Tuesday, April 14, 1970

The House of Representatives of the Fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1970, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Speaker presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend George A. Jacobs of the First Christian Church.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Fifty-Second Day.

RECONSIDERATION OF ACTION TAKEN BY THE HOUSE

Representative Ho moved that the House reconsider its action taken earlier in passing H. B. No. 659 on Third Reading, seconded by Representative Miyake and carried.

Representative Wakatsuki moved that H. B. No. 659 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Minn.

Representative Devereux offered the following amendment to H. B. No. 659:

"On page 2, line 15 thereof, after the words 'to January 1, 1970.', insert the following:

'One member shall be a physician duly licensed to practice in the State. One member shall be a registered nurse duly licensed to practice in the State. One member shall be the chief administrator of a hospital subject to regulation by the department of health.'"

Representative Devereux moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Garcia.

Representative Devereux spoke in favor of the amendment and Representative Ho spoke in opposition thereto.

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and failed to carry.

The motion to pass H. B. No. 659 on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Loo being excused.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 65.

Representative Wakatsuki moved that H. B. No. 65 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Minn.

Representative Garcia offered the following amendment to H. B. No. 65:

"On page 1: Section 1 is amended to read as follows:

'SECTION 1. Legislative findings and declaration of purpose. Air pollution and congestion are serious problems confronting counties with populations of more than 100,000 people. These problems are urgent ones and unless they are expeditiously dealt with they may result in even larger, more serious problems that will require vast outlays of capital.

Even now vast sums are needed to remedy the problem. While the problem is local in nature, the Legislature finds it in the public interest to assist in the implementation of a system of mass public transportation to be developed in coordination with the total transportation system plans for these counties. With this in mind, the Legislature finds it desirable that such counties create mass transit authorities with sufficient power to plan, finance, and administer county-wide mass transit systems capable of providing rapid, comfortable, inexpensive and convenient means of transportation for the entire population in a manner which will alleviate traffic congestion by private users of the highways. The Legislature also finds it desirable that such counties immediately act to provide an interim solution to the intensive use of the highways during the period while mass transit systems are under construction through provisions which would induce the use of public transit systems utilizing buses rather than private means of transportation. Finally, the Legislature finds it desirable that such counties initiate planning activities directed at designing and then constructing permanent mass transit systems compatible with their long-term needs. In designing such permanent mass transit systems, such counties should consider all feasible modes of transport such as fixed rail, monorail, subway, and others, singly and in combination.;

On pages 1 and 2: Section 2 is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of the general revenues of the State the sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to enable all counties with populations of more than 100,000 people to acquire by lease, purchase or contract existing public transit systems, to expand said systems into county—wide mass transit networks, to initiate planning and construction for permanent systems of mass transit, and to initiate studies directed at determining the most appropriate governing body for such a system."

Representative Garcia moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Soares.

Representative Garcia spoke in favor of the amendment.

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and failed to carry.

The motion to pass H. B. No. 65 on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 46 ayes, which was not less than two—thirds of all the members to which the House is entitled, with Representatives Kato, Loo, Oshiro, F. Wong and R. Wong being excused.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 1829-70.

Representative Wakatsuki moved that H. B. No. 1829-70 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Minn.

Representatives Judd and Garcia spoke in favor of the passage of this bill.

When we first came down here, we didn't know the reception we were going to get. It was kind of a flight into the unknown. We were attempting to make a major motion picture in a state where there was no track record for motion picture continuity. But today, I feel like we have found one of those mansions that we were promised. As I said the other day in print, I take my hat off to these marvelous co-stars that we have here, your beautiful trades, your magnificent palms and mountains, and

especially the beautiful people, the golden people, that go with this state. Every place I go on the mainland, critics, television people say 'Ah! what lovely faces, what marvelous faces, how clean and pure and fresh and delightful!' And, I think that might be our answer, ladies and gentlemen—this happy blending of Polynesian, Oriental and Caucasian. I think that may solve some of the problems that beset us in the streets of the mainland.

I am terribly grateful for this honor. When I was a boy, growing up in a very tough Irish section of Brooklyn, my father and I used to walk down 4th Avenue where they had bookstores on both sides of the street and that's really where I got my, sort of, basic education. One day, we picked up a soiled and old green—covered book—"Book of Poems' by Don Blanding and near the front of it was a poem that I memorized because my father used to give me a penny a line to learn poetry.

