8, 9 and 9A, upon their approval shall take effect on July 1, 1970.' "

Representative Garcia moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Soares.

Representatives Garcia, Meyer, Aduja, Judd, Miho and Soares spoke in favor of the motion and Representatives Wakatsuki and Suwa spoke in opposition thereto.

The Chair stated that the pending motion was for adoption of the amendment. A sufficient number so

requesting it, the Chair ruled that a roll call vote was in order.

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and failed to carry by a vote of 12 ayes to 36 noes, with Representatives Alcon, Baptiste, Bicoy, de la Cruz, Duponte, Ho, Iha, Inaba, Kato, Kawakami, Kimura, Kondo, Kunimura, Lee, Loo, Menor, Minn, Miyake, Morioka, Nakama, Pacarro, Pule, Roehrig, Sakima, Serizawa, Shigemura, Suwa, Taira, Takamine, Takitani, Uechi, Ushijima, Wakatsuki, F. Wong, R. Wong and Beppu voting no, and Representatives Heen, Oshiro and Poepoe being excused.

Representative Garcia then offered another amendment to H. B. No. 1267-70:

“House Bill No. 1267-70, H. D. 1, is hereby amended as follows:

1. Inserting between Section 2 and Section 3 of Part I the following:

‘Section 2A. Section 235-56, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

‘235-56. Tax credits against individual net income taxes.

(a) Tax credit for resident taxpayer. Each resident taxpayer who files an individual net income tax return for a taxable year and who is not claimed or is not otherwise eligible to be claimed as a dependent by another taxpayer for federal or Hawaii state individual net income tax purposes may claim tax credits against his individual net income tax liability or as otherwise provided below for the taxable year for which the individual net income tax return is being filed; provided that a husband and wife filing separate returns for a taxable year for which a joint return could have been made by them shall claim only the tax credit to which they would have been entitled had a joint return been filed; and provided that a resident individual who has no income or no income taxable under this chapter and who is not claimed

or is not otherwise eligible to be claimed as a dependent by a taxpayer for federal or Hawaii state individual net income tax purposes may also claim tax credits as set forth in this section.

[(b) Modified adjusted gross income. Each resident taxpayer who claims tax credits as set forth in this section shall declare in addition to his income taxable under this chapter, the following income presently exempt from income taxation: social security benefits, unemployment compensation benefits, workmen’s compensation benefits, interest on tax-free securities, public assistance payments, pensions, and annuities, cost of living allowances paid to federal employees, and proceeds from life insurance. The modified gross income of a resident taxpayer for the purposes of this section shall be the sum of his adjusted gross income for income tax purposes, if any, and the income exempt from income taxation, if any, declared pursuant to this subsection.]

(b) Tax Credit. Each taxpayer may claim a tax credit of \$20.00 per qualified exemption.

[(c) Tax credit schedule. Each taxpayer may claim tax credits in the amount indicated for each modified adjusted gross income bracket as shown in the schedule below.

\$1,000 to \$1,999	15

[(d)] (c) Qualified exemption defined. For the purposes of this section, a qualified exemption is defined to include those exemptions permitted under this chapter; provided that the person for whom exemption is claimed has physically resided in the State for

more than nine months during the taxable year; and provided further that multiple exemptions shall not be granted because of advanced age or deficiencies in vision.

[(e)] (d) Tax credits to be deducted from income tax liability, if any; refunds. The tax credits by a resident taxpayer pursuant to this section shall be deductible from the resident taxpayer's individual net income tax liability, if any, for the tax year in which they are properly claimed. In the event the tax credits claimed by a resident taxpayer, and allowed, exceed the amount of income tax payment due from the resident taxpayer, the excess of credits over payments due shall be refunded to the resident taxpayer, provided that tax credits properly claimed by a resident individual who has no income tax liability, and allowed, shall be paid to the resident individual; and further provided that no refunds or payment on account of the tax credits allowed by this section shall be made for amounts less than \$1.

[(f)] (e) Forms and rules and regulations. The director of taxation shall prepare and prescribe the appropriate form or forms to be used by taxpayers in filing claims for tax credits hereunder. The form shall be made an integral part of the individual net income tax return. He shall also be empowered to promulgate such rules and regulations as may be necessary to effectuate the purposes of this section pursuant to chapter 91.

[(g)] (f) Assessments and refunds. All of the provisions relating to assessments and refunds under this chapter and under section 231-23(d) shall be made applicable hereto and shall apply with equal force to the tax credits hereunder.

[(h)] (g) Time for filing. Claims for tax credits under this section, including any amended claims thereof, must be filed on or before the end of the twelfth month following the close of the taxable year for which the credits may be claimed. Failure to

comply with the foregoing provisions shall constitute and be deemed a waiver of the right to claim or recover the credit hereunder.' "

Representative Garcia moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Soares.

Representatives Garcia and Soares spoke in favor of the motion.

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and failed to carry.

The Chair stated that the motion before the House was to pass H. B. No. 1267-70 on Third Reading.

Representative Devereux then spoke in favor of the bill.

The motion to pass H. B. No. 1267-70 on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 48 ayes, with Representatives Heen, Oshiro and Poepoe being excused.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note the H. B. No. 1267-70 had passed Third Reading at 12:49 o'clock p.m.

Representative Uechi moved that H. B. No. 1332-70, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kondo.

At 12:58 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ho, seconded by Representative Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:30 o'clock a.m., Monday, March 16, 1970.

The progress of the resolution that I have just been handed, through two houses of the legislature, I have found to be a liberal education in Hawaiian politics.

My assignment I find, especially in my first few months, my first few years here, is to learn enough about politics of the State of Hawaii to stay effectively out of them.

I do want to say that having seen something of education in several other states of the Union and a good deal of the process of legislation in the national legislature, that I cannot help but be enormously impressed with the processes and with the attitudes that are reflected

in your deliberations here.

I think it is almost certainly true that this is the state in the Union in which education is best supported by the politics of the State and by the political leaders of the State and my own hope is simply that I can administer as good a University as you ladies and gentlemen obviously want to have in the State of Hawaii.

Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker.”

“Just take the opinion of the Chair.”

“Mr. Speaker, in behalf of Representatives de la Cruz, Duponte, Kondo and Meyer, rather than we thanking the students, the students have asked me to thank you, Representative Charles Ushijima and the members of this Honorable House and to express their deepest appreciation and gratitude to be able to further their knowledge and study the three branches of our State government.

We had three students from Lanai, three students from Molokai and 17 students from the island of Maui and they are very appreciative of this privilege to be here.

Thank you.”

Representative Bicoy, for the Oahu Representatives, stated:

And, Mr. Speaker, therein lies the immeasurable work of this Student Observer Program as an invaluable two-way communication bridge between the establishment and our young men and women of today. And Heaven only knows, Mr. Speaker, how dreadfully urgent we need their support and confidence.

So, to each student observer, we say we appreciated your being with us, we appreciate your willingness and enthusiasm. We thank you and we bid you our warmest Aloha.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.”

Representative Baptiste, for the Kauai

Representatives, stated:

“Mr. Speaker and members of this Honorable House. On behalf of Representatives Kunimura and Kawakami, knowing that we fully welcomed these students from Kauai to the Student Observer Program and another group from Waimea High School solely, I want to say to you that we are proud of your performance while here observing this House in action and other departments of this State.

I join the other speakers in the remarks they have extended and I would like to leave you with one last remark. That is to continue to study government and its people for some day you may be sitting in this House performing a noble duty in behalf of the human race. I am sure that the Speaker and all the members of this House are very grateful for your performance.”

Representative Ho, for the majority members, stated:

“Mr. Speaker, speaking for the Democratic majority, we hope that the students who have been with us for the last few days have first of all enjoyed themselves. I hope they have discovered what the legislative process is really like—that it is really a trafficking of powers and ideals that we try to do the best we can with this merging of two forces.

We hope that they discovered the ins and outs of the Capitol. We certainly hope they discovered what the Republican looks like—a part of our organization here who we get along with but who we have conflicts with once in a while.

Mr. Speaker, we hope that these students will come back and visit us often. I want to assure them that my experience has been like my colleagues, that I have profited and learned as much from this experience as I am sure my colleagues have also.

We hope to see you often and in the future come back and visit us.”

Representative Garcia, for the minority members, stated:

“Mr. Speaker, in behalf of the Republican minority, I wish to extend to the Speaker of the House, to Representative Ushijima and to every member of this Honorable body my sincere thanks and deep appreciation for the full participation of the Student Observer Program.

It was good to have young people with us because they saw the legislature in action and I am certain that if they will take home with them one lesson, it is simply this: that we in the United States must awaken to the fact that either we are going to run our government or some day our government is going to run us.

Your participation has been of tremendous importance to us because you have asked questions that were intelligent, you saw your legislature in action and you recognize the necessity of a two-party system. Aloha, God bless you and our country.”

Miss Kareda Ratcliff of Radford High School and Mr. Ronald Lee of Roosevelt High School then made presentations of a koa bowl and a carnation lei, as follows:

“Mr. Speaker and members of the House. If I may be permitted to begin my presentation with the following words.

At this time, Representative Pule, on a point of personal privilege, stated:

"Mr. Speaker and Members of the House.