We have always heard the word 'Aloha' but we did not know what it meant. And I opened the book and it said 'What Aloha Means' by Don Blanding and it started: It's more than just an easy word for casual goodbye; It's gayer than a greeting and it's sadder than a sigh; It's all the tender messages that words cannot convey; It's tears unshed and longing for a loved one gone away; It's welcome to Hawaii and its lingering farewell; It's all the dear and silent things that lovers' lips can tell; It's woven into flower leis and old Hawaiian songs; It's frailer than the spider webs and strong as leather thongs; It's fresh as dew and ginger blooms and older than the moon: It's in the little lullabies that's made of mother's croon; It's said a hundred different ways, in sadness and in joy; Aloha means 'I Love You.'

So, I say, Aloha Oe. Thank you very much for this great honor."

Wednesday, April 22, 1970

The House of Representatives of the Fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1970, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Speaker presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend Dr. Paul Moore Wheeler of St. Clement's Episcopal Church.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note the presence of Representative Oshiro.

At this time, the following introductions were made to the members of the House:

- The words 'representative of all the counties' on line 7 of page 1 are deleted.
- 4. Add after the second sentence of HRS Section 187— . (a) as set forth in section 1 of the bill ending on line 8 of page 1 the following sentence: 'The chairmen of each fish and wildlife advisory committee established pursuant to this chapter and the chief of the division of fish and game shall serve as members of the commission.'
- 5. Add at the end of HRS Section 187— . (a) as set forth in section 1 of the bill on page 1 the following sentence: 'The commission shall select its own chairman from among the various committee chairmen.'
- 6. On line 14 of page 1 add the words 'by the department' between the words 'animal' and 'into'.
- 7. On line 2 of page 2 add the words 'by the department' between the words 'introduced' and 'under'.
- 8. Add a new HRS Section 187— . at the end of section 1 of the bill to read as follows:

'Sec. 187- . Fish and wildlife advisory committees, (a) There is established in each of the counties of the State, a fish and wildlife advisory committee. Each committee shall be composed of members of the board of land and natural resources from the county, who shall serve ex officio and shall be non-voting members, and five members appointed by the governor in accordance with section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, who shall be knowledgeable in the fishing, hunting, and conservation of fish and wildlife. The members shall serve for two year terms. except that two of the members initially appointed shall serve for one year terms. Each committee shall select its own chairman from its voting members, and three voting members shall constitute a quorum, Members of the committees

shall receive no compensation but shall be reimbursed by the board of land and natural resources for all necessary expenses, including stenographic services.

(b) Functions and duties of committees. A committee shall meet at the call of its chairman or of any three of its members for the consideration of any matter affecting fishing or hunting and fish and wildlife conservation within the county, including proposed rules and regulations. Each committee may hear such persons and acquire such information as it desires and shall communicate its findings and recommendations to the division of fish and game.' "

Representative Kawakami moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Serizawa.

Representative Kawakami then explained the amendment as follows:

"By this amendment, we have included some of the provisions which were in House Bill No. 2021-70, which has been recommitted in the Senate. We have expanded the number of members in the fish and wildlife council from nine to thirteen and have created these advisory committees—one each on the neighbor islands.

If we follow the Senate bill, there would have been only one state—wide commission. We added three more sub—committees—one each on the neighbor islands.

Also, we have added an item 'by the department' in the introduction of new species into the State. The council would have to advise the fish and game division as to the introduction of new species into the State."

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and carried.

By unanimous consent, consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 710-70 on S. B. No. 1566-70, as amended, was

deferred until tomorrow, April 23, 1970.

On motion by Representative Wakatsuki, seconded by Representative Minn and carried, consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 761-70 on S. B. No. 1696-70, as amended, was deferred until tomorrow, April 23, 1970.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that printed copies of S. B. No. 1696-70, S.D.1, H.D.3, were made available to the members of the House at 11:55 o'clock p.m., in accordance with Article III, Section 16, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

On motion by Representative Roehrig, seconded by Representative Wakatsuki and carried, the House agreed to the amendments proposed by the Senate to H. B. No. 1293-70 and H. B. No. 1293-70, as amended, passed Final Reading by a vote of 51 ayes.

By unanimous consent, H. B. No. 340, as amended by the Senate, was taken from the Clerk's desk.

On motion by Representative Loo, seconded by Representative Roehrig and carried, the House agreed to the amendments proposed by the Senate to H. B. No. 340 and H. B. No. 340, as amended, passed Final Reading by a vote of 51 ayes.

By unanimous consent, H. B. No. 1930-70, as amended by the Senate, was taken from the Clerk's desk.

On motion by Representative Kunimura, seconded by Representative Heen and carried, the House agreed to the amendments proposed by the Senate to H. B. No. 1930-70 and H. B. No. 1930-70, as amended, passed Final Reading by a vote of 51 ayes.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H. B. Nos. 1924-70, 528, 1293-70,

340 and 1930-70 had passed Final Reading not later than 11:58 o'clock p.m.