Ninety-nine years ago tomorrow will be the birthday of Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalaniana'ole.

He was born on March 26, 1871 at Hoaiquahu, Kolea, Kauai. He was the youngest son of High Chief David Kahalepoulli Piikoi, a descendant of the last Island King of Kauai.

His mother was Princess Kinoiki Kekaulike, sister of Queen Kapiolani. He was the second cousin of King Kalakaua and Queen Liliuokalani.

Created a prince by proclamation in 1884, he was educated at Punahou School, where he was a football and track star, a rower and a bicyclist. He also ran the 100 yard dash in 10 seconds.

It has been said that Kuhio was the last Alii trained in the arts of Hawaiian wrestling, lua. He was an expert in the holds, kapu to all except the aliis.

From Punahou School, Kuhio went to the mainland to further his education at the St. Matthew's School in San Mateo, California. After this, Kuhio and his brother, David Kawanakoa, were sent to Japan and then to the Royal Agricultural College in England, from 1890 to 1891.

King Kalakaua wanted to prepare the princes for high office in the Kingdom.

On his return from England, Kuhio was placed in the Ministry of Interior and Custom Service. The revolution in 1893, which deposed Queen Liliuokalani, put an end to any dreams Kuhio might have had of becoming King. He was jailed for treason in 1894 when he plotted for the restoration of Queen Liliuokalani to the throne.

He then decided he could work better for the Hawaiians within the framework of the political system.

The two princely brothers entered separate political parties--Prince Kuhio becoming a member of the Republican Party, and Prince David organizing the Democratic Party.

Prince Kuhio was elected as a Delegate to Congress in 1903 to 1921. Knowing of the ignorance of mainlanders about Hawaiian affairs, the Prince found the best way to make friends and converts to the Hawaiian cause was to persuade Congressmen to visit the Islands. As a result, congressional parties came to Hawaii in 1907, 1909, 1915 and 1917.

As a forerunner of his greatest ambition, the rehabilitation, 'hoopulapula,' of the Hawaiian people, Kuhio obtained an amendment to the Organic Act in 1910, which opened public lands in Hawaii to homesteading.

The Homestead Act did not protect the Hawaiians, so the Prince began agitation to set up special homesteading lands for the Hawaiians only. Whether the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act accomplished its purpose of hoopulapula the Hawaiians is debatable.

Kuhio was a lovable person and close friends called him Cupid. In nature, he was democratic, friendly and generous and devoted his whole life to protect the interests and welfare of the Hawaiian people.

In 1896, Prince Kuhio married Elizabeth Kahanu Kaaui, daughter of a Chief of Kauai.

When he died on January 7, 1922, Prince Kuhio left a legacy to the Hawaiian people—to the common people—a legacy of love for the land. The inscription on his casket bore the words, 'Ke Alii Makaainana,' which means, 'The Prince of the people or citizens.'

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

## FORTY-SIXTH DAY

**Monday, March 30, 1970**

The House of Representatives of the Fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1970, was called to order at 11:30 o'clock a.m.

Representative Serizawa offered the following floor amendment to H. B. No. 1276-70:

“Paragraphs (c) and (d) of Section 1 are deleted in their entirety.”

Representative Serizawa explained the proposed amendment as follows:

“This House about ten days ago acted on another bill which referred the same bill to the House Finance Committee for further action. While H. B. No. 1276-70 was amended in Committee, it was felt that perhaps it would be better to incorporate part of the earlier bill into H.

B. No. 1276-70 because of the similar subject matter, which we did.

But after consultation with the House Attorney, it was felt that perhaps the title may not be broad enough to cover the earlier inclusion of another bill. Therefore, what this amendment does is to withdraw this section which relates to the extension of the Oahu Development Act to the neighbor islands.”

On motion by Representative Serizawa, seconded by Representative Kawakami and carried, the amendment was adopted.

On motion by Representative Serizawa, seconded by Representative Kawakami and carried, consideration of H. B. No. 1276-70, as amended, was deferred until Monday, April 6, 1970.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that printed copies of H. B. No. 1276-70, as amended, were distributed to the members of the House at 12:40 o'clock p.m., in accordance with Article III, Section 16, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 1816-70.

Representative Morioka moved that H. B. No. 1816-70 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kondo.

Representative Morioka offered the following floor amendment to H. B. No. 1816-70:

“To amend Line 22, Page three of H. B. No. 1816-70 by deleting the words ‘State Departments and Agencies’ and substituting in lieu thereof the word ‘Institutions’.”

Representative Morioka spoke in support of the amendment as follows:

“This amendment just clarifies the language. It goes back to the original language that we have in the bill.”

On motion by Representative

Morioka, seconded by Representative Kondo and carried, the amendment was adopted.

On motion by Representative Morioka, seconded by Representative Kondo and carried, consideration of H. B. No. 1816-70, as amended, was deferred until Monday, April 6, 1970.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that printed copies of H. B. No. 1816-70, as amended, were distributed to the members of the House at 12:40 o'clock p.m., in accordance with Article III, Section 16, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 2105-70.

On motion by Representative Morioka, seconded by Representative Kondo, H. B. No. 2105-70 passed Third Reading by a vote of 48 ayes, with Representatives Roehrig, Shigemura and Wakatsuki being excused.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that H. B. Nos. 1940-70, 1809-70, 1957-70, 658, 1028, 1368-70, 1447-70, 1411-70, 1309-70, 2100-70, 2105-70 and S. B. No. 189 had passed Third Reading no earlier than 12:40 o'clock p.m.

At 12:41 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 12:42 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

#### DEFERRED MATTER

Consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 360-70 on H. R. No. 204, which had been deferred to this time.

Representative Kato moved that the report of the majority of the Committee and H. R. No. 204, as amended, be adopted, seconded by Representative Bicoy.

At this time, Representative Kato

spoke in favor of the resolution as follows:

“Mr. Speaker, I feel it necessary to say a few words today to explain my actions on the resolution before us.

You will recall, Mr. Speaker, when we talked about this measure recently. I told you it seemed a little presumptuous for us, here in Hawaii, to advise our Senators on how to vote on the motion to recommit to the Senate Judiciary Committee, the confirmation of Mr. Carswell. That it was easier for our Senate to move a resolution similar to the one before us because confirmation or rejection of appointments is a Senatorial function and action on resolution like this was merely an extension of their peculiar function and responsibility.

Some may question the timing of this Committee Report—coming as it does, on the eve, practically speaking, on the vote to recommit which I understand will be held in the Senate on Monday. Mr. Speaker, I received a call yesterday evening from one of our people in Washington informing me that our action here in this House of Representatives on this resolution may be the straw that tips the scale in favor of the motion to recommit. This may or may not be true and our Senators may have already made up their minds. Whatever the case may be, Mr. Speaker, I think we would be derelict in our duty if we were not to express ourselves and inform our Senators on our feelings on this matter.

It is my understanding the vote will be very close—the unofficial tally being 48 to 48. Now, Mr. Speaker, this is the crucial vote. If the motion to recommit dies, I think confirmation is assured. Senators, like most of us, will find a negative vote through a motion to recommit far easier than a no vote on confirmation itself—than a no vote against any particular person. If you will, Mr. Speaker, allow me to continue. Let us dwell on the qualifications of Mr. Carswell himself. Granted, I am not particularly qualified to speak on these



matters—there does seem to be considerable doubt about the man's ability. Doubt strong enough to make lawyers throughout our nation, even from Hawaii, express their feelings in no uncertain terms asking for denial of his confirmation. In point of fact, one of Mr. Carswell's supporters made the now famous statement: 'Mediocre people need mediocre representation on our Supreme Court bench.'

Mr. Speaker, as an attorney, as a former law school student, I know the impact of a decision from our Supreme Court. That as a practical matter, it really is a law-making body—this body of nine men—and an appointment to this Court is an appointment that should reflect the best choice possible. I would submit, Mr. Speaker, to appoint a man whose personal prejudices are in question is bad enough but when we have in the same person a man of dubious ability, to confirm him would be compounding the felony.

Every appointment should be carefully made—just as every confirmation vote should be carefully exercised. This is particularly true when it comes to an appointment to the Supreme Court. You must remember, this appointment is for life and there is no regular term, no chance for review, there is no second chance. As I said earlier, our Senators may have made up their minds, but let us not forget this one important fact—we are elected representatives of our people—and as such we should take a position on such an important matter so that we may be better judged come election day.

Mr. Speaker, let us vote on and adopt this resolution today.”

Representative Bicoy then spoke in favor of the resolution, as follows:

“Mr. Speaker, my personal philosophy as tempered by my legal training will not allow me to sit by without saying a word on the nomination of Mr. Carswell to the highest court in our land.

Since the inception of this country, the Supreme Court of the United States, through decision after decision of this Court, has played an indispensable and integral role in the formation and formulation of our national thinking and attitudes in our social, economic and geo-political life.

This highest tribunal has always been held in the eyes of our responsible citizens with awe, dignity and respect. And properly so. And it is with this recognition and appreciation that I feel most strongly compelled to vote here to urge that our Senatorial delegation vote against the confirmation of Judge Carswell, or in the alternative, to vote for the recommitment of this nomination.

It is not to say here that we ought not interfere with the legislative processes in Washington, or that we do not know enough of the facts surrounding Judge Carswell's case to be able to make proper judgment. That would be more fatal than wise.

There is sufficient coverage in our news media which I have no reason to disbelieve to indicate with clarity and persuasiveness to give basis for a judgment that Judge Carswell is possessed of mediocre legal ability and philosophy. Our highest court and our nation—and certainly our times, expect and demand nothing but the highest in ability and philosophy in our justices to meet the forces and pressures of our nation and at a time when these forces and pressures have reached a plateau of criticality and which demand the best in ourselves.

I will not subscribe to mediocrity in our United States Supreme Court and mediocrity seems to prevail in the person of Judge Carswell, unfortunate as this may be to him personally. For this reason, I urge the adoption of this resolution.”

Representative Miho, in speaking against the resolution, stated:

“It grieves me to be forced to get up

and speak against the distinguished Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Judiciary Committee who I hold in very high esteem but this resolution goes far beyond the import of what has been said on the floor so far. It goes into the very heart of the process of legislation. I would be remiss in my duty if I did not get up and say what I think to be the proper process of legislation or the subject matter of legislation.

In all my years in the House here, I do not believe that we had at any time attempted or presumed to tell the other House on the other side what to do, what not to do in terms of their prerogative which is the confirmation of appointees by our own Governor. This may be done behind closed doors but on the floor of the House, I do not recall and I do not believe that we had at any time presumed that it was our prerogative or any of our business to tell the members across the hall just how they should vote on any of the confirmation by the Governor. Far be it for us to attempt here today to presume and I say presumptuous of our part not having had any kind of a hearing. Not having anything so far to look into the matter of the qualifications of the man.”

At this time, Representative Kato, on a point of order stated:

“There was a hearing held and I think it is precedent in this House that we do not take up what happened in Committee. I would like to say there was a hearing held.”

The Chair ruled that the point was well taken and directed Representative Miho to confine himself to the motion before the House.

Representative Miho then continued:

“I am talking of a hearing on the individual qualifications of the man. Now, for us to presume that we could vote and I am not voting against the resolution on the question of the

individual, whether he is qualified or not, that is not my point. My point is that we are going into a subject matter of legislation which is none of our business. I did not vote against the resolution because of the qualification or no qualification of the man. I think it is a matter beyond our prerogative to step into the prerogatives of another body, that of the national Senate and to tell our Senators how they should vote on the confirmation of an appointee of the President. We have not done it in the past and this should be distinguished from a previous resolution that we have passed encouraging our delegation to vote for the repeal of Title 2 of the Securities Act. This is different. We know the contents of the law. We can determine on our own the validity or invalidity of such a bill. But here, we have no basis upon which we should act on this resolution.

Are we going to legislate by newspaper reports? Are we going to legislate by virtue of rumors? I don't think this is a proper process of legislation. If we pass this resolution, we are going on a basis of what we presume to be information based on truth or falsity. This, to me, is not a proper process of legislation.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.”

Representative Miyake, speaking in favor of the resolution, stated:

“I rise to speak in favor of the resolution and to answer the remarks made by the previous speaker, our distinguished representative from the 15th district.

Mr. Speaker, the validity of the reporting by our colleagues in the media, in the newspaper, television and radio has been seriously questioned here. However, I have a direct quote of a very prominent U. S. Senator who happens to be one of the strongest supporters of the Carswell appointment. He has used words to the effect that ‘we have mediocre judges, therefore, these mediocre judges should be represented on the U. S. Supreme

Court bench' and these quotes are not being denied by this very prominent U. S. Senator who is moving and maneuvering to get Carswell appointed. Then, Mr. Speaker, we as elected representatives of the people of the State of Hawaii, I feel obligated to make our stand known to our delegation in Congress on behalf of our people of Hawaii that we do not condone mediocrity in appointment of judges to the U. S. Supreme Court bench where the values of the United States of America are determined and established for us to live by and comply with.

I am surprised that our distinguished representative from the 15th district, in his speech, requests that we do not interfere nor make our feelings known to our delegation in Washington because it is a matter at the National level. However, may I remind this distinguished representative that we have to live by the laws established by the United States Supreme Court and our State legislation has to comply with the laws set by the United States Supreme Court. We are affected in every way by the action of the United States Supreme Court. And here we are being asked by this honorable representative to condone the appointment of a mediocre man to sit on the Supreme Court bench."

Representative Soares, on a point of order, stated:

"I think the distinguished Majority Leader is getting off the resolution and picking on the distinguished colleague of mine based on his own comments."

To which Representative Miyake answered:

"Mr. Speaker, this is an honest rebuttal to the comments made by the previous speaker."

Whereupon the Speaker ruled that the point was not well taken, and informed Representative Miyake he had five more minutes.

Representative Miyake then

continued:

"Thank you, Sir. Therefore, I ask the honorable representatives of the minority sitting in this Chamber to rise above party affiliation and to act on the basis of getting the best man appointed to the United States Supreme Court bench.

I plead with you to support this resolution."

Representative Miho, given permission to rise on a point of personal privilege stated:

"The implication has been made by the distinguished Majority Leader that I have questioned the publication of the news media. I do not recall in any manner or means raising anything to say that such an implication can be raised. I say it is neither here or there as to what the newspapers report in the sense that that should be the basis upon which we enact or pass laws or resolutions in this House."

Representative Garcia then spoke against the resolution, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, if ever there were a resolution which appeared on the floor of this House and was so boldly partisan, then H. R. No. 204 must qualify as such. This resolution is purely political all the way through—it is that simple. It is so political from the Committee Report to the resolution itself and let me cite this just as an incident. The resolution names the junior Senator first. The Committee Report names the junior Senator first. And we know that by all protocol, by all decorum, you always mention the senior Senator of any State first."

At this time, the Speaker stated:

"Mr. Garcia, your point is not well taken. We have sent out resolutions from this House, from this legislature, and we have used both names interchangeably."

Representative Garcia then continued:

"Mr. Speaker, on this particular

instance, the inference is there—it is unequivocal. We would like to further state why this measure is political. The position of the junior Senator is well known, not only to every member of this honorable body, Mr. Speaker, but to the entire populace of this State, to the entire United States of America. This resolution is aimed at one person and one person only, an individual who will make his position clear on the floor of the U. S. Senate.

Mr. Speaker, mediocrity has been referred to so very often that I just wondered how many of us who have served on the floor of this House in past years can forget some of the mediocre men that have been appointed despite cries from the press, the radio and everyone else.

Mr. Speaker, I do not rise in defense of Mr. Carswell. I don't know the man that well just as I don't think there is anyone in this Chamber who knows him personally. But I do decry the fact that we are using this floor for partisan politics particularly when this is a political year. If you want to roast your own Governor on the floor of this House, be my guest. But let us now go beyond that—into the realm of National politics.

And yet there was not one voice raised on the floor of this House on something that was so close to us where mediocre men were being mentioned right in this very State and yet we talk about mediocrity on the National level.

I ask every member of this honorable body to vote this resolution down.”

Representative Ajifu then moved that the motion be postponed indefinitely, seconded by Representative Lum.

The motion to postpone action on H. R. No. 204 indefinitely was put by the Chair and failed to carry.

A roll call vote having been requested, the motion to adopt Stand. Com. Rep.

No. 360-70 on H. R. No. 204, as amended, was put by the Chair and the report of the majority of the Committee was adopted and H. R. No. 204, as amended, entitled: “House Resolution requesting Senators Daniel K. Inouye and Hiram L. Fong to vote to recommit the nomination of G. Harrold Carswell as an Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court to the Senate Committee on Judiciary, and if not recommitted, to vote against and use their influence to persuade others to vote against the confirmation of G. Harrold Carswell as an Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court,” was adopted by a vote of 36 ayes to 13 noes, with Representatives Aduja, Ajifu, Devereux, Fong, Garcia, Judd, Lum, Meyer, Miho, Oda, Poepoe, Saiki and Soares voting no, and Representatives Roehrig and Shigemura being excused.

At 1:05 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ho, seconded by Representative Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m. Monday, April 6, 1970.

## FIFTY-FIRST DAY

**Monday, April 6, 1970**

The House of Representatives of the Fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1970, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Speaker presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend Philip Yung Lee of the Presbyterian Church Center at Mililani Town.

Roll call of the members of the House of Representatives showed that all members were present with the exception of Representatives Heen, Kato and Pacarro, who were excused.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Fiftieth Day.

Upon reconvening, Representatives Heen and Kunimura withdrew their motions and seconds to pass S. B. No. 164, as amended, on Third Reading and to adopt the amendment offered, and by unanimous consent, consideration of S. B. No. 164, as amended, was deferred until Tuesday, April 14, 1970.

Consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 380-70 on H. B. No. 1265-70, as amended, which had been deferred to this day.



On motion by Representative Wakatsuki, seconded by Representative Minn, the report of the Committee was adopted and H. B. No. 1265-70, as amended, entitled: "A Bill for an Act creating a Stadium Board and making an appropriation for a stadium in the City and County of Honolulu," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 46 ayes, which was not less than two-thirds of all the members to which the House is entitled, with Representatives Alcon, Kato, Loo, Morioka and Shigemura being excused.

Consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 383-70 on H. B. No. 397, as amended, which had been deferred to this day.

Representative Wakatsuki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H. B. No. 397, as amended, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Minn.

Representative Garcia offered the following amendment to H. B. No. 397, as amended:

"H. B. No. 397, H. D. 2 is hereby amended as follows:

On page 1:

Section 3, line 1 — delete the words 'environmental control';

On page 2:

Section 3, line 1 — delete the words 'environmental control';

Section 3, line 4 — delete the words 'environmental control';

Section 3, lines 12, 13 and 14 — delete the words 'improve the quality of the social and physical environment of the people through controls over air, water, noise and other pollution';

Section 4, line 3 — delete the words

'environmental control';

Section 4, lines 4, 5, 6 and 7 — delete the words 'the Hawaii office of economic opportunity, the State law enforcement and juvenile delinquency planning agency, and the progressive neighborhood program now in or administered by the office of the governor; the office of federal program coordinator, the commission on children and youth, the commission on the aging';

On page 2:

Section 4, lines 10 and 11 — delete the words 'the intergovernmental planning and coordination program';

Section 4, lines 14, 15, 16 and 17 — delete the words 'and the environmental health programs, including the food and drug, air sanitation, industrial hygiene, occupational and radiological health, sanitary engineering, mosquito and rodent control programs, and the water pollution programs now in or administered by the department of health.

On page 3:

Section 5, line 2 — delete the words 'department of health' and 'director of health';

Section 5, lines 4 and 5 — delete the words 'environmental control';

Section 6, line 2 — delete the words 'environmental control';

Section 7, line 3 — delete the words 'environmental control';

Section 8, line 1 — delete the words 'environmental control';

On page 4:

Section 9, line 5 — substitute for the figures '\$15,000' the figures '\$12,000';

Section 13, line 1 — substitute for the

word 'person' the word 'borrower';

Section 13, after sub-section (a)(6) thereof, add the following:

'(7) Has a gross income of not more than \$25,000 per annum.'

'(8) Has total assets which under the rules and regulations adopted by the department pursuant to this chapter are insufficient to make the required down payment.';

On page 5:

Section 14, after sub-section (e) thereof, add the following:

'(f) The borrower shall comply with section 47 of this chapter.';

On page 6:

Section 17, line 3 — delete the words 'environmental control';

On pages 7 and 8:

Section 21, sub-section (a)(8), lines 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 — delete the words '(the gross income of the borrower's spouse, if the borrower is married, shall be counted, except where the borrower is living separate and apart from his spouse under a decree of a court of competent jurisdiction) or is 55 years of age or more, or is a person displaced by government action other than eviction due to his fault.';

Section 21, after sub-section (a)(8) thereof, add the following:

'(9) Has total assets which under the rules and regulations adopted by the department pursuant to this chapter are insufficient to make the required down payment.';

On page 9:

Section 25, after sub-section (e) thereof, add the following:

'(f) The borrower shall comply with section 47 of this chapter.';

On page 10:

Section 27, line 1 — delete the words 'environmental control';

Section 28, line 1 — delete the words 'environmental control';

Section 29, line 5 — substitute for the figures '\$30,000,000' the figures '\$20,000';

On page 11:

Section 31, sub-section (a)(6), line 1 — substitute for the figures '\$20,000' the figures '\$15,000';

Section 31, sub-section (a)(6), lines 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 — delete the words '(the gross income of the borrower's spouse, if the borrower is married, shall be counted, except where the borrower is living separate and apart from his spouse under a decree of a court of competent jurisdiction) or is 55 years of age or more, or is a person displaced by government action other than eviction due to his fault.';

Section 31, after sub-section (a)(6) thereof, add the following:

'(7) Has total assets which under the rules and regulations adopted by the department pursuant to this chapter are insufficient to make the required down payment.';

On page 12:

Section 36, after sub-section (e) thereof, add the following:

'(f) The borrower shall comply with section 47 of this chapter.';

On page 13:

Section 38, line 3 — delete the words 'environmental control';

On page 14:

Section 40, sub-section (b), lines 3 and 4 — delete the words 'Negotiations for the acquisition by voluntary transaction shall not be required before the institution of eminent domain proceedings.';

On page 15:

Section 42, after sub-section (b) thereof, add the following:

'(c) No such rule or regulation shall be promulgated by the department without first conducting a public hearing thereon.';

On page 16:

Section 46, after sub-section (a)(4) thereof, add the following:

'(5) Has a gross income of not more than \$15,000 per annum.';

On page 18:

Section 49, sub-section (a), line 3 — delete the words 'environmental control';

Section 50, line 3 — delete the words 'environmental control';

On page 18:

Section 50, line 5 — delete the words 'environmental control';

Section 51, sub-section (b)(2), line 2 — substitute for the word 'county' the word 'State';

On page 19:

Section 51, sub-section (b)(6), line 2 — substitute for the figures '\$20,000' the figures '\$15,000';

Section 51, sub-section (d)(3), lines 2 and 3 — delete the words 'In determining gross income, a \$600 exemption for each of his dependents, as determined by the

income tax laws of the State, shall be allowed; and'."

Representative Garcia moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Soares.

Representative Garcia then spoke in favor of the amendment.

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and failed to carry.

Representatives Garcia and Poepoe then spoke against H. B. No. 397 and Representatives Serizawa and Ho spoke in favor of the bill.

At 8:55 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 9:05 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Representative Garcia, on a point of order, stated:

"According to the Supplemental Calendar, Item 98, transmitting Senate Bill No. 1327-70 which passed Third Reading in the Senate and is now before us is a measure relating to the State Housing Program. Therefore, the Senate housing measure reached the floor of this House before we got ours to their floor and, therefore, this housing measure is dead."

To which the Chair ruled:

"Mr. Garcia, we have an understanding that two bills will cross over in this particular area."

Representative Garcia, on a point of information, inquired:

"It was protocol in the past that a measure that comes over first is given consideration first."

To which the Chair stated:

“Not so. We have passed bills from here and from there and during the process of transition or transfer, they have crossed. There is no problem to this.”

Representative Devereux then spoke against the bill.

At this time, Representative Garcia spoke in rebuttal to Representative Ho's statement.

The motion to adopt the report of the Committee and to pass H. B. No. 397, as amended, on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried, and H. B. No. 397, as amended, entitled: “A Bill for an Act relating to the creation of a Department of Housing, Environmental Control, and Urban Affairs and the assignment of responsibilities thereto,” passed Third Reading by a vote of 36 ayes to 11 noes, which was not less than two-thirds of all the members to which the House is entitled, with Representatives Aduja, Ajifu, Devereux, Fong, Garcia, Judd, Meyer, Miho, Poepoe, Saiki and Soares voting no and Representatives Alcon, Kato, Loo and Shigemura being excused.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that H. B. Nos. 1265-70 and 397 had passed Third Reading not earlier than 9:10 o'clock p.m.

#### DEFERRED MATTERS

Consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 392-70 on H. R. No. 232 which had been deferred to this time.

On motion by Representative Kimura, seconded by Representative Takitani and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H. R. No. 232 was adopted.

Consideration of Stand. Com. No. 414-70 on H. C. R. No. 94, which had been deferred to this time.

Representative Serizawa moved that the report of the Committee be adopted

and H. C. R. No. 94 be adopted, seconded by Representative Kawakami.

At this time, Representative Lum inquired whether Representative Serizawa would yield to a question to which Representative Serizawa replied in the affirmative.

Representative Lum then inquired:

“Does this concurrent resolution refer to the Kuliouou Valley project?”

To which Representative Serizawa replied in the affirmative.

Representative Lum then questioned:

“What is the reason for the denial or retraction of this concurrent resolution?”

Representative Serizawa answered:

“Mr. Speaker, the Kuliouou proposed development has had some rough sledding.

1. The terrain is of such a nature that the Department felt it very expensive to develop.

2. The request has come in from the City and County that a certain area be set aside for a playground and in addition an area set aside for a school. Both of these projects will encompass approximately 10 to 12 acres. It was felt by the Department that if these two parcels are withdrawn from the total area from development that no developer could come in there and make a profit. And this is a profit incentive type of developer bill. Without an incentive for profit, the Department felt that there would be no developer or bidders in this case.”

Representative Lum then inquired:

“Would the Department of Land and Natural Resources concur with your action on this particular resolution?”

To which Representative Serizawa stated:

“They have no objections.”

The motion to adopt the report of the Committee and H. C. R. No. 94 was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 33 ayes to 14 noes, with Representatives Aduja, Ajifu, Devereux, Fong, Garcia, Judd, Lum, Meyer, Miho, Oda, Poepoe, Saiki, Soares and Takamine voting no and Representatives Alcon, Kato, Loo and Shigemura being excused.

Consideration of Stand. Com. Rep.

No. 415-70 on S. C. R. No. 22, which had been deferred to this time.

On motion by Representative Takamine, seconded by Representative Iha and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S. C. R. No. 22 was adopted.

At 9:20 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ho, seconded by Representative Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m. Tuesday, April 14, 1970.
